Note: This dispatch explained why reports had not been forwarded since HFMA 24254, see above—in accordance with Headquarters request that contact reports not be forwarded in the future.

HFMA 25001 explained that henceforth 1 copy only of LITAMIL-9 CR's would be forwarded to WH/SA, attention Urquhart and Labanow. Both of these officers had specifically requested that LITAMIL-9 CR's be forwarded to WH/SA. In the interim, between September and January, CR's for the following meetings were placed in Station files: 10 September 64, 21 September 64, 1 October 64, 4 October 64, 23 October 64, 29 October 64, 5 November 64, and 16 November 64.

- 3. It is realized that an operational progress report and a contact report are two different items; however, in view of the detailed nature of the LITAMIL-9 CR's the Station has felt that their submission has satisfied the requirements of operational reporting. The criticism of reference is all the more puzzling since such visitors to the Station as Chester D. Lainold, Chief, Whit; Morton A. Woolley, erstwhile Chief of Operations, WHD; and Thomas W. Lund, present Mexico Branch Chief, have all expressed their approval of the detailed operational reporting on this operation during visits they have made to the Station at which time the reports in question have been brought to their attention.
- 4. When LITAMIL-9 next exits PRUME., the Station will begin to prepare formal operational progress reports on the operation.
- 5. As for the questions raised in paragraph 2 of reference regarding operational security, advance information on LITAMIL-9's recall came from LIENVOY but he was not informed of the imminence of his transfer until it was reported routinely by LITAMIL-7 and was generally known by his colleagues. As for the implication that LITAMIL-9 was informed of the Station's capability to intercept Embassy telephone conversations, a careful rereading of the Hemorandum under critique will show that no such admossledgement was made. LITAMIL-9 was informed that "we have a good chance of being told about such a conversation by one of our friends," i.e. that word will probably get around in Embassy circles that ITAMIL-9 is about to travel to such-and- such a point.

As for the speculation that LITAMIL-9 suspects that Embassy phones are tapped, he has indicated his belief that this is the case ever since he was taken over by the present C/O. In fact, he is prone to say "I called so -and-so on such-and-such a matter, using the phone instead of the intercem so you could hear it." In cases wherein he has spoken this way, he has been told that chances are we will never hear about the matter discussed unless he reports on it specifically in his meetings with his C/O.

- Meetings were held with LITAMIL-9 on the above dates. L-9 brought his brother to the meeting of 2 March. He failed to show up for a scheduled meeting on 7 Parch but made the alternate the next day. The large number of meetings in a relatively short time was due to the imminence of L-9's transfer from Mexico.
- 2. The meeting of 12 February concerned furniture of the Embassy and L-9 described a piece being re-upholstered as from the office of APRIFT-1. On the basis of this report the decision was made to go shead with another LIRC!'ANCE-type operation.
 - 3. At subsequent meetings L-9 reported as follows:
 - a. On 13 February an outfit named Conciertos Mexico, A.C. acked L-9 to formally invite Cuba to send contestants to the First International Guitar Contest which will be held in Mexico City the first two weeks of September 1965. An Embassy note was sent out on 15 Feb.
 - b. On 4 Feb Lic. Vidal LUNA Peralta of the Instituto Mexicano del Seguro Social, Subdirrecion General Administrativa, wrote a letter to the Cuben Ambassador asking the Embassy to obtain a copy of a book entitled Retorna a la Alborada for him. According to LUMA this book is published in Cuba. LUNA's letter read in part: Como funcionario mericano, universitario y maestro universitario, me intereca la obra de referencia, por considerar que dicha obra constiture el sporte mas interesante que ha sido editado en los ultimos años, dentro del marco de las ideas del enome l'arti.
 - On 13 Feb CUINCA told L-9 that he, CUINCA, expected to remain in Mexico for a month on TDY. Referring to possible replacements for APARICIO, CUENCA told L-9, Whoever it is who comes, it will have to be someone who doesn't get in your way."
 - d. On 13 Feb someone came to the Embassy to give L-9 some anti-Castro propaganda material distributed in Veracruz recently. L-9 took it to the Ambassador and left it with him. (From the description, this sounds like LECOX material).
 - e. On 15 Feb L-9 went to the Institute to pick up two woodcarvings of CASTRO and MILLA, the Communist martyr, which someone had donated to the Institute. They were very poorly done and as L-9 passed through the Embassy yard with them under his arm, someone in a group of staffers there, including CUENCA, called out to him asking that

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he intended to do with the carvings. L-9 replied, "The only thing they're good for is burning." This caused quite a roar of laughter. According to L=9 his reply was quite "caring" since one doesn't joke about Fidel in this way. He feels that by making such a reark he is demonstrating his self confidence to the rest of the staff.

- f. On Monday 15 Feb at 1145 hours Lic. MAS Araujo was with the Ambassador. (LIPOMANCE lead).
- g. On 15 Feb Sol ARGUEDAS, who is butting in more and more in affairs of the Cultural Department, phoned the Embassy to see if she could get a letter in the pouch to Jose FRESNEDA of the Casa de las Americas.
- h. On 15 Feb an Englishman named Robert CUIDY showed up to exhibit some films he had made in Cuba. These were unedited rushes. CUIDY said he hopes to go back to Cuba again soon to make some movies in the Sierra Maestra area. The films he showed at the Embassy dealt with such prosaic subjects as sponge fishing in Cuba. They were shown from 1600 to 2000 hours. Are later to appear on British TV. At one point Fidel CASTRO appeared on the screen and no-one applauded. Julian LOPEZ, sitting up front, turned around and accused everyone of being gusanos.
- i. Cn 16 Feb the wife of the code clerk, VILLAVICENCIO, was acting as secretary to the Ambassador. L-9 felt that this was a good example of the acute shortage of help since this woman apparently has no ability or experience in the secretarial field.
- j. On 16 Feb an American woman named Ana TOWPKENS visited the Embassy. Hond, pretty, about 35. She said she is a social worker, was in Cuba before in 1960. Now lives at Ignacio Mariscal 132, Mexico City. Wants to go to Cuba again for a visit. L-9 referred her to the Consulate.
- k. On 17 Feb L-9 got a phone call from the secretary (female) to Humberto ROMERO (in turn, secretary to ALM) who wanted to speak to the Amb. L-9 referred call to correct number.
- 1. On 19 Feb L-9 overheard the Amb ask Cuenca, "Are you going to Cuba today?" Apparently the Amb knew nothing of C's change of plan.
- m. On 19 Feb Cuenca told L-9, "I've got to hurry back to Habana but I will be back here in about 6 weeks."
- n. The courier ENIC arrived on 19 Feb.
- o. The daughter of the CAMACHO couple (night watchman and cleaning woman) left for Cuba on 19 Feb as a "becada."
- p. Luis PRIETO of the MLN came to the Embassy at 1630 hours 19 Feb and spoke with the Amb and L-9 about the Cultural Institute. They spoke in the LIROMANCE-1 room. PRIETO had with him a plan Sol ARGUEDAS had written up about beefing up the Cultural Institute. It was addressed to the Amb. (LIROMANCE lead).
- q. As of 19 Feb a visa still had not arrived for Vicente CHUMACERO (see previous CR).

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- r. On 20 Feb L-9 spoke with Justo URRETA who appeared to have calmed down a bit from his recent scare (arrest in connection with export of blood plasma). Urbicta said he would like to stay on in Mexico for at least another year because of his daughter's schooling. He said that his lawer had told him that he need not fear further difficulties because of his connection with the blood plasma incident.
- s. At 1100 hours 22 Reb an Ecuadoran (name not noted) visited the Cultural Section wanting help to travel to Cuba. He was referred to the Consulate.
- t. At 1200 hours on 22 Fcb Javier GUERNERO was at the Embassy. (Possible LIROMANCE lead).
- u. On 20 Feb at 1215 hours two Mexican MD's named Eduardo MECNELL Mendiola and Raul LFRCERO Martinez, accompanied by Rufina BDRQUEZ, visited the Cultural Department seeking information on how they might work out a visit to Cuba or medical studies there. DRQUEZ mentioned being a friend of Marta FRAIDE.
- v. At 1010 hours on 22 Feb Felipe ROJAS, clipping newspapers for L-9, said he thought that it would be a good idea to send some clippings on the Hijos de Sanchez book controversy to Cuba. L-9, who is convinced that Felipe is a Mexican agent, said he thought this was a poor idea and told him not to send anything to Cuba that could cause embarrassment to Mexico. L-9 felt that Rojas right be testing him in bringing up this sticky subject.
- w. On 23 Feb L-9 went to an Armed Forces Day reception at the Soviet Embassy. Usual social affair, nothing of interest to report.
- x. On 23 Feb Armando RODRIGUEZ of the Instituto was at the Embassy with Irina TRAPCTE de LOFEZ. He express ed surprise on learning that Sol had returned (Sol ARCUEDAS). Said that he had wanted her to help him publish a book under the auspices of the Instituto but that she had not wanted to help him in this. Apparently a bit anti-Sol.
- y. On 23 Feb a visa for Vicente CHUMACERO Galindo finally was authorized. His mother went to Cuba the next day.
- a. At 1200 on 23 Feb a Mexican journalist named PARFILLON (fnu) was at the Embassy trying to get a copy of book written by another Yexican journalist, Luis LARA Pardo, since deceased.
- maa. At 1210 on 23 Feb Yolanda came across her husband CURIELO chatting at the Embassy gate and upbraidod him for not being at his office, "Thy aren't you in the Consulate, they have been calling you on the phone for half an hour."
- bb. On 24 Feb it was announced that the Embassy would not celebrate the Orito de Deire this year. Apparently an economy measure.
- cc. The staff was told that total expenses at the airport (tips, etc) cannot exceed 25 pesos for any one day from now on. Economy measure. (REPORTED). When VEGA heard this he said, "Well if that's the way things are, then the Ambassador can just go out there himself,"

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- dd. At 1223 hours on 23 Feb Jose MANCISIDER, hijo, visited the Cultural Department to see about having his father's bock, A History of the Mexican Revolution, published in Cuba. He caid he is not interested in making money on the new edition.
- ee. During the night of 24 Feb a cable came to the Embassy announcing that the ship Karl Mark would not be coming to the Medican coast to pick up cotton for shipment to Cuba. It was addressed to Guillers RUIZ (long since gone). When Avilio GORJON opened it up and read it he exclaimed "Cabonesi" and stormed off.
- ff. On 25 Feb the American Social worker, Ara TOMPKINS, see item j above, came back to the Embassy. Her documentation was not sufficiently complete to qualify her for a visa. She was told to come back later.
- gg. On 25 Feb L-9 accompanied Sol ARGUEDAS (in place of Federico ALVAREZ, who begged off) to a number of points in the city picking up artifacts, books, etc., which Sol had arranged to be given to the Embassy -- to be sent to Cuba for the Casa de Mexico in Habana. They spent 3 hours on this.
- hh. On the night of 25 Teb L-9 got a phone call from a woman who talked as though she had been drinking, said "I am a spy watching you," and made a lot of foolish remarks. L-9 thinks it was Sol ARGUEDAS but rather than play games with her he hung up after explaining he didn't have time to waste talking to people who refuse to identify themselves.
- On 27 Feb L-9 first learned officially that he was to be transferred then the Amb called him into the office and gave him the word. L-9 took the news calmly (the C/O had earlier told him that he would probably be transferred soon). He told the Amb, "I am nothing more than a soldier and I will go where ordered." Curiously enough the Amb seemed to think some pity was in order and said it was a shame L-2 had to go but that, "that's life and, who knows, maybe I'll be transferred out of here before long myself." The Amb praised L-9 highly for his work and mentioned specific instances when L-9 had accomplished difficult tasks for the Embassy by his smooth manner of working with Mexican officialdom. L-9 said that many of his friends wondered why he stayed with "that Embassy" but that he felt that as a patriotic Cuban it was his duty to stick with his fatherland in lean days as well as better times. He was ready to go when and there he might be ordered. He told the Ambassador he would be roady to leave about 8 March as it would take him some time to settle his affairs. The Amb told him there was no hurry and he could have as much time as he might need to get things in order.
- jj. On 1 Mar L-9 brought the Amb over to his department and showed him his files, library, etc. Everything was in apple pie order and the Amb was quite impressed. One thing that struck his fancy was L-9's system of keeping a running log on incoming phone calls on a calendar set by the phone — the Amb liked this idea so much he sent someone out to buy him a similar calendar-log.

