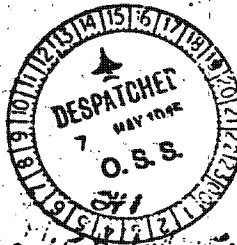

POLICY OF CITATIONS & AWARDS BOARD.

1. Decorations and citations may be awarded only for an outstanding act or accomplishment which must be above and beyond the call of duty and the requirements of the job.

2. As a general rule, agent personnel in civilian clothing who are voluntarily engaged in hazardous duty behind enemy lines, will be considered as possible prospective candidates for the award of the Distinguished Service Cross, subject to the following considerations:

(a) Whether the entrance of the agent into France occurred before or after D-Day.

(b) The total time that elapsed from the inception of the operation to its completion.

(c) The degree of danger which the agent encountered in fulfilling the requirements of the mission, e.g. --

(i) Working in Gestapo-controlled areas, or areas rigidly held by the enemy.

(ii) Operating in enemy territory where resistance groups were strong, as opposed to operating in areas where there was little or no support by the Maquis.

3. Military personnel in uniform who are voluntarily engaged in hazardous duty behind enemy lines will, as a general rule, be considered as possible prospective candidates for the award of the Silver Star, subject to the considerations as outlined in paragraph 2.

4. The quality of services rendered by personnel in either of the above categories should be carefully reviewed by the branches concerned, with a view to determining whether a lower or, in special cases, a higher award would or should be recommended on the basis of the facts presented. It is the considered opinion of the Board that the general principles outlined in the above paragraphs do not preclude a higher award or a repeat award for an outstanding act performed by an individual while fulfilling the requirements of his mission.

5. Recommendations for awards to individuals whose service was rendered during the time that they were attached to a military unit should be forwarded through proper military channels.

6. As indicated in paragraph 1, awards for headquarters and staff personnel are warranted only in cases where the individual's performance is outstanding, and over and above what is normally expected in the execution of the job, by evidencing to an unusual degree such qualities as (a) outstanding initiative and planning ability, (b) perseverance and (c) foresight.

7. As a guide to prevent OSS personnel from appearing too lenient in their recommendations for awards as compared with other organizations in the Theater, branches should consider that the following percentages of personnel in various categories are probably worthy of consideration for some form of recognition:

- (a) Behind the lines service 75-80%
- (b) Field Detachment personnel 10-15%
- (c) Headquarters and staff personnel 10-15%

These percentages are not limiting or deciding factors, but should serve merely as a guide.

8. The Board expects all branches to examine closely every recommendation with respect to the policy as outlined above and in accordance with ETOUSA orders No. 200.6 MFGA, dated 12 June 1944, before submission to the Board. Each branch will have completed a thorough check on all the narratives of their personnel who have been engaged in operational missions. If a person did services behind the lines in civilian clothes, the narrative should so state.

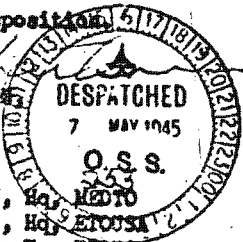

1. The attached memoranda from Colonel Jackson and Colonel Van der Stricht are forwarded for your attention and any action you may care to take. In my opinion Van der Stricht has taken a somewhat exaggerated view of the importance of the matter, and in certain cases I do not agree with his reasoning. This is particularly true in connection with his desire to keep British and French decorations entirely on the same level.

2. Also he fails to give any consideration to the problem involved in awards to the British where we must think in terms of both SOE and SIS. However, the problem is one which needs careful consideration, and I feel it would be very helpful if you could give me your ideas on the matter and also arrange to have whatever action is necessary taken with the War Department in Washington.

3. Although our government is undoubtedly free to grant its own decorations as it pleases, there is a precedence, in the case of decorations for foreign officers, which it is advisable to observe and which takes into account both the American rules and regulations, and those of the country of the beneficiaries.

4. In the case at hand, there is first of all a precedence as between the officers of one and the same nationality, and secondly a precedence as between the officers of both nationalities, inasmuch as all officers are being proposed for activities carried out by the same HQ.

5. Precedence as between French. The Ministry of War informed me verbally that should recommendations for American decorations be made for certain members of the Resistance hierarchy, the National Delegate (General Chaban-Delmas) should receive a higher award than the BR's who were serving under him. This is based on the functions of these officers, and bears no relation to their rank in the Army (either regular or PFI).

6. In addition one should keep in mind the decoration (officer-Legion of Merit) already awarded to General Ziegler. In view of the fact that General Ziegler had a four year record in Resistance and that he became Chief of Staff of E.M.F.I., it would seem that Chaban-Delmas who was National Delegate for a very short time only, should not get a higher award than the one already given to General Ziegler.

7. In conclusion, it could seem that the officer's degree would be the appropriate award for General Chabannes. As a result, the D.M.'s, listed in para 11 below, should be proposed for the degree of legionnaire.

8. As the French regard the Legion of Merit very highly and consider it as a decoration similar to their own Legion of Honor, and the degree of legionnaire as equivalent to the degree of chevalier, they would probably be greatly surprised, on the basis of their own standards, if the D.M.'s were granted anything above the legionnaire's degree.

9. Precedence as between British. Seven British officers of SOE have been recommended for American awards (not counting Sir Charles Hambro who, as a civilian, is being recommended for the Medal of Merit). Of these seven, two, (General Cubbins and Brigadier Mocker-Ferryman) should get the officer's degree, and five should be made legionnaires. This would correspond also to the ranks given by the French to certain of these British officers for work done for a period which, it should be noted, exceeds the one of the Anglo-American association. Both General Cubbins and Brigadier Mocker-Ferryman were made officers of the Legion of Honor, whereas Colonel Buckmaster was made a chevalier. It would seem to be in our own interest to take this into consideration as the granting of American awards to the British officers, in a higher degree than the one awarded by the French, in connection with the same work and for a shorter period of service, would in fact result in debasing the Legion of Merit vis a vis the Legion of Honor.

10. Precedence as between French and British. The granting to the British of the Legion of Merit in a degree exceeding the one recommended for the French would be, diplomatically speaking, a "faux pas". If one considers the resistance activities from a very broad point of view, the French were, in the last instance, the people who bore the brunt of the whole resistance show, who furnished the men and suffered the casualties in the 10s of thousands by deportation or otherwise. The British and Americans, despite the isolated cases of great heroism of some agents and the air force losses, in the last analysis serviced French resistance. Under the circumstances it would seem appropriate that the British should receive from us decorations exceeding in importance those given by us to the French.

11. In conclusion it would seem that the Legion of Merit which has been recommended for the British and French officers mentioned below should, if approved, be granted in the degrees indicated:

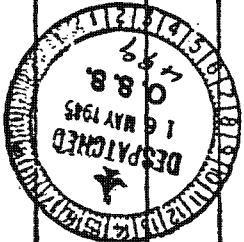

However, it is outside of my hands, and all that I can say is that I deeply appreciate the motive which prompted you to recommend me for a Legion of Merit covering the period of my work in London. I have always felt that whatever success we may have had in the weathering of the storms of those early days was due primarily to the leadership which you yourself provided.

I am very glad, however, that you are recommending suitable awards to the heads of the various Allied services in London. In a few cases it may be necessary to recommend awards for more than one individual in a given service, but you have doubtless taken all this into full account. There are several people at Broadway who were especially helpful to us, but I am afraid that if you single them out they might be subject to censure in their own office, for having given us assistance beyond the level of official policy.
