BRUNO WAS SCHEDULED TO MEET WITH FRANK BLINKY PALERMO BETWEEN 4 PM AND 5 PM, AT A LOCAL RESTAURANT AND BRUNO DID MEET MAX "WILLY" WEISBERG AT SAME RESTAURANT AS WEISBERG AND BRUNO DEPARTED TOGETHER APPROXIMATELY 6:05 PM. (PH 623-C* WAS AWARE BRUNO'S APPOINTMENT WITH PALERMO FOR 2 PM, JUNE 7, 1962. SOURCE ALSO CONFIRMED WEISBERG MEETING WITH BRUNO SAME DATE. PURPOSE EACH MEETING UNKNOWN THIS TIME TO BOTH SOURCES.) BRUNO CONSIDERED DANGEROUS.