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- kk. On 1 Mar at L-97s request, the Amb sent a message to FOMIN Rank EAA that just as soon as he had his affairs in order L-9 would return to Cuba.
- II. On 1 Mar Armando TEVETRA and another Cuban medico came in from Cuba to attend a medical congress in Cuernavaca.
- om. On 2 Mar Armando GCDOY of the Instituto and Sol ARGUFDAS
 visited L-9 to discuss Sol's program of obtaining books for
 the Casa de Mexico in Habana
- nn. On 2 Mar L-9 learned that Rogelio RCDRIGUEZ will be returning to Cuba FCS on 5 Mar.
- oo. On 2 Mar URBIETA told L-9 that he had heard that Andres ARMONA was coming to replace L-9.
- pp. L-9 reported that the table at which Embassy staff members have their lunch in the kitchen is almost exactly the same as Model 734 at Sears Roebuck, Ejercito Nacional Store. He had been scouting for a similar table for several weeks.
- 4. On 17 Feb L-9 mentioned the name of his Swedish girlfriend -- WHANNSEN. She is an artist, now in Philadelphia in connection with a Swedish art exhibit.
- 5. On 19 Feb the C/O presented L-9 with a gold centenario as a 50th birthday present -- L-9 said he would keep it as a good luck piece, seemed very pleased to be remembered on his birthday.
- 6. On 26 Feb L-9 mentioned that he had been approached by representatives of the UNAM radio station to furnish broadcast material. The C/O encouraged him to offer his help but to try to stall any actual deliveries of propaganda material to the station.
- 7. At a number of these meetings L-9 was being softened up to accept transfer to Cuba (rur advance notice came from LIENVOY) and after examination of myriad facets he said, before he officially received word that he was being transferred, that he would agree to go back if called upon to do so. He was given intensive coaching in what to expect in the way of provocation and how to cope with it. By the time the owrd came he was well prepared and almost ancious to go to Cuba although he would have really preferred to quietly melt into the Mexican same. Hendquarters authorized a pay raise from \$ 4,000 MM to 35,000 MM as requested by the Station and on 3 March L-9 was given \$10,000 to cover his salary for March and April. He was encouraged to ask the Embassy for an advance on his salary to cover packing expenses -- he did this and reported back that he felt it had had a good effect from the cover standpoint. On 10 March he was given a bonus of \$5,000 MM (HQS had suggested a bonus of up to 500 dollars) which also had a very good effect on his morale.
- 8. Communications and contact arrangements have been covered in a separate memorandum which will be filled on top of P-6079.

A car meeting was hald with L-9 on the night of 7 Jan. L-7 reported as follows:

- Ca 30 Des 64 a man passed David VEINE of the Mational Broadcasting Company phoned L-9 to inquire about the prosentation of a statue of Emiliano Zapata to the Coban Azbesezdor by the University of Michosom, WEER's phone is 65-31-05. (LIEWI picked this up).
- b. On 30 Due the local manager of an erchestra made as of poor children inquired whether the fallessy would be willing to furnish musical fastruments for the group. (L-9 was instructed to follow up on this as it could result is seen good poblicity for him thus endancing his position).
- On 30 Dec Lie. HRVA THTZ of the Univ. of Michoscen was in the piono room of the Embassy - had come to talk with the Amb Books the Zapatu statue.
 - On 30 Doe L-9 learned that Jameican Senator Dadley Thompson scald be returning from Cobs on 8 Jan. (He did.)
 - On Sat 2 Jan L-9 had a long obst with the Amb in the letter's uffice. Hothing of importance was covered - L-9 fuels that it is a good idea to get the Amb alone from time to time and steply chat. As was in good spirits, seemed to enjoy the visit. L-9 explained what he was working on and what his plans are for the future. And encouraged him to keep up the good work. At this secsion the ist told L-7 "confidentially" that he had just learned she would be the new director of Ballas Artes (INEA) - Jose Luis MARTINEZ. Smile this is not of itself very significant, L-9 reported that it is the first time the Amb has ever imperted enything to him on a "confidential" bestia perhaps a good sign.
 - fo On 2 Jan Irina Trapoto asked L-9 if he had a collection of back insuce of the Laboury bulletin. He had such a collection but stalled her off as he did not wish to give it every. Then she informed him that her bestand in the new Press Attache of the Extensy (this is the first indication L-9 has had that Irina is married to Julian LOPEE) and that he was planning great things. i-9 than edultted that he had his our private copies steahed sway and would be gird to gire then to ber.
 - On b dan L-9 heard that Could Dorne II was plausing to go to Caim for 2 main' consultation, leaving constine after the 15th. (1ten cont'd)

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L. has noted that Captio is very. ily with a Cubana stewardess named Pilar (fou) who was on a flight on h Jan or thereabouts, L-9 had the feeling that Pilar has known Camil for a long time;

- 1. After the 4 Jan reception, when all the guests had gone home, SINOBAS and some of the others started joking about the names of the Soviets who had attended they would try to pronounce these names and rours of laughter would ensue. L-9 felt that this was interesting as a year ago no-one would have dared make fun of the Soviete.
- j. On 5 Jan Jaime SABINIS came by to see L-9 and to report that he would be going to Cuca as a judge for the literary contest of the Casa de Las Americas.
- k. On 6 Jan L-9 went to see the Amb and asked if there were any plans for his, L-9's, transfer. The Amb asked L-9 why he should ask such a question. L-9 explained that he was just about to start work on some large convesses which would be very difficult to move and expensive to atore he wanted to know whether he could plan on being in Hexico a while before starting this work. The inb told him he should by all means begin the work as he knew of no plans to transfer L-9.
- 1. On 7 Asn L-9 went with the Amb and other accredited diplomatic officers of the Embessy to pay their respects to GDO. While they were riding in the Amb's car the Amb remarked that word had just been received that the passport of Flura DIAZ Parrado, long-time Cuban diplomat in Paris, had been cancelled seems she refused to return to Cuba when recalled. Also while in the car Camilo DOMENECS remarked that "it would be disastrous" if Jose Antonio HEADER were to come to Maxico and then refuse to return to Cuba. (Ref Item 3.0, CR of 6 Jan)
- m. On 7 Jan SINOEAS was chewing out Alajandro RODRICUEZ, accuring him of not having delivered an invitation to the h Jan reception to a certain ambassador (1-9 did not know which). Alejandro reacted misrply to this, said he had delivered the invitation, and called SINOEAS recor. He accented this word in such a way as to make it a deliberate insult to SINOEAS. The ward compansor is always used among Embasey people.
- n. L-9 has had the locks on his apartment door changed routing security seasure. He does not feel that his spartment has ever been entered although on two occasions one of the locks had been opened the one supplied by the building. His pin tumbler dead bolt has apparently stopped would-be intruders.

- c. Several errors have recently offered to 8140 let tures at the Cultum natitute, among them Dulalis. Was, the art critic Grospe de la erra, and (fnu) PALOMARES of the second group.
- The Embassy has received a complaint that the neteorological students (becades) are not paying their hills.
- q. There is an artifical suphoria in the Embassy these days each officer trying to outdo the others in showing his complete faith in the revolution false smiles and false statements of confidence. L-9 finds all of this quite interesting and easy to see through but has no explanation for it except as a result of the rather uniqual speech given by Fidel CASTEO on 2 Jan in which it seemed that more than ever Cuba must go it alone.
- r. L-9 recently unearthed a piece of paper which he turned over to SINOMS on 31 Dec (it was dated 15 Oct 6h) and referred to a man named Fred Brooks Smith who at that time was seeking a medical scholarship in Cuba. He gave his address as San Jeronimo 21-203, Mexico 1, D.F. and said that from 19h1 to 19h7 he had been a student at the Hargrave Military Academy in Chatham. The paper contained no further and L-7 could not remember anything about Smith.
- a. At the request of Choaden, Barker asked L-9 whether he knew anything of plans of Jaime GARCIA Terres to go to Cuba. L-9 replied that he knew of no such plans and would be surprised to see GARCIA travel as he is not known to be a friend of the Cuban revolution. He said that GARCIA is son-in-law of Ignacio CHAYEZ of the UNAM.
- t. At the request of the Station's Satellite Section, L-9 was asked if he knew Margarita PAZ Paredes, a Mexican poet. He said he recognised the name but could not recall the individual.
- u. L-9 reported on Mexican official attendance at the reception of L Jan. This was relayed to the Embassy Political Section. Noted were ROSENZWEIG Diss, Raul CICERO, (fnu) BERNAL, Ernesto MADERG, and Horacio FLORES Sanches.
- L-9 turned over the usual supply of Cuban newspapers and other publications for JBAATE.
- 2. Another car meeting was held on the might of 18 Jan. L-9 reported as follows:
 - a. On the Cubena plane of 8 Jan were two Japanese and a man named HUTO on their way to Japan to work out some sort of fishing agreement or to consult on fishing matters.
 - b. Dudley THOMPSON arrived on the 8th of Junery spoke with L-9 and the results were forwarded in FIR form to Eqs.
 - c. On 11 Jan L-9's contacts in the Anthropology Museum finally cases across with information he had requestat of them (see previous CR's). He sent this on to LECHIGA in Estats.
 - d. On 12 Jan L-9 discovered that vises hat been issued to Margarita PAZ Paredes, Ermilo AHZU, and Jaime E. TATS -- all going to Cuba as judges in the literary contest of the Casa de las Americas. (item cont'd)

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I-9 gnised that Margarita PAZ is vise of Ermilo ABTU. (Reserved to Station Satellite Section — see item 1,t,above)

- SINOMS is "always with" a new officer who just arrived recently short fellow with blue eyes, L-9 did not have the name yet. This man works in the Consulate. (Must be AEREV or CURESIO).
- f. On 11. Jan a Venezuelan named Edwardo ARAI and his wife Sonia AZPAREN de ARAI came to the Embassy -- returned again on 16 Jan. ARAI claims to have been invited to attend the judging of the literary contest of the Casa de las Americas but did not have his invitation with him. He was being given the stall treatment pending word from Habana. L-9 wanted to cable Habana right away but SIEORAS decided to wait a while.
- g. On Il. Jan permission was received by L=9 to export the Zapata statue to Cuba. (LIENVOT and LIDMEN both covered his efforts to get the permit).
- h. L-9 feels that LITAMIL-7 is acting a bit strange, almost conspiracorial, and suggested that Parker might have a way to tell her to act more naturally. B said, "I have never seen the lady and have no contact with her." L-9 obviously knows of her collaboration.
- 1. Three swar technicians arrived on 16 Jan -- from the Ministry of Sugar. They are being squired around by DOMENECH and plan to visit Mexican sugar mills. One of them, a mulatto named Ariel VIRA, known L-9's brother in Cuba and passed on the brother's best regards. The group will be in Mexico about 2 weeks.
- j. On 18 Jan an American named Alan OINSEERO went to Caba to not as a judge in the literary contest. (This was reported to Hqs on the basis of LIFIRE info).
- k. Un 18 Jan a Colombian painter named Carlos GRANIDA came to the Emb.
 Es is going to Cuba to exhibit some of his paintings but they have
 not showed up in Maxico -- were sent by AVIANIA. The Embarry was
 unable to shed any light on the whereabouts of his paintings.
- 1. On 18 Jan a "Chilean Ambassador" called L-9, said he was staying at the Hotel d'Alarcon, was planning to go to Cuba. L-9 suggested he call the Ambassdor's office. (Later info on this was developed from other sources).
- n. On 18 Jan (fou) POPOCA, Communist who efter visits the Embassy, said he wanted to go to Cuba to study. He is from NA Mexico and has a brother who is a medium ranking officer in the Mexican a my. Embassy note Number 175 was sent to human regarding this request.
- n. On 18 Jan Bienvenido GARCIA and Teudi WVIIR, Guban delegates to the UN were at the Embassy. L-9 was to take them to the American Embassy the next morning to get their tisse.
- c. In response to Barker's inquiry (sized of eventual recruitment), L-9 reported that the maid at the Embassy is Size. CANACHO, wife of (fnu) CAMACHO who lives at the Cultural institute. Sr. CANACHO acts as night watches at the Embassy. His wife is from Jaliaco, is tall and thin. She probably has accoust to the lambia office!

p. L-9 turned over a number of newspapers and periodicals.

3. 1-9 was asked to concentrate on the Ambassador's office and the kitchen (where the staff eats lunch) and be prepared to report in detail on furnishings, layout, etc., at the next meeting. A discussion of furniture throughout the building brought out the information that the love seat being bugged by the Station was originally from the MACHADO-SINOBAS office and has recently been in the plane room which is occasionally used for "secret conferences" because of the heavy curtains which keep sounds from filtering out.

MENORANDUM FOR THE RECORD

Lawrence F. Barker

Meetings with LITA-IL-9, 28-29 July 1964 3 August 1964

1. A meeting was held with L-9 from 2100 hours until 0010 hours 28-29 July 1964 - car pick-up, main meeting at B's home, short meeting at L-9's apartment. No security problems.

2. L-9 reported as follows:

a. Marxist indoctrination classes at the Embassy seem to have been suspended -- there have been no such classes in recent mercha. No pressure to resume them.

12 August 1964

On 22 July L-9 attended a reception at the Polish Embassy, Sol ARGUEDAS was there and stood close by Ambassador HERNANDES thres while the Amb's wife was out in the garden with most of the other wives.

At this reception KUZNETZOV of the SovEmb told L-9 that the Russian painter who recently exhibited here (see previous 3313) had spent some 20 days waiting around in Tampico to get c. a loat for Cuba but that the authorities would not let him aboar. blamed the "imperialists" for this.

