Biographic data from disseminations forwarded to Mexico City in HDI-W-5318 (including CS 3,328,445, CS 3,328,770, and CS 3,329,540) and HDI-W-5450 has also been included in an effort to present the most complete identifying information on each person attending the festival. The report is evaluated D-2 except in those sections noted by asterisks. The travel of the majority of the persons listed was confirmed by more than one source. Those cases which still remain unconfirmed are marked with an asterisk and evaluated D-6. This report has not been placed on a mat, since it is felt that headquarters may be able to provide further information which will confirm those cases which are questionable.

2. HDI-W-5270 referred to the tour in China of Mexican folk and ballet dancers. These persons are included in the attached list of those attending the festival. Concerning the possible debriefing of any members of this group, LIEBTRIC has advised that the greater part of the group are homosexuals, unstable personalities, and persons otherwise unsuited for the purpose which ROUSSK has in mind. The Communists and non-Communists alike have in common a dislike for PBRINE. LIEBTRIC, who knows most of the individuals personally, has been instructed to note and report in the future on any person from the group who might be considered a satisfactory subject for debriefing. LIEBTRIC is the source of the "source comments" on members of the dance group.

If Mencer would not get news until Sept. 11th., so he would fly to Rio or Buenos Aires directly".

June 1st., the Deputy Dr. Vasquez Campos called Kubata and was told to call him at home. OK.  
June 1st., Kubata called professor Raul Cordero Amador informing him that professor Jeronimo Vaqueiro & Foster accepted invitation to go to Prague. - Prof. Vaqueiro Foster called Kubata, who informed him that his air-plane ticket for flight to Prague for June 4th., was ready. Kubata said that such a known person like him, literate and musical critic, would get Mexican passport immediately. - Vaqueiro called Cuban Emb. from the Czech Emb. asking for Cuban transit visa. - June 4th., prof. Peter Herman stayed in Mexico at Hotel del Bosque, June 5th., Herman informed Kubata that he went (twice) to "Unidad" but he was too expensive. Then he said that Mr. Barbachano was very friendly and that "there something could be done". Herman said that he was at Mr. Sordo (fnu) and that there would be a meeting tomorrow. June 8th., Director of UFRSCO, Mr. Caso (fnu, phonetic) called Kubata, who invited him to come to Prague. No, he did not want to go to Europe. Then he informed Kubata that an international Congress of "Americanismo" would take place in México. The director of anthropology Dr. Bernal (fnu) was organizing it. 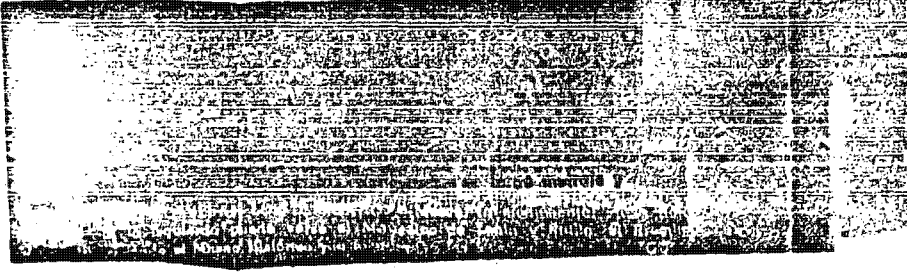

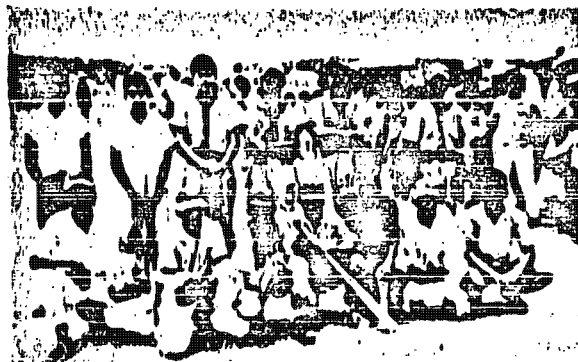
## COMPETENCIA CICLISTA

## Y UN HOMENAJE



La sensibilidad y el vigor creativo de los artistas del Ser de Gráfica Popular, se pone de manifiesto con estos grabados que representan aspectos de la vida de la juventud mexicana.



