SUBJECT: Commendation.

TO : Strategic Services Officer, OSS.

- 1. It is especially desired to commend the OSS units that were attached to or served in conjunction with this headquarters and those Chinese Armies and groups whose operations were coordinated through this headquarters with the Chinese Supreme Headquarters.
- 2. The varied and unusual type of duty performed by these units made their performance of duty most difficult. In spite of the belief of many foreigners, based upon ordinary news reports that the Chinese were finished guerilla fighters of long experience in such operations against the Japanese, there was actually little of this type of combat that had been carried on effectively for the past two years.
- 3. The arrival of aggressive and competent groups of officers, many with prior commando service in the European Theater, provided a great impetus to the Chinese. These young officers, with little or no prior service in China, were able to obtain the comfidence of the Chinese entirely because of their military efficiency and ability to teach and produce results and to fight alongside of the Chinese in their units. The commando units overcame many difficulties and produced outstanding results during their service in China.
- 4. This headquarters has coordinated most of its work with these units through Colonel William R. Peers, Colonel William P. Davis, and Lt. Colonel Alfred T. Cox. All three of these officers have proven to be especially competent, cooperative, and cutstanding for common sense and judgment. Because of their efforts, many of the difficulties which are inherent in coordinating military operations which are removed from the channel of military command have never even arisen.

10: Director, SSU/TD, Mashington Attention: Chief, Personnel Branch

- 1. Reference is made to AMCON Cable No. 313 and Fashington No. 911, above subject.
- 2. In the overall planning for the reorganization of AWZOH and the streamlining of Services personnel (as discussed by Mr. Lewis on his recent trip to Washington), it was decided to combine responsibilities of several Services Branch officers, thus automatically eliminating the position of Yess and Club Officer.
- 3. Original plans called for the recruitment of two junior officers from the United States, both of whom have indicated tney are not interested in the assignment offered. In addition it has become an urgent necessity to immediately assign a junior officer to conducting and lisison duties out of the Office of Chief, of Mission. Captain Conein has been assigned to this task in addition to his cuties as Mess and Club Officer. The time spent on supervisory control of the messes and clubs has reached the point where it entails a total of only about four or five days per month. These duties are principally accountability both for supply and cash funds connected with the messes and clubs. The duties of the conducting and liaison officer are most peculiar in nature in that no set schedule of duties can be outlined at least with respect to time. There have been individual conducting assignments that involved a minimum of a few hours of a given day and other times such conducting assignment actually lasted two or three or more days. These assignments come up at unusual times and it is imperative that we have available such junior officers to meet all derands made upon us when they actually arise. On the other hand, the essential mess and club duties may be very well "sand-biched in" between the more important duties of the conducting officer.
- 4. There has been some discussion as to the unreliability of subject officer for reasons unknown to the writer. Thile it is perhaps true that during the war no one ever took a dim view of free wheeling operations, sufficient time has indicated by daily observation both on duty and in social activities that

subject officer now realizes that the war is over and we are only interested in that type officer personnel who have their feet on the ground. He has demonstrated from time to time since he has been on his present assignment that he can do almost any job asked of him. He has shown imagination, initiative and energy in overcoming obstacles encountered in setting up our two messes and clubs, which are currently operating with maximum efficiency and smoothness.

5. In view of the above, we are retaining subject in his new assignments.


1. Reference is made to your requisition dated & June 1946, requesting a Liaison and Conducting Officer for amzon. Such request was made by Lieutenant Colonel Kubler, Executive Officer. Further reference is made to correspondence from Lolonel Kubler dated 19 June 1946, under which he suggests that Captain Lucien Conein presently assigned as Wess and Club Officer, be detailed to fill the above request.

- 2. Captain Conein was reassigned to Amson at the insistence of high echelon War Department authorities. When serving his first tour of duty in ETO, Captain Conein became involved with the daughter of the editor of one of the leading De Gaullist publications. The matter apparently was a serious one for men Captain Conein was returned to the United States, French officials contacted United States Covernment authorities in Mashington, calling to their attention the relationship which had previously existed between Captain Conein and the aforementioned girl. Because of this situation, SSU was directed to return Captain Conein in an immocuous position to ETC for the purposes of settling his personal affairs with the aforementioned girl.
- 3. The suggestion of Colonel Kubler that Captain Conein be used as Liaison and Conducting Officer has been thoroughly discussed in Personnel Branch and with Security Branch. It is their unanimous opinion that the choice of Captain Conein to fill this requisition would be unwise. Because of his past history of personal relationships with high French officials, and because of the fact that Captain Conein is supposed to occupy an inconspicuous position, it is deemed advisable that he remain in his present position and not be transferred to a position where he might subject the organization to criticism and cansure.