- APARICIO is schedulei to go to MERIDA on 1 August to give an address at the Institute, Returning 3 Aug. L-9 suggested that he be given "the works" as he is still very gur. shy from provious adverse publicity. (CABLE WAS SENT TO MRID ON THIS)
- d. Dr. CORREA from Toluca was at the Embasey on 22 July. Ee 18 a Panamanian citizen, a medical doctor.
- L-9 finally got the books released from the airport (see previous CR's) This helped his image as a "doer" in the Embassy. On 23 July the Amb asked Rogelio to help L-9 out on this mission. In referring to his use of L-9 to get things done, the Arb said: "One has to know how to use his pitchers in this game,"
- f. On 23 July it was discovered that some Cuban maintings which were sent to Erazil for exhibit about a year ago had been misdirected by Lorez Hnos. Custons and Shipping Agents, to lew Orleans, La. They were aboard the ship "Cabo San Roque." In L-9's absence, Camilo DONENEON decided to send word to New riesr to mark the crates with L-9's given name and second apelling and have them re-routed to Mexico. L-9 threw a fit when he found out about the use of his name (controlled anger, as usual) one reminded DOMFNFCH about the recent publicity campaign against APARICIO -- said he didn't want to find himself blasted all over the papers as the result of MOMENEOR's action. (L-9 suggested that we wight wish to impound these paintings)

- g. APRICE is planning to sponsor an exhibit of SICULIROS paintings at the esta de Las Americas, Habana. The exhibit would be made up of S paintings already in Cuba.
- on 24 July a exhibit of engravings of the Taller de Grafica
 Formar was held at the Institute at Tokyo 63. L-9 wanted to
 serve coctails at the inauguration but AFARICIO decided against
 this. L-9 remonstrated and the Amb supported him -- coctails
 were served. The Amb remarked, in support of L-9, that this is
 the way things are done in the cultural field. L-9 has noticed
 that the Amb is leaning on him more and more, less on APARICIO.
- i. There was no staff meeting on 25 July.
- j. Dra. MACHUO, who grambles more and more these days, recently remarked that FERNAMEZ Roa is not doing his share of the work (que no jala perejo).
- k. L-9, VER and others were at the airport on 26 July to meet the Cubana flight and saw the exhibition of the USN Elue Ang la flight team. A Mexican official remarked with a smile, "We held the Cubana flight up so they could see this exhibition." The Cubana crew was obviously very impressed with the blue Angels and did not make any attempt to hide its admiration for these precision flyers. VERA and the others watched carefully but were careful not to say anything in favor of the flyers.
- On 26 July a big reception was held at the Embassy, L-9 was with the Tugoslavian Amb, Horacio FLORES Sanchez, and (Inu) CICERO of the Fereign Ministry and the subject discussed was Morico's OAS position supporting CASTRO. The Yugoslavian Amb said, "The heart is one thing and the head another quite different Uning. I fail to see what Mexico has to support its position in this business of give and take." CICERO stressed the legalistic position of Merico and said that the Congress of the Union would never go along with ranctions against Cuba; that the Rio Treaty was being falsely interpreted by the other Latin American countries. He said that the OAS meeting hed been a useless exercise and that everything was now the same as it had been before the meeting. The Yugo Amb remarked that Bolivia was undecided. GICERO said that there was a possibility that Mexico might be expelled from the OAS for its stand, FLORES Sanchez remarked that he was completely in favor of the Mexican position. WEGA was hanging around, behind a pillar, trying to overhear what was being discussed by this small group,

Luis FLGUERO of the Foreign Office arrived and asked for APARICIO who was not there. L-9 says that FLGUERO is "cultured but is of no importance" in the government of Mexico.

A choral group called the "Mascarones" -- six young mem from the DMAM, led by Mariano LEYVA, sang at this affeir. One of them recited some poems by Micolas GUILLEN. The Amb told L-9 that when the group arrived they asked for L-9 by name.

m. On 27 July 1-9 represented the Embassy at a celebration of the

FORCE SINGSON VIOLATION

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Cuban Revolution held at the University of Toluca. The Rector was present. Antonio CENVANTES Tapia was in charge of the affair and speeches praising Cuba Vere delivered by Anastasio SERRANO Lopes Rogelio HERNANDEZ Miranda, Alfredo GONORA, and Alfonso CRUZ Mendoza. The band of the Escuela Tecnica Industrial Tierra y Libertad performed.

- no On 28 July APARICIO said that he felt that something unpleasant would occur when he went to Merida to speak at the Institute.

 (1-9 says he is still very afraid of adverse publicity this fear is contributing to his illness)
- 3. In view of the SWRIP report that a meeting with MRRABAL had been held at an address which coincided with that of L-9, B told L-9 he would like to pay a quick visit to L-9's apartment "just to see the place." Accordingly, shortly after midnight B entered L-9 apartment, 5 minutes after L-9 had gone in to see if the coast was clear. The apartment bore no resemblance whatever to the place described by SWPIP and, because of L-9's vocation, is quite unlike most other apartments. Furthermore it was chock full of books and other items, all very dusty, which would have drawn SWPIP's attention if he had in truth been there. There is only one door to the apartment. Because of the dust it is obvious that the furnishings could not have been moved out and book in in time to jibe with SWPIP's account. Furthermore L-9 has the only set of keys and always keeps these in his possession. Conclusions SWPIP has never been in L-9's place.
- 4. The Next meeting was scheduled for 1 Aug -- quick passage of L-9's pay. He did not appear then or on 2 Aug -- did show up 3 Aug, explaining that APARICIO had been too ill to go to Merida, hence L-9 replaced him -- returned on 3 Aug. According to L-9 the entire Embassy was in a state of euphoria as a result of Mexico's OAS stand -- he was hoping that the other three holdouts would soon break relations with Cuba. His Merida trip was uneventful and, from the Castro standpoint, successful. L-9 said that he felt rather strange reading off a speech damning the American imperialists for all the troubles besetting Cuba.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE RECORD

SUBJECT : Meeting with LITAMIE-9, 14 August

- 1. L-9 did not make his scheduled meeting on 13 Aug -- had to attend a reception at the Soviet Embassy. He showed up the next night (alternate) and a meeting was held from 2030 until 0025 hours 15 Aug -- held at B's home.
- 2. The first hour was devoted to a general discussion usual amenities and a review of 1-9's posture vis-a-vis his colleagues. He was given a few pointers on effective elicitation techniques but has very little more to learn as he is quite accomplished within the limitations of his manner of dealing with people.

3. L-9 reported as follows:

- a. Furnished address for Mauricio de la Selva -- this was turned over to Pellen next day.
- b. Euphoria resulting from Mexican position in the OAS was wiped away completely by Chile's break with Cuba.
- c. L-9 feels that Mexico may break with Cuba after DTAZ Ordaz takes over has no factual data to back this feeling up.

 As a good soldier, he would be willing to go back to Cuba hoping for a transfer elsewhere if that is what MUENRK wishes.

 (This is the first time he has faced up to this possibility squarely his attitude is promising).
- d. On 5 Aug L-2 attended an affair at the SovEmb at which the ner Military Attache, Col. SONCLOV was presented. The Polish Amb. was quite friendly with L-9 and chatted amiably until the Sov. Amb hove into view at which time the Pole clammed up. The Yujo-Salavian Ambassador showed up a few minutes later and gave L-9 a weak handshake -- usually gives him a hearty one and grabs him by the other arm. L-9 ascribes all this to the fact that the Satellite Amb's are scared by the SovAmb and are afraid to be "human" in his presence.

At this same affair an American Colonel, Military Attache, was given VIP treatment by the Sovs. When the guests were shown to the theater to see a film on Stalingrad's defense, the American was brought a tray full of hors downes and was brought a drink. After the Stalingrad film the Sovs showed one of the USSR and Fidel CASTRO appeared several times. At this point the lights went out — apparently an electrical failure — and the American Colis tray, glasses and all, went crashing to the floor. The American and his companions then departed, L-9 thought that the American had purposely dropped the tray and he thought it was a good idea.

On 6 Aug, about 1000 hours, an American named Harold CLAYTON, from Washington, D.C., appeared at the Embassy. Short stature, red

hair, about 34 years old. TAYTON said that he is a comoser and invited L-9 to join him and some friends at his local address, Calle DEL 57 No. 4 (sic), on 11 Aug at 1900 hours. (L-9 did not go) L-9 tested Chayton by remarking that he, L-9, knows Frederick FALL, an orchestra director in Washington, who owns one of L-9's pattings, having bought it some 10 years ago. CLAYTON immediately recognized the name, said he, too, knows "Fritz" FALL.

- f. On 7 Aug Dra. MACHADO was again muttering about HERNADEZ Armas what a lousy Ambassador he is, etc. She has no respect whatever for him and is increasingly open about her feelings.
- g. A staff recting was held on 8 Aug. The Amb again spoke of security neasures, saying "each one of us must avoid as much as possible trying to find out what the others do here." He called for more discretion, spoke of hidden microphones, said that Embassy personnel should not try to find out who occupies which rooms upstairs in the living quarters.
- h. On 8 Aug Ing. (fnu) GUTTERREZ, expelled member of the Newspaper Editors Union, was at the Embassy trying to see about selling Johnson brand scales to the Cuban government. He was referred to Camilo DONENECH of the Commercial office.
- i. During the afternoon of 8 Aug L-9 dined as a guest at the home of Ing. (fnu) VITERI, a former partner at the Sociedad Mexicana da Planificacion of Cuauhtemoc CARDEMAS. VITERI's address: Chicago 156, Esq. con Indianapolis, Apt. 4, Colonia Napoles. Others present were

(fnu) EONGSO, Ecuadoran refugee in Mexico with political asylee status
Otto Raul GONZALEZ
Carlos YLLESCAS
Fedro GUTLLEN, believed to be a Juatemalan

The conversation was general, all very leftist. VITEI said that he has lived and worked in the U.S.

On 7 Aug Mercr MARTINZ, Cuban woman about 25 years classed director of the Secretariat of NUMBER, left for Cuba. She had been in Mexico on vacation — a rest — staying at the hone of Dr. Fernande ARISYMADIA Yochicalco 260, Col. Marvartet She is a close friend of A's wife. Is also a friend of Norma Cabina who anted up money at the airport to pay Mercy's excess baggage charges. Mercy was very upset at the airport, had been crying because Cubana charged her about 60 dollars for excess weight. She was furious with Rogelio RODRIGUEZ and mad at the Embassy in general for not treating her properly. She told L-9 he was the only civilized person in the Embassy and said she hoped he would visit her in Cuba. He saw her to the plane, got her a good seat, and succeeded in calming her down. (L-9 now has a well placed, and well stacked, friend in MIRREX)

On 10 Aug, about 1630 hours, L=9 saw a Negro couple leaving the Consulate with two large suitcases. They went out through the Elbassy gate. The man wore glasses, the woman was a bit lighter in skin color. VEGA was with them in front of the Enbassy. L=9 says that it is most unusual to see people carrying suitcases around the Emb.

- 1. On the morning of 12 Aug when L-9 arrived at the Emb most of the staff was congregated around the porteria talking about the terrible ness of Gnile's break with Cubs. L-9 came dangerously close to breaking out in a wide grin; he managed to stifle it and went quickly up to his office.
- m. On 12 Aug L-9 went to the Soverb to celebrate the anniversary of Soviet Relations with Mexico. Dra. MACHIDO also attended and, as usual, grumbled about the Amb. In the Ambassador's car on the May home, L-9 was surprised to learn from the Amb that both JORRIN and Raul PERSIRA are expected to return to Mexico as "maintenance employees." The Amb remarked, "a lot of people just to serve a little cup of coffee now and then."
- L-9 and the Amb sneaked away for a while to visit the Italian Book Exhibition, then returned to the Sov reception, then home.
- n. On 13 August the Amb asked L-9 to be at work early -- 9 sharp.

 He and L-9 then drove to a funeral parlor where they mounted guard over the body of Isidro FAEELA for a few minutes.
- 4. L-9 reports that his relations with the Amb are excellent -- recent developments bear this out, L-9 is being leaned on more and more by the Amb now that APARICIO is sick (L-9 ascribes the illness primarily to the Station's press campaign against A). When A was unable to go to Merida, the Amb immediately chose L-9 for the job, saying that if L-9 could not go, he would go himself -- no thought of using other staff officers. To be chosen to stand guard over FARMA's body was also a singular honor of sorts. L-9 feels that the Amb may interpret the recent substitution of a known non-Communist for a known Communist as head of the Cuban National Cultural Institute the same way L-9 does -- Fidel's way of toning the Communists down. (L-9's views on this change were cabled to Urquhart at HQS on 14 Aug as he had left a query with the C/O for L-9).
- 5. INTERESTING NOTE: 1-9 volunteered, without any prompting, his belief that AMSESS-1 is not a Communist and that "down inside he is on our side." This is encouraging since AMSESS is the Station's next target for recruitment and the target studies are well under way. A cable, containing this info, was sent to HQS on 14 Aug.
- 6. L=9 was in an excellent mood at this meeting -- quite relaxed. The usual non-business topics -- art, furniture, archaeology, etc., that appeal to L=9. -- were discussed at some length.
 - 7. NEXT MEETING: 25 Aug (Tuesday) at 2030 hours, Polanco.
- 8. As usual, L=9 turned over a number of publications which will be forwarded to JNAVE.

SUBJECT : Meeting with LITAMIL-9, & August 1964

1. A meeting was held with L-9 from 2030 hours 25 Aug until 0015 hours 26 Aug at B's home.

2. L-9 reported as follows:

- a. The Embassy has a large new shield (escudo) which will probably be installed over the front gate soon. The last one there was stolen over a year ago. L-9 thinks it would be a good idea to steal this one, too. When he was reminded that police are always on duty outside the building, even late at night, he said that we could create a diversion long enough to scatch the shield which probably represents a considerable financial outlay.
- b. Dra. MACHADO is still completely fed up with the Ambassador and is determined to return to Cuba despite the Amb's having offered to her the post of Cultural Counselor while APARICIO is out sick. She told the Amb flatly, "I don't want to be &councied Cultural Counselor."
- c. APARICTO is still quite ill -- no-cne seems to know just what his trouble is, has multiple, complex symptoms (this confirms what LISICLE, who is one of A's physicians, has told us). L-9 believes that A is suffering primarily from the effects of the Station's press campaign against him.
- d. There was no staff meeting on Saturday the 15th. The Embassy is still short-handed and is having trouble manning the gate.
- Three Cubana pilots were on the plane which came in 15 Aug ARMENOLD, SEMIDEY and one other (name not known to L-9) who appeared to be a very nice and friendly person. All three were quite interested in possibilities of a break in relations between Mexico and Cuba seemed worried about this.
- f. On Sunday, 16 Aug, Dra. MACHADO, Berta PINO, Clara CARBONNFL de HERNAUDEZ, and the Spanish wife of the code clerk from Chile were at the Lagunilla market in the Embessy Cadillac -- L-9 chanced upon them. The Spanish woman greeted L-9 effusively, said she was very worried about "everything that is going on" and seemed to be quite pessimistic.
- g. On 25 Aug, about 1130 or 1200 hours, an American boy and girl (about 17 and 16 years old, resp., blend) came to the Embassy and asked if they might see it -- wanted to see the truth. They appeared to be clean-cut American kids, not the usual beatnik types; made a good impression on the Embassy staff and were taken on a tour of the building.