Los mineros bloqueados en las galerías en llamas de Bois Gaziers". Millones de lectores en el mundo siguen con angustia la trágica lucha contra la muerte que tiene lugar allá, a 1.000 metros bajo tierra.

"Levin, Francia... Marzo de 1957. Una explosión de grisú, 16 muertos, numerosos heridos..." Otra noticia trágica.

Si así ocurre frecuentemente, demasiado frecuentemente. Y entonces, delante de las bocas de las minas se apolpa una muchedumbre silenciosa, angustiosa. ¿Imprudencia? ¿Falta de medidas de seguridad? En efecto. Pero, indudablemente, esto no es debido a la "fatalidad" o a riesgos inevitables en el oficio".

El futuro del joven minero está estrechamente ligado a la aplicación de medidas de seguridad, directamente relacionadas con la técnica. ¿En qué medida? Pues bien, en la medida en que los nuevos procedimientos permitan realizar el bien de siempre: hacer salir al obrero del negro boquete de la mina. La técnica moderna de extracción hidráulica que se emplea actualmente por desgracia ni de manera general ofrece las garantías a las que nos referíamos antes.

El minero tiene actualmente la posibilidad de dirigir su máquina estando fuera del tajo, en una galería bien asegurada contra los derrumbes. Desde ahí con una máquina dirige un charo de agua de una potencia fantástica. El agua le hace todo: arranca el carbón, lo lleva hasta las pozos de extracción, de donde es elevada a la superficie por un sistema de bombas.

Los jóvenes mineros soviéticos de la cuenca de Kuznetsk tienen una gran experiencia a este respecto y no cabe duda que sus explicaciones serán escuchadas con atención por los jóvenes mineros de otros países que vengan como delegados al Festival.

Si, ahora se puede decir ya sin ninguna duda que la profesión de minero es una hermosa profesión.

"Claro es —nos podrán objetar— eso está muy bien. Pero es necesario que se aplique la técnica moderna en todas partes. ¿Es esto posible?"

Aquí nos hemos referido solamente a un aspecto —el aspecto trágico y más doloroso— de esta cuestión. Pero hay otros muchos problemas que afectan a la vida y a la obra de los obreros relacionados con el trabajo de los obreros y los cargadores, con instrucción profesional y la posibilidad de calificarse, con la necesidad de aliar los trabajos bajo tierra con los trabajos en la superficie, etc., están ligados con los nuevos métodos de trabajo. Todo esto nos permite entretener un debate acalorado alrededor del tema que se propone para ser discutido: "La mano de obra en las minas, la protección del trabajo y de la salud de los jóvenes mineros".

¿Pero por qué esperar hasta el Festival para conocer las opiniones de ustedes sobre una cuestión que es objeto de tantas discusiones? Demos a conocer ya desde ahora, cuando se desarrollan los preparativos, qué problemas les parecen los más importantes.

Y este cambio de ideas y de experiencias serán una valiosa aportación y ayuda para todos los jóvenes mineros.

Lo mismo podemos decir en torno a los demás encuentros profesionales.

## ESTOS CONTRINCANTES SON NUESTROS AMIGOS

Nunca ha podido asistir a los festivales. Por eso estoy muy contento de que el VI Festival Mundial de la Juventud y de los Estudiantes vaya a celebrarse en Moscú, donde se encuentran los jóvenes de diferentes países para conocerse y establecer amistad, para proclamar a todo pulmón su aspiración a la paz.

Me sentiré muy satisfecho de poder ver en Moscú a mis amigos deportistas. En la XVI Olimpiada, el equipo de fútbol soviético jugó con los futbolistas de la República Federal Alemana, de Indonesia, Bulgaria y Yugoslavia. Conozco hace mucho tiempo a los deportistas de estos equipos, y he con toda sinceridad he de decir que me alegraron sus éxitos en los juegos olímpicos, aunque los futbolistas de estos países nos pusieron en serios aprietos. Nuestra victoria sobre estos equipos fue conquistada tras una lucha muy ruidosa. Nosotros ganamos, pero no por esto disminuyó nuestra simpatía mutua.