- h. Jaime GARCIA Terres of the Publications Department UNAM is planning to publish a manuscript by Alejo CARPENTIER. Garcia's secretary is Alicia PANDO, Tel. 48-53-38.
- 1. Two Cuban diplomate (man and wife) attached to the Cuban UN delegation went to the American Embassy with L-9 on 18 Aug to get visas. L-9 has made 4 similar visits to the America. These persons were Martin ANELLO Mediides and Josefina MARTIN Medias. While they were waiting for issuance of the visas they were seated in the IV waiting room -- full of Cuban refugees loudly damning the Castro regime. L-9 secretely enjoyed watching the two squirm uncomfortably.
- j. L-9 came across the American musician from Washington, D.C. (name unknown) mentioned in the last CR -- rank into him on the street. This man mentioned being a friend of Guillermina ERAVO.
- k. According to APARICIO's wife, Amb. HERNANDEZ Armas is expected to return to Cuba (permanently?) in September had originally planned to return in Aug 64. She told this to L-9 on 19 Aug.
- On 20 Aug a young Mexican Communist named Raul ESPEJEL was at the Embassy to borrow two films — Rogelio RODRIGUEZ authorized the loan.
- m. An American chess player named Larry EVANS was at the door of the Embassy on 21 Aug. Wilfrido CONZALEZ pointed him out to L-9 and identified him as a chess champ.
- n. No staff meeting on Saturday 22 Aug. "Pipo" FLORES, father-inlaw of Mariano GARCIA, and the courier TATO were both at the Embassy that day.
- o. On 18 Aug L-9 heard Guillerro VELA broadcasting about the arrival of Cubans from Santiago de Chile but VELA mistakenly said they were from Santiago de Cuba. VELA mentioned Ramon SINOBA S by name, branding him as a notorious Communist.
- p. On 19 Aug UREIETA told L-9 that he is worried about his son in Cuba and wants to get him a Mexican visa because the boy can't put up with things in Cuba any longer. He once carned § 350 a month with Clivetti. When the company was intervened he set up his own typewriter business. When this got going it, too, was intervened and the boy (really a ran) is now earning only § 120 monthly. He wants to get married and get out of Cuba soon. (POSSIBLY EXPLOITABLE SITUATION)
- q. A Nicaraguan named Lizandro CHAVEZ Alfaro, winner of a prize given by the Casa de Las Americas, was at the Embassy on 21 Aug looking for a copy of his own book -- he had rum out of copies. Was given one.

 r. On 21 Aug a French orchestra/director named TCRTELIER came to
 the Embassy and announced that he would like to donate 200
 dollars to the people of Cuba. He said that he had made similar
 donations after directing in Berlin, London and Paris, L-9 went
 with him to the Hotel Alameda where he was lodged and received two
 \$100 bills which he, L-9, turned over to the Anbassador. TORTELIER

- s. On the Aug Rolande LANS huiz, a Guatemalan exile, labor leader and part, was it the Privaces with another Guat named Moises Tvaristo OROZCO. RANDS was trying to get money to make recordings of his poems and to have them published. (LIFEAT/LIOMEN confirms this)
- t. On 25 Aug an American, about 10, "a bit of a bum," named
 A. W. SANDIFER, from San Antonio, Texas, was at the Embassy. He
 declared himself a political refugee and said he wanted to go to
 Cuba, L-9 interviewed him. He was ushered to the Consulate to fill
 out a visa application.
- L-9's upstairs neighbor, blond "American or Czech" type (who is of interest since SWFIF's report of a meeting held at L-9's place -- perhaps he got his numbers mixed up) is the driver of a red Dodge with plates 28-90-70. These plates are being checked out by CADOT.
- L=9 is certain that Felipe ROJAS is "working for someone else." It is clear that he helieved that ROJAS was working for us but when he was assured that this was not the case -- that it would be needless duplication -- L-9 stuck to his positive assertion that ROJAS is working for someone outside the Cuban Emb. He said it might be the Mexicans or the Soviets - there is something about the way ROJAS acts and speaks, something L-9 cannot put his finger on, that leads him to this conclusion. ROJAS respects APARICIO. His ranner is grating to L-9 -- I -9 explained that he, because of his vocation, marital status, lone-volf existence, might be suspected of less-then-manly pursuits (what L-9 was trying to say is that some people might consider him "queer") and that ROWAS had recently made a couple of remarks hinting at this in L-9's presence, L-9 answered him: "Just because I have good manners and you don't, you are careless how you speak. You had better measure your words more carefully or you will get into trouble." L-9 told B: "what I didn't tell the bastard is that I could break his head in with one punch. Like any man I am no angel but I don't go around talking about my contacts with women. If ROJAS makes one more snide remark about me I am going to clean up the floor with him." According to I-9 ROJAS used to work for Euzkadi (tire company) and was fired for causing labor troubles there. (It will be easy to check company records on him) ROJAS is poorly paid and L-9 thinks he could be recruited -- is sure he already has been. Although he does not like ROJAS he feels that we might find him useful.
- h. I-9 has noticed that the METRAP device (LIFFAT/LIGHEN) makes strange clicking sounds sounds like "chic-chic" L-9 then clicked his fingernails to imitate the sound. (He seems to suspect or to know that this device is being used). The other day he had a visitor in the office and both noticed the clicking sound phone was not in use. (REPORT TO NIARCHOS)
- feels that it is possible that Nexico will break with two after ICFEI Fateos goes out of office that LM is lacking in courage and will do nothing. I-9 feels that if the whole hemisphere breaks with Cuba the next rove would be for hemisphere nations that have relations with the USER to state: "You are holding our brother nation, Cuba, captive, Unless you free Cuba we will break relations with the USER." I-9 feels that if this situation were to naterialize the USER would quickly find some way to back out of Cuba saving face if possible but backing out any way possible rather than lose its foothold elsewhere in the 3 Jan 19 hemisphere.

1. A meeting was held with L-9 from 2000 neurs until 2350 hours on ... might of .5 July. Gar pick-up at Polanco; meeting at B's home.

- 2. L-9 was not feeling well this evening -- har less having "liver trouble" for some time and was quite evidently in some . . . n at the meeting but he said that he felt better as the evening progresses. B advised him to see a doctor sithout delay.
- 3. L-9 reported as follows after a one-hour interlude spent in examining some of B's archaeological specimens from Ecuador (L-9 enjoyed this a great deal, ecially items of artistic interest which B excavated at Puna, and the resion put him at ease and took his mind off his troubles):
 - a. At the AMCOSAD meeting of 9 July, where FOKIN GOROSTIZA spoke about the Estrada Doctrine, L-9 found himself seated beside VIIILA from the Colombian Embassy and across from 3 stern-faced Soviets. On the other side of L-9 was a man who spoke fluent Frence so L-9 introduced himself only to discover that the Fraces speaker was Cultural Attache BROWN from the therican mossey. During the conversation at the table, VII. . . . inted the British Ambassador in Habana as having opined that the US wil not make any deals with Fidel CASTRO. The Chilean - wassador to Mexico said that he thought that raiel made a terriole miwhen he declared himself a Marxist-Lenimet and that the deckof Juana C45750 Rus had done much harm to me CASTRO cause.

. o'y an American named George G. ARDS, 409 N. Soto, A. . . . 33, California, came to see L-9 to obtain some in about a Cuban novelist (L-9 forgot which novelist). SDA dr. was on his way through Mexico en route to Guatemala. Seeme . to be doing some sort of scholarly work - research.

- c. EREMAUNTZ, Rector of the University of Mich. ata., was schedulet to fly to Cuba 20 July for the 26th celebrations. On 16 July Cubana de Aviacion called the Embassy, sa. ation for EREMAUNTZ on the 20th, would schedule nim for the 22nd.
- d. APARICIO, who appears to be worried about holding his position and the is still badly shaken up about the adverse neepaper publicity he recently received (Station inspired), recently L-9 that he, L-9, should try to find some other post as a cha and said two the Cuban government would mobably arrange a transfer any time L-9 might ment one ("de " de cambiar de amu te lo arreglam en seguida") and Dra. MACha / advised L-9 to try take a vacation in Cuba.

to release eight sacks of books that had been detained at the airport for lack of a free entry permit — the Amb. told L-9 "You are the best person for this sort of job." L-9 vent out to the airport and, accompanied by (fnu) ANZURES of the Mexican Ministerio Publico, took an inventory of the books. The books were mostly classics. While going through them L-9 chanced upon four new Cuban passports, all issued on 27 May 1964 at Habana. Although it was sgainst the rules to extract anything from the mail sacks, L-9 persuaded ANZURES to let him take these passports which he then turned over to the Ambassador. They were made out to the following persons:

Also included in the mail sacks were a number of envelopes containing propaganda material destined for Argentina — magazines like Bohemia and 26th of July propaganda, ANZURES wondered aloud why the Cuban Embassy was involved in shipping propaganda to Argentina.

f. On 10 July 1-9 met three Burmese at the airport — he had en the same three men off to Habana about 3 days earlier. Or them, Captain YE GOUNG had received a message, origin not own to 1-9, telling him to communicate with telephone number 7-35 —7 in Habana. YE GOUNG said he didn't have time for this and asked that the message be relayed to Tokyo where he would take care of the matter. YE GOUNG and another Burmese, HEAZAN, "Officer or Special Duty, Ministry of Foreign Trade, Rangoon" then took off v Western Airlines (same day, 10 July) for Los Angeles. The over Burmese, KHIN MAUNO THAN, went to diami on Sunday 12 July. All had been in Habana in connection with the drawing up of a Commercial Treaty with Cuba.

Action: Check air manifests for above names.

- g. On 14 July the Ambassador issued an order prohibiting the showing outside the Embassy of any of the films which the Embassy has in stock.
- h. L-9 was surprised not to receive an invitation to the French Embassy on Bastille Day this year. He feels that it was just an eversight or that the French merely invited the Counselors and left out the Attaches. Because of his language qualifications he is usually much in demand at the French Embassy.
- 1. On 15 July a man named Victor HERNAN FZ. Mexican, representing the German firm of Siemens, was at the Embassy trying to sell a teletype system which would hook the Embassy up directly with Habana.

- J. APARICIT's now home phone is 11-57-89. He is keeing this very quiet, hoping the Americans won't hear about it and bother him with calls asking if he has jewelry for sale.
- k. On 15 July L=9 picked up the Cuban engravings, stored at the Taller de Grafica Popular, and took them to the Institute where he was to turn them over to Max ROJAS who is going to set up an exhibit there. RCJAS did not show up on schedule. L=9 thanks that ROJAS is engaged in some sort of deliberate slow-down (tortuguismo) and told B, "I think he may be one of us."
- k. Manuel VEGA returned on 15 July from a trip to Tampico. He brought greatings for L-9 from friends there. VEGA and L-9 get along very well, VEGA is very friendly.
- 1. On the July L-9 attended an exposition as the Amb's representative, at the Museo Nacional de Pedagogie. The person in charge of this museum is Profesora Dolores Uniber Torres, Multifamiliar Libertad A-1, Depto. 103, Mexico 2, D.F. On 16 July L-9 went to see her at her home. She told him at that time that she had been (past tense) a member of the Communist Party of Hexico and said that she knows Carlos Rafael RODRIGUEZ and Edith GARCIA Buchaca and other Cuban Communists very well.

Attached is a photo of her which appeared in EXCELSIOR on 12 July.

- m. On 16 July a Dr. CADENA came to the Embassy to see APARICIO. He represents, along with Dr. CANARILLO from Veracruz, the FIRST LATINAMERICAN CONGRESS OF REHABILITATION which is scheduled to take place from 6 to 12 September in Mexico City. The meeting is to be sponsored by the Latin American Medical Association of Rehabilitation, offices at Reforma y Lieja. CADENA said that he was disturbed because no reply had been received from Habana in response to an invitation sent there. APARICIO will look into this matter. CAMARILLO seems to be very friendly with Cuban officials in Veracruz.
- h. L-9 turned over a number of carbon copies of reports he has prepared for Habana and for the Ambassador. These will be filed with this CR. It is interesting to note how he reported on the recent Soviet art exhibition, which he told B he considered terrible and without any artistic merit whatever. His report to the Amba, he refers to "great and noble proportions," to "preoccupations of Soviet artists that their work reach the masses," etc., etc. A fine snow job. Judging from these reports, L-9 turns in quite a bit of paper to his government. The Ambassador, who takes the credit, finds this very satisfactory.
- 5. A short session ensued regarding L-9's cover and the "image" he projets to his confreres. Apparently he is doing an excellent job, is highly esteem and respected by his colleagues.
- 6. It was disturbing to see L-9 in pain at this meeting. He was again encouraged to seek good medical care without delay. If there were just some way to sneak this artistic soul off to see the Grand Canyon of the Colorado, the

psinted desert, the petrified forest, etc., it would probably add years to his life as his enforced association with the Embassy, which to him could be summed up by the word DRAB, must weight heavily on him. Perhaps next year for his 50th birthday it might be possible to treat him to a quick tour of some of the wonders of the imerican Southwest.

- 7. In view of the cables from Headquarters and Europe about tech sweep teams, L-9 was alerted to inform B in open code if any unusual number of couriers or unknown officials showed up at the Embassy and stayed around there.
 - 8. NEXT SCHEDULED MEETING: 28 July, Polanco.
- 9. On 21 July L-9 called for a meeting with B and was picked up near the Bookstore on Reforma Loriss. The meeting lasted from 2115 to 2220 hours in B's car. L-9 reported as follows:
 - a. Three or four couriers were in the Embassy and one told L-9 on the morning of 21 July that he was very tired because he couldn't sleep the night before. L-9 felt that this may have indicated that the man was working around the Embassy that night. (B later phoned NIARCHOS and stranged for LIOMEN not to be lit off the next day). Subsequent information revealed to the Station that these were buse fide couriers; one pair had been forced to turn back from Santia 2, Chile because of bad weather. In any event, L-9's action was well taken and he was commended for his quick work in notifying his C/O.
 - b. On 17 July Ing. (Ynu) PUENTE, whose father lives in Tampico, reported to the Embassy that the Merican Government had refused to allow local supporters of CASTRO to put on a pro-Cuban demonstration in Tampico on 26 July. According to PUENTE, Jorge CAPRION was told, "You stop any plans for action or we will clobber you."
 - c. On 17 July the "crazy" American Swimmer Fred BI-DASARE was at the Embassy again asking if there were any news from Cuba regarding his visa application. No news. APARICIO was very nice to BALDASARE; treated him like a VIP.
 - d. No Saturday staff meeting on 18 July.
 - e. On 19 July L-9 went to Texcoco to officiate at the awarding of the Jose Marti cup to local athletic champs. L-9 explained that this session was of no importance whatever "nothing but a lot of little Indians in attendance" but that since he was the only Embassy rep there he would balloon the publicity to make it look important and thus gain some credit with the Amb.
 - f. On 20 July Dra. MACHADO told L-9 that she was going to leave Mexico. She pointed to the Amb's office, said,"I can't take any more from that man in there — the only thing he is interested in is buttering up GOROSTIZA (the Foreign Minister)."
 - g. On 20 July L-9 was visiting the Taller de Grafica Popular and spied a number of folios of engravings about the Mexican Revolution that this concern published a few years ago. L-9 remembered that when they brought him a copy to look at he pretended to assume that it was a gift and proceeded to keep it, never offering to pay for it. Late on he thought that perhaps the Grafica Popular people might have chalked him up as a moother so on 20 July he offered to take six of

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the folios to the impassy to see if he could sell them. The unit price is \$ 100 but the Taller told him he could sell them for \$100 each at the Embassy. L-9 proceeded to sell all six -- even chared INTERIAN down (hard to do) and extracted 100 pesos from him. VEGA bought one but posponed payment until L-9 cornered him on 21 July. L-9 was certain that the Taller folks would think the world of him when he turned over 600 pesos to them.

- h. On 20 July L-9 attended a lecture by the Amb, at the UNAM. Sol
 ARGUEDAS was there. On the way back the Amb and Camilo DOMENECH
 commented on the recent freezing of Banco del Atlantico funds.
 (THIS WAS REPORTED TO HOS BY CARLE * INTEL) Later L-9 invited the
 Amb for coffee and the two chatted for about an hour about unimportant
 matters. L-9 feels he made points with the Amb.
- i. On 21 July a representative of the Cine Club de los Periodistas was at the Embassy looking for films to show. L-9 does not know what the outcome of this request was.
- j. On 21 July L-9 overheard APARICIO revealing his new home phone number in a telecon at the office. L-9 told B that since the secret was now out we should feel free to harrass APARICIO as we see fit on this new phone.
- k. On 21 July Lic. ANZURES of the Ministerio Publico reported that he still could not release the 8 mail sacks of books and other material being held at the airport.
- On 21 July at about 1200 hours APARICIO went to see Ambassador ALVAREZ Acosta (Mexican official with Ambassadorial rank).

10. As opposed to the L-9 of 16 July, at this meeting he was in excellent spirits and high humor. He laughed a lot and seemed not to be having any liver trouble. He suggested that it would be a wonderful idea to steal all the Cuban engravings on exhibit at the institute -- they are scheduled to go to Czechoslovakia later -- and roared with laughter contemplating the chaos that would be created by such a master stroke.

11. NEXT MEETING: 28 July, Polanco.

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12. (ADD) At the meeting of 21 July L-9 showed his C/O a letter he had just received from Teresa PROFNZA in which she informed him that she had talked over with his sister-in-law the matter L-9 and Teresa discussed in Mexico (this refers to an L-9 trip to Habana) and that the s-i-1 thought it was a great idea and hoped to see him in Cuba soon. This letter, flap unsealed, was delivered to L-9 by Manuel VEHA who, of course, read it. L-S felt that Teresa's careful wording, making the whole matter look a bit mysterious, was good in that it helped maintain the aura of mystery about him, He felt, however, that in view of the late date he would probably not get an invitation to the 26th of July celebration.

SUBJECT: Meetings with LITAMIL-9 on 23 June 1964 2 July 1964 5 July 1964 6 July 1964

A two-hour meeting was held with L-9 in B's car on the night of
 Jume. L-9 reported as follows:

- a. APARICIO is still quite jumpy as a result of the recent adverse (Station placed) publicity he received in the press in connection with the Berta ORTEGA de ARROYO case. On 12 June L-9 answered the phone when someone called up inquiring for APARICIO's home phone number -- APARICIO refused to let the number be given out until he was sure of the caller. He has not acted this way in the past; appears to be a bit "gum shy."
- b. On 12 June L-9 overheard Dra, MAGHADO talking about the dangers of doing favors for people wishing to get out of Cuba -- she said that this is a good way to land in Guanacabibes (Govt correction camp) and said that her own brother wanted her to try to get him a Mexican transit visa so he could get out but that she refused to help him.
- c. There was no staff meeting on Saturday 13 June.
- d. AMSTET-1 appears to be quite thin after his return from Merida.
- e. Federico ALVAREZ, who works in the Commercial Department, is married to a daughter of Max AUB. ALVAREZ seemed to be very excited about the impending arrival of the new Commercial Counselor -- Camilo DOMENECH. He was unusually nervous, appeared to be anxious to please his new boss. L-9 reported that ALVAREZ at one time lived in Cuta for several years.
- f. On or about 13 June a man named <u>Cleto STTLLO</u>, a Mexican cotton technician from Monterrey, visited the Embassy to see about a visa for travel to Cuba. This man has been in Cuba before.
- g. On 13 June a bushy haired Cuban exile in an old model black Euick sedan stuck his head out of his car and said a few sharp words to L=9 on the street, beginning with "You are no Cuban, you S.O.B." L=9 gave the incident no further thought. (This ties in with a report from LITHMIL=3 to Barker to the effect that a Cuban exile named ROSSELL had told him he had insulted L=9 on the street and planned to will him == ROSSELL's idea was to begin killing off the Embassy staff one at a time. L=3 told him that L=9 is a "maricon" and an artist, an ineffectual person, that killing him would be like killing a woman, and that ROSSELL should devote his attention to more dangerous people. ROSSELL agreed. Thus L=3 did a good job of protecting L=9. He also told ROSSELL that L=9 had

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been good to him, L-3, when he was hospitalized and that despite their political differences he would hate to see any harm come to L-9)

- h. On 15 June Camilo DOMENECH was throwing his weight around the Embassy and letting it be known that he was Guillermo RUIZ replacement.
- i. On 15 June Virgilio CABALLERO, who works for Horacio FLORES Sanchez at Bellas Artes was at the Embassy. He is related to Amalia CABALLERO de CASTILLO Ledon who functions as a "Cultural Aide" to President LOPEZ Mateos.
- j. On 15 June L-9 overheard someone announce that a man named Alfredo RODRIGUEZ had arrived to visit APARICIO.
- k. On 16 June a Swede who speaks some Spanish was with APARICIC.
- 1. On 16 June Feregrina ALOHSO, the Amb's secretary, was walking by L-9's office L-9 engaged her in conversation and asked her if she had decided to leave the chancery and work with him. She said, seriously, "If I return to Mexico (from Cuba) I hope it will be to work in the Cultural Section."
- m. On 16 June KUZKETSOV of the Soviet Embassy was at the Embassy, dealing with Oscar CONCEPCION, presumably about shipment of a Soviet art exhibit from Mexico to Cuba.
- n. The night of 16 June there was a small private dinner party at the Embassy. L-9 was not invited and had no more detail.
- o. On 17 June APARICIO told L-9 that "they" want to burn him (A) in Mexico -- this in reference to the recent press attack on APARICIO. (L-9 suggested that it might be a good idea to spread the story that APARICIO is living in unusual luxury in Mexico while the people of Cuba sweat in the cane fields. L-9 pointed out that APARICIO has some dining room furniture that has large, ostentatious hinges on it which are apparently silver plate but which could be called sterling silver. He also has wall to wall carpeting in his home and these carpts could metanorphose into "luxurious rugs" for propaganda purposes. They point to be made would be that APARICIO is not living as a good socialist should live and that his apparent wealth should lend credence to earlier stories to the effect that he is a sawgler. It is interesting to see L-9 showing some initiative in this matter).
- p. On 19 June L-9 saw Victor LOMELI at the airport -- heard that Juana CASTRO would be coming in the next day and would be staying about a month, visiting her sister Erna, LOMELI's wife.
- q. On 19 June L-9 overheard <u>Finilo AFRIV</u> tell APARICIO that he should be very careful in dealing with "Ruth," a tall American woman who formerly lived in Guatemala. (L-9 said that her full name and other information would be in the files since Shryock was quite interested in this woman).

- r. On 19 June 1-9 went to see Sol ARGIEDAS de De la Borbolla, at her request. The reason for the invitation was to show 1-9 the art work of an artist from Uruanan (1-9 said it was very poor work) Trinicad HENNANDEZ, a Mendean "Lider" was there as was also a writer named Prefesora Graciela A. GARCIA who was passing out copies of her new book entitled "Personalidades Celebres de America." Noting that this book has some very flattering things to say about Fidel CASTRO, 1-9 asked for an extra copy to send to Fidel. (1-9 explained that he would not mention this to the Ambassador but that Sol, who is sleeping with the Amb, undoubtedly would -- thus 1-9's connection with Fidel CASTRO would again come to the Amb's attention -- a clever move on 1-9's part) Host of the conversation at this little party had to do with Chile and the dangers there to the socialist movement.
- s. Five Cuban "tecados" came in on the Cubana flight of 20 June.
- t. The Embassy is trying to get a Mexican diplomatic carnet for Camilo DOMENECH as soon as possible -- usually encounters inexplicable delays in getting such documents from the Foreign Office. DOMENECH needs this credential to do his commercial work effectively. (L-9, who has an exagerated idea of our influence on the Mexican Government, suggested that it would be a good idea to have the credential withheld as long as possible).
- t. A reception was held at the Embassy on 22 June, primarily to honor the Mexican physicians who have travelled to Cuba to Lecture. DOMENICH was quite close to the Yugoslavian guest at this affair. Luis TANDOTA Aragon, a Guatemalan, was there as was Ing. Oscar TAMAYO.
- 2. L-9 did not appear to be his usual self at this meeting and when he was asked if anything were wrong he said that he had been suffering from liver trouble and just "didn't feel good." He seemed a bit downcast and worn out. B suggested that perhaps he should try to take a vacation, but L-9 said that he could not get any time off locally, must take his vacation in Cuta and that he would be eligible for home leave only after a 22 months absence from Cuba. B suggested that he might try to get a vacation before that time and spend it in Cuba. L-9 was a bit worried about whether he could get out again if he were to go there and said he might also be arrected and grilled. B said that as long as the Cuban Service has no proof of his complicity chances of his being held in Cuba against his will were slight. L-9 said he would think the matter over -- it appears that he had given no serious thought to going to Cuba to rest -- that he had been avoiding thought about home leave.
- 3. The next neeting was scheduled for 2 July. This meeting was held as scheduled but was limited to 35 minutes in B's car in view of B's heavy involvement in the ANSTET-1 operation at that time. L-9 was asked about the impact of Juanita CASTRO's statement to the press and said that not much had been said in the Embassy about this matter but that he expected it to be discussed at the next staff meeting. B apologised for not having L-9's June salary at hand and suggested a meeting for 6 July at which time the payment could be rade and a more leisurely meeting could be held at B's home not possible before then because of the presence of a houseguest (nonew). L-9 was obviously a bit embarrassed but finally rade it clear that he was "broke" and couldn't wait until Monday he suggested Saturday 4 July and it was finally agreed to meet on 5 July. This is the first instance of L-9's being in acute financial

straits -- he spends so much money on art books that at times he finds himself without any ready cash.