Durante la XVI Olimpiada nosotros, futbolistas soviéticos conquistamos muchas nuevas amistades. Y no sólo entre los miembros del balompé, sino entre los boxeadores, gimnastas y basquetbolistas. Nos proporcionará gran alegría aquellos amigos que vengan al VI Festival Mundial de la Juventud y de los Estudiantes; a todos ellos les espera el más cálido y cordial recibimiento.

Como futbolista, y esto es natural, quisiera encontrarme de nuevo con mis antiguos rivales y amigos.

A menudo recuerdo la noche del 18 de noviembre de 1954 en la ciudad inglesa de Wolverhampton. Aquella noche, el equipo soviético "Spartak" jugó contra el "Wolverhampton Wanderers" y conoció a su capitán Bill Right. Entonces perdimos el partido por 4 a 0.

Nuestro siguiente encuentro con el equipo de los "lobos" se jugó en agosto de 1955 en el estadio "Dinamo". El capitán del equipo inglés, Wolverhampton Wanderers, se acercó a mí antes del partido me dijo: "¡Qué bonito jugador eres en tu idioma. No entiendo lo que me dices, pero está claro que se trata de unas cálidas palabras de estimación. El "Spartak" se tomó un descanso al desquite y venció a su peligroso adversario por el tanto de 3 a 0. Bill Right jugó magníficamente. A él debían los jugadores ingleses que no tenían una única ventaja más en su portería. El futbolista soviético Nikolai Puchko, marcado por el inglés Bill Right, tuvo que hacer grandes esfuerzos para evitar un jugador de tanta categoría.

Recordaré durante mucho tiempo la semifinal del campeonato de fútbol celebrada en Melbourne. Jugábamos contra el equipo de Bulgaria. El primer gol fue marcado en nuestra portería por el interior izquierdo Iván Kolev. Es curioso que logramos la victoria con gran dificultad. El partido terminó 3 a 1. El primer que me felicitó y deseó éxito en la final fue Iván Kolev. Aquel día por la noche vimos a Iván Kolev en el Club Olímpico. Se acercó a mí y me preguntó qué tal se sentía Nikolai Tschenko, que en el partido jugado contra los búlgaros se había lesionado seriamente.

A partir de entonces, Iván Kolev venía a vernos a menudo y hablabamos él durante mucho rato acerca del deporte y de la amistad de los deportistas de los diferentes países. Iván Kolev nos manifestó su deseo de encontrarse de nuevo con los futbolistas soviéticos en el campo de juego.

Quisieramos ver este verano en Moscú a Iván Kolev, así como al capitán del equipo inglés Bill Right y al famoso futbolista del mismo país Stanley Matthews.

¡Venid, amigos! No sé si me encontraré con vosotros en la verde césped del estadio, lo que sí sé es que me encontraré con vosotros en cualquier otro sitio de nuestra capital. Yo en la casa número, remodelada y ensalzada para recibir a los delegados al VI Festival, hasta de la juventud del mundo y de la amistad.