Another car meeting was held as scheduled on 5 July at which time L-9 was given his same salary. He was most despondent at this meeting weezers his uncle and best friend in this world had died on 3 July. This will a smashting blow to L-9; he and his uncle had been constant companions and had met for coffee and chatter at least three or four times a week for many years. There was not much that could be done to bring L-9 out of this de ression and no business was transacted at this meeting other than to query L-9 on the ressons for ABRET-1's departure. He did not even know that A-1 had left, had not been around the Embassy since the morning of 3 July . had not attended the Saturday morning staff meeting on 4 July. L-9 seemed particularly unhappy over the fact that his uncle had been buried in Mexico "a land for which he had no real affinity" - L-9 wants to move the body to Spain "where it belongs" as soon as the required seven years period has expired. He said that he had gone to the requier mass for his whole and had kneeled in church and dinn't care who in the Embacsy knew about it. About all that could be done at this short (35 minute) session was to express condolences and lend a friendly and sympathetic ear to L-9. It was interesting to note that L-9 had been thinking more about a possible trip to Cuba and was considering trying to get an invitation from his sister-in-law to attend the 26th of July celebration there. We had, as hoped, come around to the realization that a trip into the lion's den would enhance his situation vis-a-vis his colleagues and his government. The next meeting was laid on for 6 July.

- 5. The meeting of 6 July lasted three and a half hours and was held at B's home. L-9 reported as follows:
 - a. On 24 June L-9 saw AMSTET-1 and AMSTET told L-9 that Juanita CASTRO had arrived, L-9 said, "That woman is a real devil, isn't she," and asked AMSTET to give her his best regards if he should see her, "that is, if you think she will remember me." AMSTET said, "She remembers you."
 - b. On 24 June APARICIO was working on a report about possibilities of motica picture exchange with other countries, is especially interested in exchanging pics with Mexico. In this connection he dealt with a woman named Nancy CARDENAS and with Antonic PODRIGUEZ, Portuguese leftist writer in Mexico. Someone from the Russian Embassy advised APARICIO to be careful about trying to show propaganda films outside the Embassy, reminding him that the Sovs were not able to get Gobernacion permission to release a film on Fidel's Trip to the USSR. APARICIO also had some dealings with the Czechs and Poles on film matters.
 - c. On 19 July L-9 will go to Texcoco to present a "Jose Marti" trophy to the winning team of the Texcoco Amateur Football League, L-9 did a similar thing last year and the Texcocans have asked that he come back again this year. This is relatively unimportant but L-9 feels he can get some good publicity for himself out of it -- which will daily be reported to Cuba.
 - d. There was no Staff Meeting on Saturday 27 June.
 - e. On 29 June Dra. Esther CHAPA brought L-9 two copies of <u>Mujeres</u> magazine (Nos. 133 and 134) in which she had articles on education in Cuba. (L-9 gave copies of these to B)

- for On 29 June APARICIO received a call from AMOSAC reparding a coming meeting of the directors of this outfit, APARICIO said, "If it is to be held at the home of an American, I will not attend."
- g. APARICID likes to get his shoes shined in the office -- seems to make him feel important. A Mexican shoe shine man goes into the Embassy every dry about 0930 or 1000 hours. (L-9 suggested that this may be exploitable).
- h. On 29 June rector EREMAUNTZ of the University of Morelia was with APARICIO. Later the same day the Ambassador gave L-9 a copy of a new book (a Communist-line Short History of the World) published in Morelia and written by a Juan EROM, L-9 feels that EREMAUNTZ probably brought this book in.
- i. At about 1000 hours 29 June L-9 got a call from JORRIN at the main gate needed someone to speak English. L-9 went to the gate and found two men, one woman, and a child with JORRIN all were ANERICANS. One of the men GREGORISM, said, "I want to speak with you alone." L-9 tried to get hold of Rogelio RCDRIGUEZ, was informed he was out, so took the two American men to the Consulate to see Vice Consul Wilfrido CONZALEZ. L-9 stood by to interpret as the Americans spoke no Spanish, GONZALEZ speaks no English. The conversation went more or less as follows:

HENDERSON: I am a Captain, an officer of the intelligence service, stationed at Cape Kennedy. I am a Communist.

ONZALEZ: How can that be? A Communist at Cape Kennedy?

H: We are many. How can I contact the Communist Party people here in Maxico?

L-9: (Suspiciously) If you are a Communist, you should darn well know how to contact other Communists.

H: How can we get to Acapulco? If we head for Cuba in a beat can we get to Cuban territorial waters without being attacked?

L-9: Who knows?

H: There are lots of Communists in Bolivia -- about half the population.

L-9: I am just a simple attache.

H: I munt to meet the intelligence officer here.

L=9: (To G) Aha! He wants to find out who the intelligence officer is here.

At this point HENDERSON kept insisting that he manted to talk to an intel officer. CONZALEZ asked him and his silent partner to put their manes and addresses down. L-9 noted that the Captain was named HENDERSON. The other, who was called Lieutenant, also gave his name but L-9 did not get it. HENDERSON said that he and the

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Lt. must get to Cuba, that they have been persecuted and have been moving around South America, changing hotels constantly.

L-9 described Capt. HANDERSON as tall, thin, young, shout 28 years old, not very well aducated, "athletic" rather than intellectual, very nervous, white, light brown hair.

The Lt. was described as tall, scritto, about 28, more cultured, more observant, quiet, nervous.

The two left after about ten minutes. Have not been seen since. Wife and child of HENDERSON waited with JORRIN while the two men were inside the Consulate.

- j. On 30 June CARALLERO, visiting Cuban UNESCO official, planning to return to Cuba on 6 July, told L-9 that he and his associate, CONZALEZ Drets, had brought a box of fine Cuban cigars with them to present to some important contact in Moxico. They rade the presentation and when the recipient opened the box he found that it was empty. This tale sent L-9 into paroxims of laughter.
- k. On the night of 29 June "El Gordo" HARG arrived from Chile and immediately asked to speak to DONENECH. It was not until the following day that the two got together.
- DOMENECH told L-9 that he had once owned a printed fabric plant in Guanabacca.
- m. L-9 saw the Ambassador briefly on the norning of 30 June and asked him what he thought of Juanita Castro's statement to the press. The amb called her a "desvergonzadita" (shameless little thing) and said he knew about her plans the night before.
- n. On 30 June APARICIO told L-9 that Juanita's statements were very damaging.
- o. On 30 June the Amb got back the U.S. tax which had been paid on the new Galarie Ford which is in his rame. The commercial section is interested in buying a new Ford and is dickering with Paniagua of Ford Motor Co. (L-9 wonders why we don't stop this trade).
- p. On 1 July APARICIO told L-9 that the Mordoan Government would probably find some way to get Juanita CASTRO out of Mexico that the GOM would not want that "bechive" around here.
- q. On 1 July the Arb asked L-9 to accompany him to an exposition at the UNAM -- senetheng to do with statistics of University management and functions -- and the Amb asked L-9 what he thought of Junna CASTRO's statements and what he knew about her. L-9 said he had not her, knew little about her, had been rather ill lately and hadn't paid much attention to what she said to the press.
- r. On 1 July L-9 went to an exposition at INEA of the works of Michaelangelo photographic reproductions. He met Giovanni della Pozza, Cultural Counselor of the Italian Embassy, there and tolked to him about possibilities of a cultural exchange between Cuba and Itafly. The Italian was quite interested. L-9 reported back to the Amb on this and will play along with it in order to keep his name

on the "active" list. He may be able to talk the Italian into making a trip to Cuba.

- s. On 2 July APARION had trouble with the look on the door of his home -- had to may a looksmith 80 perces to get in.
- t. On 2 July APARIOUS completed a long-overdue inventory of the furnishings of his home most of these belong to the Cuban government.
- u. On 2 July L-9 and others sent photos to Cuba (gave then to Berta PINO de Machado) to be affixed to new carnets laboral which are to be issued to all Cuban officials abroad.
- v. In discussing his plans to halfing the property dedicate a new Orden library at Tampico on the 26th of July, L-9 sensed that AFARICIO was moving in on him and trying to set himself up for this "honor." L-9, who is now thinking in terms of going to Cuba at this time, thinks it would be nice for APARICIO to be stuck in Tampico while he is back in the homeland.
- W. L=9 was accompanied to a velorio at the home of his uncle by VEGA, Ferta FIND, and JURRIN. Although they did not know his uncle they went along out of respect for L=9.
- x. Teresa PROENTA finally left Mexico via Cubana on 6 July. At the airport L-9 gave her an envelope with clippings about his uncle's death, to give to L-9's sister-in-law. He also asked Teresa to ask the s-i-l if she could swing a trip to Habana for L-9 for the celebrations of the 25th.

U. The matter of a trip to Habana was discussed in some detail. As with his last trip L-9 said he would not take in any S/W materials or attempt to report to his C/O while inside but that he would, naturally, keep his eyes and ears open and report fully after ocning out. B told him that it was quite likely that at some time during his visit, should it materialize, he would be subjected to some sort of security interview - this because of his extended absence, because of his scretime acquaintance with Juanita CASTRO, and because he is well known as non-Communist and rather bourgeois in his living habits. He agreed that some grilling might take place. He was told that he might be the subject of a provocative approach; along the lines of "We know you are working with the Americans, you had better confess all before you get hurt," and that as long as he was prepared for such an approach he need not fear that he will be caught since no proof of his collaboration is in the hands of the opposition, He said that he was quite sure that he could resist such an approach and thanked B for having taken such care in protecting him from compromise. L-9's rain reason for wishing to go to Cuba is to see his aged father; a secondary reason is to enhance his position in the Erbassy and to prove to the CASTRO government, by going back, that he has nothing to hide.

7. L-9's financial situation was probed in some detail. He said that he recently voluntarily, and at his own initiative, gave up about 5% of the stock in the business venture his brother and. have in Guadalajara—that he formerly held 16% of the stock but since he was not working in the business and had made no investment in it since its initial capitalization, he felt it was immoral for him to hold as much stock as ——therefore he surrendered half of his holdings to—While this may seem fooligh from a business standpoint, it is true to L-9's deep scated Spanish "pundomor."
The business, while prospering, has paid no dividends since all profit is plowed

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back into it to foment growth. It is now worth from 500,000 to 1 million pesos and seems destined to get much bigger. As for his pay — from the Probasy and from NUBARA — he spends a lot of mods (cats out most of the time), taxis, etc; but his largest expense is in buying art books of which he has a large collection representing a heavy investment in posss. It is not unusual for him to spend 800 pesos for one book; he realizes this is a lot of money but says that when he is old and gray he will have one of the finest art libraries extant. He was cautioned to refrain from any estentation that would lead to suspicion that he had two sources of income and quickly pointed out that he is well aurre of the necessity to cover his extra income and that he also spends a lot of money conding things to people in Cuba — these he sends by different couriers — modicines for his father, presents for his brother and sister-in-law, car parts for relatives, etc. The matter was pursued at some length and the C/O came to the conclusion that L-9 is very careful with his money and the spending thereof. He was advised to request a salary advance from the Probasy from time to time and said that necessity alone had obliged him to do this several times and that he now has a 2,000 plus peso bill outstanding with one book store.

- 8. L-9 remarked that he has a lady friend whom he sees every Saturday and that even with her he is very careful to make it appear that he is not affluent.
- 9. The loss of L-9's uncle will probably affect him decoly for a long time as he put it, he now feels a tremendous vacuum which his uncle used to fill.

 Any change, such as a vacation in Cuba or elsewhere, will probably do him a lot of good.

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

SUBJECT: Moetings with LITAMEL-9, 11-12 June

1. LITAMIL-9 was picked up by B at 2000 hours 11 June, announced that he would have to brook away soon to attend a neeting at the Cuban-Maxican Cultural Institute (about medicine in Cuba) but could meet B after the meeting. He was dropped off at 2020 hours and picked up again in Colonia Annuard at 2330 hours. The meeting lasted until 0230 hours 12 June. No security problems noted.

2. L-9 reported as follows:

- a. Sixto CHAIN Soler -- remarks made by this man in addressing the Embassy staff meeting of 3 June were cabled to Headquarters. MENI 9068 of 12 June.
- . b. Sol ARGUIDAS, the Ambassador's girl friend, was in the Embassy on 3 June wearing slacks. L-9 feels that exploitation of this affair would be a "golpe transho" and suggested that every effort be made to get a photo of the two in a compromising situation so that it could be printed in leaflet form and spread around the city. (L-9 tends to over-rate our capability in the technical field feels that we have cameras, microphones, etc., in every room in the city)

SUBJECT : Neeting with LITAMIN-9, 1 June

1. A 3-and-a-half hour meeting was held with L-9 at B's home on the night of 1 June.

2. L-9 reported as follows:

- a. A weekly staff meeting was held the previous Saturday, 30 May -- the first in over a month.
- At the Staff meeting the Ambessador preised Aparicio for having been elected as "Vocal - Zona del Caribe" at a recent AMOOSAC meeting. (L-9 said that these AMOOSAC meetings are a farce, great numbers of Nicaraguans, Cubana, etc., turn out and pretend they are important while most of the diplomats in town who really deserve the title stay at home or do something worthwhile). The Ambassador told those at the staff meeting that Aparicio's election was a great honor for Cuba but that he felt that an apology to the Embassy staff was in order since the staff as a body should have met before Aparicic accepted the nomination since this is the democratic way of doing things -- the socialist way. "After all, " said the Ambassador, "let us suppose Aparicio were to be sent to some other Embassy in two months, then Cuba would lose this important AMCOSAC position." (L-9 found in this remark a faint hint that Aparicio might be headed somethere else)
- The Ambassador praised the Cultural Department for its fine work and told of a letter which had been received from the Casa de las Americas telling of the good work of the Cultural Department. Aparicio began to brag about all he had done and took all the credit so L-9, feigning anger, spoke up and remarked that he had done his chare then began to enumerate his contributions and took Aparicio to task for hogging the limelight. (L-9 explained that he finds it a good idea to bark like this now and then and then retreat back into his shall and be "manso" until time to assert himself again).
- d. Aparicio, speaking of Manuel Ray and his threat to take the warpath against Castro, said that of all the Gusano leaders Ray was the most dangerous since he knows Castro so well and has had so much experience in clardestine activity.