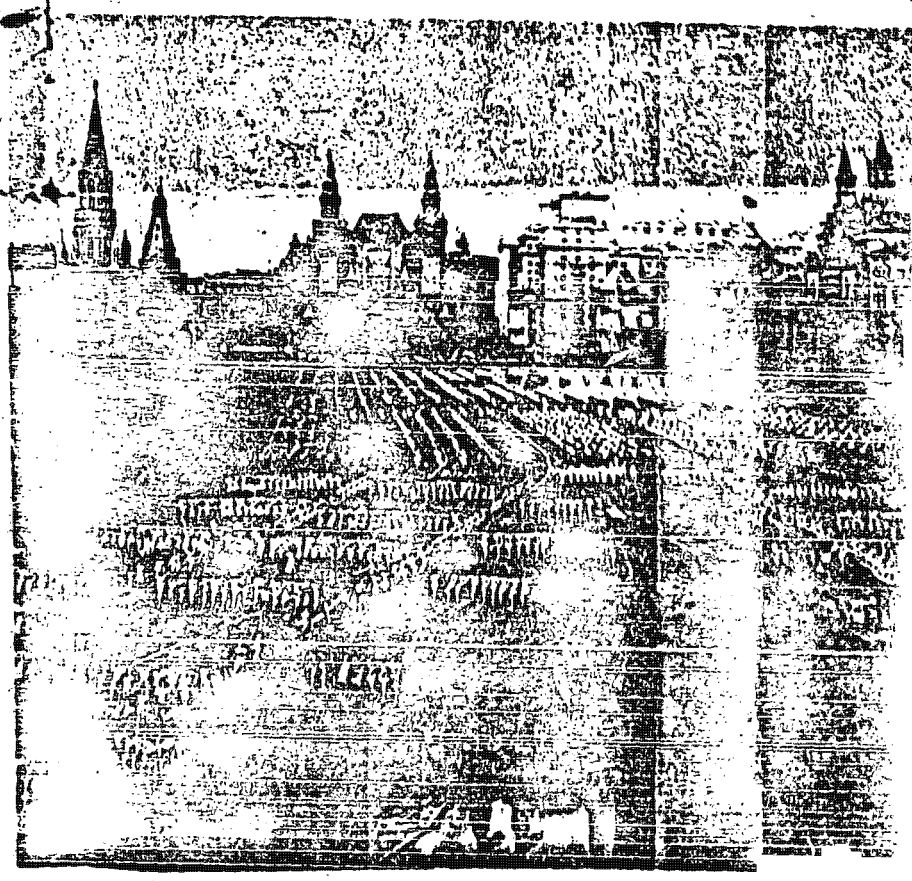

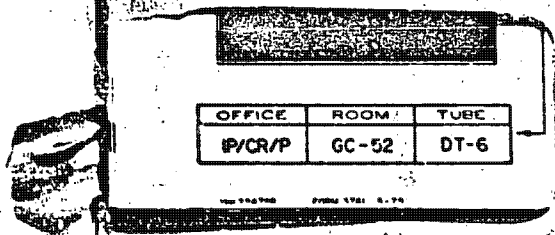

On 27 October 1956 it was reported that Ramon DANZOS Palomino, Bernabé ARANA, and other members of the Partido Comunista de Mexico (PCM) were conducting Communist indoctrination sessions for JD members at the home of Vicente PADILLA Hernandez, Calle Nuevo Leon No. 213 Norte, Ciudad Obregon. These PCM leaders appeared determined to expand the membership of the JD at the expense of the Juventud Popular (JP), youth organization of the Partido Popular (PP).

5. In view of the overlapping of JD and JP membership, especially at the leadership level, a serious disorientation of the JP has occurred. Whereas in the past the energies of the members of the JP were oriented completely towards the PP, with the emergence of the communist JD a number of the more prominent JP members have begun to openly preach communism, with resulting disagreement and internal division within the JP.

6. One woman, known as "La China", a long-time, loyal member of the PP, reported to Mariano VASQUEZ, PP Secretary General in Ciudad Obregon, that JP meetings in her house at Ejido Guadalupe Victoria had been turned into communist meetings by certain JP leaders who made no attempt to conceal their communist convictions.

7. Ramon DANZOS Palomino, the mentor of the JD, has been singled out by the PP as the cause of this division in the ranks of the JP.

8. The JD is somewhat of a mystery and many PP and JP members in Southern Sonora are not able to explain satisfactorily its reported connection with the PCM or its program of action. There is no doubt that the JD membership as a whole is more completely communistic than the JP.

This Bureau recently acquired seventeen items that purportedly cover matters investigated by the Policia Secreta (Cuban Secret Police). These items were made available by a former member of the Policia Secreta who claimed he had removed them from the office of the Policia Secreta after the fall of the Batista Regime and kept them in his home until he furnished them to a representative of this Bureau. The source who made these items available was unable to further evaluate the material.