- L-9 suggested that some sort of celebration of the 26th of July should be undertaken by the Cultural department, perhaps at Guanajuato. This idea was well received, L-9 will be the ramrod.
- f. After the staff meeting the Ambassador took L-9 aside and told him again (see below) that he meant no slight to L-9

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in not having invited him to the small celebration held at the Embassy on the night of 21 May. He explained that this reception had been for the Russian violinist wife of Mexican newspaperman Laguna, was a very small affair. (Aparicio was not invited, either). See last CR re susical evening.

- g. Plans are underway to invite the famous Cuban Aragon Orchestra
 to Mexico for a locally stint. Rafael MUNCIA Carballo, Mexican
 impreserie at San duan de Letran 12-3, tel 13-15-67, and
 Felix M. CERVANTES of the flanquita theater are working on this
 scheme. They hope to guarantee the orchestra 5,000 dollars a
 week for I weeks. Some concern has been voiced lest the present
 day orchestra not be equal in quality to the famous Aragon
 group since many might have fled Cuba in recent years.
- h. Leopoldo AYALA of the magafine Mestre recently visited Aparicle and informed him that Jose MORA Rodriguest of "Ediciones del Puente," Cuban publishing house, wants to come to Mexico.
- The new Ford Galaxie has arrived. Black, b-door sedan, beige interior. DIP plate # 36 D.
- j. Aparicio is shaken up by the publicity given to the jailing of Berta ORTEGA de ARROYO, the Mexican ballet dancer. (More below)
- Real PEREIRA told L=9 on 25 May that he was going to spend the evening with FLORES Sanches of INBA and someone named Jesus ORTIZ. L=9 does not know ORTIZ. He finds it strange that FLORES Sanches, who holds a somewhat important position, should consort with PERSIRA, a waiter at the Embassy. He feels this confirms suspicion that PEREIRA is a homosexual since FLORES S. definitely is.
- 1. The dip courier "Tata" who went to Cuba 1 June once again reminded L-9 of the request from the minimum and Orlando SANCHEZ for copies of SIEPRE magazine bearing a Khrushchev-Kennedy cover. L-9 told Tata he had already sent two copies of the magazine to SANCHEZ. (See last CR. L-9 said that SANTHEZ! interest was in the cover, not anything inside the magazine).
- m. Lic. OSORNO of the Merican Foreign Ministry informed the Embassy on 25 May that the Merican Government will only allow 1 or 2 copies each from the ton of books at Veracruz to be delivered to the Embassy (See last CR). OSORNO said these were definite orders and that the remainder of the shipment could not be cleared. The Ambassador was quite upset by this news and said he would try to arrange things through someone on a higher level than OSORNO.
- n. On 25 May the Ambassador apologized in a very courteous manner for not having invited L-9 to the reception of 21 May (see item f. above).
- On 25 May L-9 overheard Peregrims say that she might be in Cuba by July.
- p. On 26 May Dra. Esther CHAPA visited Aparicio -- A not in, spoke with L-9. Asked for material on Cuba. Said she had been asked

by Marcelina GALINDO, "directora" of the magazine Majeres to do an article on education in Cuba.

- q. Besta PINO Machado showed L-9 a strange letter from someone named Peter (inu) of La Crosse, Wisconsin, addressed to Lucilla Rodriguez, apparently in care of the imbassy. It was written on stationery of the Hotel Alameda, Mexico City. The tone of the letter made it appear that Peter is desented. (L-9 had nothing further to add to this, only saw the letter briefly).
- r. A new cook has arrived from Cuba and on 26 May he had the kitchen full of all sorts of good things to eat. The cook made the usual Socialist remarks about how much he hated to leave Cuba but L-9 was not convinced. L-9 will get name.
- s. Aparicio told L-9 he thinks it might be better to refrain from using the term Cultural Department, that this tends to set the cultural group apart from the rest of the Embassy. However, he made it clear that he wants his name on all correspondence pertaining to cultural matters.
- t. The Japanese guitarrist mentioned in the last CR, a man named NAKABAYASHI, left for Cuba 1 June, L-9 rad thought that he had gone to Madrid earlier. He plans to go to Spain afetr visiting Cuba.
- u. On 25 May CABALIERO of the Pletic Arts Department of INBA came to see L-9 and said he was going to quit his job. He is "protegido de" FLORES Sanchez and feels that they will not fare well when the new presidential administration takes over. Wants to go to Cuba to teach school.
- v. At the staff meeting of 30 May INTERIAN was watching Aparicio very carefully but, as usual, said nothing.
- 3. L-9 was asked about Buenaventura REYES (renewed interest since LIMED reveals his father lives in Puerto Rico) and said that he is a nice kid. Respectful, likeable. Well connected with everyone in the Embassy. He is from Orients -- perhaps Guantanamo or Baracoa, L-9 not sure. L-9 says that he may be one of the group of young favorites of the present Cuban Ambassador to Moscow who is from Orients and has a lot of "protegidee" who are negroes and mulattos. L-9, adving the reason for the inquiry, said that REYES would make an excellent acquisition.

h. L-9 reported at some length on a group called the TOVINIENTO CULTURAL MEXICANO which is getting cory with the Embassy. The Vice President is Rafael AGUILAR Q. He recently came to see L-9 and said that the group is planning to hold a II Festival de Cultura on 26 July -- chose the date because of sympathy with the Cuban Revolution. The suditorium of the Mexican Electrical Workers Union has been made available for this festival and the group is trying to get the artistic cooperation of the Instituto-Mexicano Czecho. AGUILAR was president of the Student body at the National Preparatory School No. 3 in the period 1961-1962. He was at the same time Secretary General of the Student Committee in Defense of the Cuban Revolution. In the last elections he was general representative of the PPS in the district of Colonia Claveria and Colonia Petrolera -- these were elections of deputies. The group is identified with the PPS, FEP, Min, and PCM, but remains "politically independent" to avoid trouble with the PRI. The group has connections with the Director

of the newspaper El Liberal Poblan, who is their representative in Puebla. There are from 50 to 70 active manbers in DF, Puebla, Zacateoas, Guerrero, and Veracruz. The group has good connections with the Institute Macienal de la Juventud Mexicana whose sub-director gives them 200 pesos monthly to help underwrite the cost of publishing the newspaper PDVDMENTO, The Grand Lodge of the Valley of Mexico, through Grand Master Lic, Antonic ROBRIGUEZ Gordon, also gives the group 200 pesos a month for the same purpose. L=7 had several copies of the paper but had to send them to Cuba along with a report — the above into is from his draft of the report. Barker examined some of the copies of MOVIDMENTO — Communist line propaganda.

5. L-9 was asked for information on Aparicio — anything that might be exploited to advantage in tying Aparicio in with the fate of poor Berta Ortega de Arroyo. He said that A's wife, Raquel, is much addicted to bracelets and showy jewelry and that perhaps something might be made of this. (Details of the plan to "do in" Aparicio were not gone over with L-9 but he was probably able to tell from the questions posed that something was afoot.) L-9 said that Aparicio was in very poor health and wouldn't stand too much pumishment. B replied that if it would do the cause any good he would clobber Aparicio while he lay on his death bed, L-9 reiterated that Aparicio is very sensitive to the Berta Ortega issue and that any mention of it was likely to cause him to throw a fit.

- 6. L-9 reported that he had gone to a dentist recently to have a series of toothaches checked on -- the dentist told him his problem was nervous, not dental -- he is elenching his teeth too hard, this is causing toothache and headache. The dentist told him to stop worrying about whatever was worrying him and his troubles would cease.
- 7. L-9 asked if his information was of value said he was afraid much of it was only of marginal interest. He was assured that just having a pair of eyes and ears inside the Embassy was of inestimable value and that many of the seemingly insignificant items he reported became quite significant when pieced together with information from other sources. It was clear that he felt that this meeting's haul had not been worth much and B had to pump him up a bit.
- 8. L-9 showed B a letter he had received from his sister-in-law, thanking him for the many things he has sent to her and to other relatives there. It was delivered by a Cubana pilot to VENA who gave it, unsealed, to L-9, L-9 feels that it was fortunate that the envelope was not sealed since VENA surely read it and L-9's good connection in Cuba was again brought out.

1. A four-hour meeting was held with L-9 at B's home on the night of 22 May. Car pick-up, Mrs. 3 handling the gate, no security problems noted.

2. L-9 reported as follows:

a. On 12 May L=9 went with APARICIO to the UNAN where they visited a Srta. (fnu) PERDOND who is the Maxican representative of the Union de Universidades Latinoamericanos. Miss PERDONO complained that Cuba's three universities (Las Villas, Oriente, and Habana) have not paid in their quotas to the Union. Las Villas and Oriente are almost up-to-date but the Univ. of Habana cwes about 2,500 dollars and "this does not look good." The only other country in arrears is Brazil. There will be a convention of "executives de la Union" in July.

L-9 suggested that B see to it that Brazil pays up so that Cuba will stand out as the only dead beat in the hemisphere.

- b. The visiting book publishers have been holding meetings at the Hotel Maria Isabel. (see last CR).
- c. Isa CARIBALLO, a senator in Cuba during the time of Batista and now a political exile in Mexico, has been trying to talk L-9 into coming to see her sometime. He does not know what is behind this.
- d. L-9 saw LITAMIL-3 twice recently near the Embassy, each time at about 0915 hours. L-3 gave him a low wave as a sign of recognition but did not try to converse with him.
- e. One of the Cubana stewardesses appears to be of Chinese or Japanese extraction. She recently told L-9 that one of the two men at the airport who photograph incoming Cubana passengers (a blondish man) has been pinching her and otherwise bothering her -- she plans to slap him the next time he tries this even if an international incident occurs.

When L-9 visited Cuba last year, Orlando Silvers brother of Celia SANCHEZ, Fidel's secretary, asked L-9 to get for him a copy or two of the 1962 edition of SIEMPRS magazine which had a cover cartoon depicting Kruschev and Kenneiv arguing while Fidel walks away with a beautiful Cuban babe labeled Revolucion. When Oscar CONCEPCION arrived from Cuba after his most recent visit he reminded L-9 of this request — had seen Orlando in Habana. Accordingly, L-9 went to the SIEMPRZ offices and obtained 3 copies — sent two to Orlando and gave the other to Barker. This is issue Number 493 of 5 Dec 1962. L-9 thinks

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it significant that SANCHEZ should be so interested in having copies of this cover which is in essence anti-Kurushchev. L-9 feels that Celia and her brother Orlando are not Communicus and not pro-Soviet.

- h. Dr. COSIO Villegas is scheduled to go to Cuba on 22 May. Wort.

- 1. A three and a half hour meeting was held with L-9 on the night of 6 May at B's home, B's wife handling the gate, car pick-up, no security problems.
- 2. The first hour was devoted to a non-operational discussion, mostly about art but touching on rany other topics. It was interesting to note that L-9 revealed rather strong racial prejudice. As an illustration he referred to ANSTET-1, saying that he is a fine looking specimen, but that his daughters are rather sorry looking creatures which, according to L-9, is what one must always expect as when one crosses two thoroughbred dogs of different breeds.
 - 3. L-9 reported as follows:
 - a. Nilda RUIZ passed to him a card on which she had taken some notes as a result of a conversation with an American who visited the Embassy and talked with her. This man would like to have Castro propaganda material mailed to him. His name is Larry VEIGON. Address KHENING EMEKKANIMMENTAL until June will

- The new American Cultural Attache visited the Cuban Embassy recently. He asked to see the Cultural Counselor and APARICIO met him in the chancery instead of his usual office -- more class. After exchanging a few words, the American (Dr. BROWN) said, "But, you're not the Russian Cultural Attache, are you?" APARICIO said, "No, you are in the Cuban Embassy." The American then explained that his car had dropped him off at the wrong Embassy and left for the Soviet Embassy. As he was leaving he said, "Que comedia es la vida;" and offered to take copies of books he has written to APARICIO. L-9 heard about the incident soon afterward and at a gathering at the Soviet Embassy on 21 March (1930 hours) everyone had a good laugh about it.
- s. Referring to the above incident, APARICIO told L-9 about another incident that recently happened in Indonesia. This involved a Cuban diplomat who was recently here in Mexico en route to Habana he ray be the Ambassador to Indonesia, L-9 not sure. According to this man he had happened upon the American Ambassador and President Sukarno when they were seated at a restaurant in Djakarta Sukarno spoke to him, introduced the American, and asked the Cuban

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to join them. The Cuban refused to even acknowledge the American's presence, turned away inspectly, and left the area. When he was telling this to APARICIO he was obviously quite proud of himself. When APARICIO told L-9 about it he said that the Cuban diplomat had acted stupicly — that one must always be polite, even in the presence of an American.