A cursory review has disclosed that the items consist for the most part of lists of names of individuals reportedly connected with the Partido Socialista Popular (Communist Party of Cuba). The majority of the lists are undated or are dated prior to 1951. In addition, one of the items consists of 52 reports prepared by agents of the Policia Secreta. These reports, which are dated from August 28, 1956, until August 22, 1957, contain the results of applicant-type investigations conducted on individuals who sought positions in the Government. Most of the individuals investigated appeared to be loyal to the Batista Regime.

Inasmuch as the information in the items appears to be of primary interest to the Central Intelligence Agency, the items are being made available to that Agency. In event any of the agencies receiving copies of this letter are interested in the information contained in these items, it is suggested that the Central Intelligence Agency be contacted for its evaluation of the information.

2. Attachment #2 to this dispatch consists of names extracted from LIBRIFORM'S summaries for RI carding. FOR EE: please see that the cards are made as indicated but, in addition, that the words CZECH CONTACT, MEXICO, are put on them. If feasible, please ask RI to return all cards at one time to EE Division, for transmittal to Station. Many of the cards requested in HMA 19255 of 10 July 1962 do not appear to have been received and/or were received with such delay and so spasmodically that they were of almost no help to Station in its review of the June-October summaries. However, those that were received were very well done.

3. All names for RI carding in current Attachment #2 were checked against Station files and were completed with 201 numbers, entire name, and Station P file numbers where possible.

4. For EE: The Austrian Desk may be interested in the comments on Walter ~~Wessel~~ (matronymic Weiss) in Attachment #2, although Subject may now be a Mexican citizen.

a. The Czech Desk may care to note the fact that one Mrs. Yvonne ~~Retinger~~ is in contact, possibly through the Czech diplomatic pouch to Mexico, with (Dr.) Rudolf ~~Ilitis~~ who has a Prague address.

A check with an Embassy Economic official indicated that these could possibly be part numbers for equipment (possibly for aircraft), and that the letters A and B could stand for the shipper (such as American Airlines, Braniff, et cetera). They could also, of course, be shipping document numbers, but the official knew of none in these high brackets. Headquarters may want to check this further through the Department of Commerce. (This paragraph may also be of interest to WH Division.)

5. For WH: The Chilean Desk may be interested in comments on one Jules ~~Pissaro~~ and one Ernesto ~~Cobler~~ who appear to be friends of Czech scientist Geza (or Giza or Geiza) ~~Mencer~~. (These names are all mentioned in Attachment #2.)

2. Gilberto GUEMAN Cacerre was a delegate from his union to the 5th Congress of the Federacion de Estudiantes Universitarios del Ecuador (FEUE), held in Quito in 1952.
3. The Sindicato de Estibadores Portuarios y Auxilios is affiliated with the Federacion Provincial de Trabajadores del Guayas (Workers' Federation of Guayas Province - FPTG), a Communist-controlled Union.
4. Jorge MORAÑ Bonarques attended the Fifth Congress of the FPTG in May 1955 as a delegate from his union.
5. Rene VILLACIS Lozano also attended the Fifth Congress of the FPTG.
6. Luis Alvaro ROBLES Plaza is a member of the Concentracion de Fuerzas Populares (CFF) and is violently anti-government.
7. Segundo AYALA is probably identical with one Segundo AYALA A. who was reported in 1952 as being a member of the Sociedad de Estibadores y Socorros Mutuos.
8. Enrique CARRASCO A. is possibly identical with one Enrique A. CARRASCO Villamar, who has been a Partido Comunista del Ecuador (Communist Party of Ecuador - PCE) member and in 1953 was reported to be a member of the Sindicato de Trabajadores de las Bananeras del Ecuador (Union of Banana Workers of Ecuador).
9. A report dated 1954 stated that one Francisco CHIPS, possibly identical with one CHIPS R., was expelled from the Sociedad Union de Estibadores y Socorros Mutuos because of Communist activity.
10. Enrique MORMIRA was reported in 1952 as being a member of the Union Sindical de Estibadores.