- d. On 24 April the Polish Ballet leader CORCHDUSKY (phonetic) and the widow of Enrique CABRERA, Josefina CABRERA, visited the Embassy.
- e. On 22 April at 1330 hours a Peruvian citizen named Guillernina VIDAL, accompanied by the Movican Joel MARROUTH (an adherent of LOUBARDO Toledano) were at the Embassy. MARROUTH was angry with APARICIO. VIDAL has since gone to Habana where she was to attend the May Day celebrations.
- f. On 22 April a man with a goatee, apparently a Mexican, hung around the Embassy gate all day asking for political asylum and saying that he was being persecuted. He was not admitted.
- g. The other day APARICIO and L-9 were looking around for a letter which had been sent to L-9 -- had to do with a Mexican Book exhibition. L-9 asked Dra. MACHADO about it, saying he was certain that it had been received at the Embassy since it had been receipted for at the gate -- Dra. MACHADO pointed to LITAMIL-7 who was looking the other way and whispered to L-9 that if it had been stolen L-7 probab/ly lifted it. L-9 says that Dra. MACHADO is not inclined to trust anyone.
- h. L-9 talked with a Soviet diplomat (name unknown) at the party at the Soviet Embassy on 21 April and this man said that the USSR was very pleased with the policies of Adolfo LOPEZ Maters.
- he fired filter of the Montreal Soccer team (see last CR) told L-9 before the group left for liabana that two replacements had arrived and that four team numbers would not be able to go on to Cuba because their passports did not authorize such travel. He told L-9 that the hotel bill for the team in Mexico (to be paid by the Cuban Embassy) amounted to some 15,000 peros.
- j. About 24 April at the airport Oscar CONCEPCION came in on Cubana and seemed quite upset that no-one had come to meet him, acted as though he was carrying something important and needed an escort.
 L-9 was busy seeing someone else off and VEGA, who appeared on the scene, said he couldn't take CONCEPCION into town.
- At the airport same day (2h April) Jorge ROJAS of Cubana said that (fnu) MIRANI, whom he described as the "Consul de los Gusanos" tried to get to the plane to hand over something for the Netherlands Embassy but ROJAS wouldn't let him deliver the material. ROJAS told L-9, "Now that things are tough for us, people like this think we are going to be nice to them to protect ourselves in the future -- not me, I am a good revolutionist." VEGA and HAMIJA GARCIA Romero of Cubana were also present when ROJAS spoke out against MITRANI.

- 1. On 20 April a man named Jose SRITO tried to phone the Ambassador to talk about possible sale of Italian loco-notives. The Ambassador said the call should be switched to RUIZ.
- m. Just before Oscar CONCEPCION left he was supposed to turn in his Foreign Office credential but he told LITAMIL-7, "Don't count me out yet." (No ne de de baja) and spoke as though he might well be returning to Moxico
- n. Because APARICIO was sick (with the mumps!) L-9 went to the airport on 2 May to receive Dr. Pedro PAEZA who had arrived trom-Habana to attend a medical conference in Mexico City.— BAEZA said that Dr. (fnu) ALONSO had not come because he had not been able to get a visa; (Cuban exit -- or Mexican entry -- didn't specify). BAEZA said that the captain of the Cubana airliner on which he had flown to Mexico, one (fnu) ARMENGOL had been offered 25,000 dollars a year and six months vacation if he would fly a Brittania for a Canadian company -- this offer was made in Canada. ARMENGOL refused. According to BAEZA, ARMENGOL, his wife, and other relatives, are all good revolutionaries.
- o. Capt. ARMENGOL kept close watch on the Cubana plane and would not let anyone take newspapers off it. A couple of Mexican cope who hang around the airport and take papers from all incoming Cubana flights were upset about this and remonstrated with ARMENGOI but didn't get anywhere.

- P. BAEZA said that the Brazilian revolt had been a serious blow to Cubs. He said that when he was recently in Chile with some other physicians he had a chance to speak with the wife of the laftist presidential candidate LLTDE. Speaking of the Chilean situation, BAEZA said it too was serious since ALLENDE was almost certain to win the elections and this would be followed by a counterrevolutio coup led by the military ("gorilazo") -- but, all was not lost since Chile has 5,000 kilometers of coastline where arms can be introduced clandestinely.
- q. BAEZA said that he had recently talked with "Che" GUEVARA and that Che told him that even if Cuba were left to fight the U.S. alone -- if Russian help were not available -- it would cost the U.S. 100,000 dead to take Cuba.
- r. Learning of APARICIO's mumps, BAEZA said that there is an epidemic of mumps in Cuba at the present time.
- s. BAEZA is staying at the Hotel del Valle.
 - There is some sort of Intercontinental Book Fair or Exhibit going on in Mexico. APARICIO was sure he could get Cuban representation and was dealing with Leonoldo FA on the matter. He worked up a big head of steam and made arrangements with Cuba to send books for the fair at the last minute APARICIO was informed that the rules of the fair specifically excluded islands meaning Cuba. When APARICIO argued against this he was told that even Puerto Rico was affected, unable to participate. L-9, upon hearing this news, and in view of APARICIO's efforts to make himself look

good in the ever of the Ambassador by getting Cuban representation in the fair, couldn't contain himself and began to laugh out loud. Felipe ROJAD then joined in and finally even APARICIO began to laugh about it, saying: "Estamos luchando contra el imperialismo, no con el cocinero."

L-9 has rum into a snag in his arrangements to purchase a new Ford Galaxie for the Cuban Embassy. He recently went to see Sr. Paniagua who heads diplomatic sales for Ford — to give him the second and final payment for the car. Paniagua asked him how he was going to pick up the car since it would be delivered in Laredo, Texas. L-9 said he und instood it would be delivered in Nuevo Laredo, Mexico. Paniagua then produced the sales centract and, sure enough, in the small print but in caps it was clearly set forth that all deliveries would be made in Laredo, Texas. L-9 explained that the Cubans couldn't cross into the States to take delivery. Paniagua: "Why not, the Russians do." L-9:"But the Russians have diplomatic relations with the US, we don't." Paniagua: "Well, you are more or less like the Russians!"

L-9 took the matter up with the Ambassador and some thoughtwas given to having a Cuban UN rep take the car across the line but it was recalled that these reps do not have freedom of movement outside the New York area.

B told L-9 that a customs agent at the border could handle the matter -- one of the Mexicans who make a living handling imports. (Only gave him this hint to get him out of hot water with the Ambassador).

- x, At the Hotel Agnes there is a Cuban woman who is the sister of a Cuban university student leader -- surname is REBEILLON. She came to Mexico to attend a seminar on school construction in Latin America.
- y. On h May an Uniquayan student, coming from the United States, named Fernando COMEZ Fyns, visited the Embassy for a visa. He is staying at the Hotel Nueva Estachen. I-9 felt that it was significant that this student's Uniquayan passport was being held by VEGA on 6 May at which time VEGA and Dra. MACHADO were discussing GOMEZ. GOMEZ, who is blond, returned to the Embassy on 6 May.
- 2. On 4 May a Mexican type named (fnu) MARTINEZ Ortega came to the Embassy to see about going to Cuba. He said he had been a friend of Enrique CABRERA (deceased). He was there about 1145 hours.
- aa. L-9 ran into a courier he knows only as Enio (lnu) -- asked him if he came alone. Enio said that the other courier (fnu) SALGADO didn!t make the trip because he couldn't get a visa at Jamaica.)

SUBJECT: Meeting with LITAMIL-9, 10 March 1964

1. A two-and-a-half hour necting with L-9 was held at B's home on the night of 10 March. L-9 was in excellent spirits, showed none of his usual depression. It developed that he feels extra secure in the C/O's home because the C/O has diplomatic immunity and no-one is likely to walk in -- he does not feel such security at the safehouse. Since there is nothing to be gained by battling L-9 over this matter, the safehouse will be used for PEGRIP-1 and future meetings with L-9 will be held at 3's home or in B's car. A solid gate will be substituted for the iron grating now barring B's driveway for added security.

2. L-9 reported on the following:

a. L-9 attended the baptism party for Antonio GARCIA Lara's new son — held at "Fofo" SUTIERREZ! home on Friday 6 March. Among those present were Mico and wife, Onclio del Pino, wife and 2 children, Emma Castro, the wife of Raul Aparicio, Nico's mother—in—law, Orquidia and Fofo; a Guban and Mexican woman from the house on Aratole France where L-9 and Mico paid a call during Christmas week, the wife of Fernandez-Roa, Guillermo and Milda Ruiz, the wife of Ambassador Hernandez-Armas and Victor Lomeli (Emma's husband). According to L-9 there was "not a hint of Communism" at this affair and, with the possible exception of Gmo. Ruiz, no Communists present. The new baby was baptized Samilo in Church, L-9 re-iterated his belief that Nico is not a Communist.

8. Raul APARICIO gave a party at his home on Sunday night — and
seemed to be quite pleased with himself for having lured the famous
Rumanian orchestra conductor CELENDACHE to his place — C is residing

"Raulito" ROA, son of the FOMIN, and Ambassador of Cuba in Brazil

He said that in the old fays this one plant used to bring in a profit of 4,500 to 5000 dollars a month — the other plant in Habana used to be a profitable enterprise, too. L-9 said that his father built this business up from scratch and L-9 seethes with indignation when he is forced to face the fact that his Dad is now considered by the regime to have been an exploiter of the masses. L-9 said that when he last visited the Matanzas plant the old-time employees openly wept and told him-how much they wished for the "good old days"—they went out of their way to do him little favors, such as bringing him coffee, finding him a comfortable chair, etc. L-9 told B: "I am a stubborn man and someday I am going to reclaim this business."

- 5. About an hour was spent on small talk -- B showed L-9 some Chinese objets d'art, consulted with him about furniture styles, etc -- the sort of conversation that interests L-9 and puts him at ease.
- 6. L-9 was presented with the book on Arshile Gorky so quickly obtained and pouched by Headquarters -- he was highly pleased and effusive in thanks.
- 7. L-9 gave B a photo taken at a recent exhibition of Polish poster art and a clipping of the same from Excelsior in the photo (attached to original of this CR) L-9 is with the Soviet, Czech and Polish Ambassadors.

SUBJECT : Meeting with LITAMIL-9, 20 March 1964

1. A meeting was held with L-9 in B's car from 2000 until 2220 hours 20 March in the Lones area. No security problems noted.

2. L-9 reported as follows:

- a. The Cuban chess team, which defeated its Mexico City opponents, is scheduled to go to Saltillo for another tournament and then to Canada. All team members visited the Embassy the night of 19 March. One of the team members, a mulato, mentioned having played chess in Czechoslovakia. In May the Mexico City team plans to visit Cuba for a re-match. The newspaper Novedades, issue of 19 Mar, lists all the team members. (THIS INFO FOLIONED UP BY CAHLE EXCHANGE WITH DIR AND WAVE) L-9 feels that it would be a "fine thing" if we could convince one or more of these chess players that they should not go back to Cuba.
- h. A Cuban named Herrera (one of the chess players -?- not clear)
 has an errand to do here in Mexico for Luis BAEZ of the newspaper
 Revolucion in Cuba which involves obtaining copies of July 1963
 editions of LIFE magazine concerning the Playa Giron invasion.
 These magazines are for the general staff of the Cuban army.
- Manual GONZALEZ Guarra, who is "attached" to the chess team from Cuba, was at the airport on 20 March on his way back to Cuba. He was loaded down with two large boxes full of baseballs said that he had come to Maxico especially to buy baseballs for Fidel CASTRO. He said he would be back soon, probably 23 March. When L-9 remarked that "they might not let you out again," CONZALEZ laughed and said he was a big wheel "Don't forget, I am superintendent of all official telephones in Cuba." O told L-9 that Fidel CASTRO is "muy majadero," explaining that Castro has a wild idea that alfalfa is better cattle food than balanced feed and that as a result he will probably start planting alfalfa everywhere. L-9 feels that G must feel pretty sure of himself to dare to refer to Castro as "majadero" foolish! (REPORTED BY CAELL FIRST PART)
- d. Nico Garcia should be back soon perhaps on 23 March.
- e. The Chinese would-be defector is named <u>Teng Pan-Chi</u> and is staying at the San Diego Hotel. (REPORTED BY CABLE) 1954 860
- f. On 16 March an American Neuro boy named Roy BELTON (phonetic) was at the Embassy. He is from Milwaukee. He said that he wanted to go to Cuba, was tired of serving the imperialists. He was accompanied by a Puerto Rican. BELTON was close to tears during his visit.

SUBJECT : Meeting with LITAMIL-9, 1 April 1964

1. A three-hour twenty-minute meeting was held with L-9 on the night of 1 April at B's home _ Mrs. B handling the gate. No security problems.

- 2. L-9 was in excellent spirits and felt even better when he was precented with the artists supplies sent by HQS in response to a Station dispatch — he was overjoyed at receiving this paint and thanked B repeatedly throughout the meeting.
- 3. The first part of the meeting was devoted to scrutiny of LTRODE photos from which L-9 made a larger percentage of identifications than usual.
 - b. L-9 reported as follows:
 - a. An Embassy staff meeting was held Tuesday 24 March at which time the Arbassador addressed the group regarding the trial of Marcos RODRIGUEZ Alfonso. DETAILS REPORTED BY INTEL CABLE 2 April.
 - At the same meeting the Amb spoke out about the dangers of electronic evesdropping devices and cautioned the staff to be very careful of such diabolical tools which are being used constantly by the imperialists: "At this very moment someone may be listening behind that door." The Amb said that it could be assumed that "we are surrounded by listening apparatus" he said that a special meeting would be held on 26 Mar to discuss this ratter at length. L-9 remarked, as he fiddled with a button on his coat, that he had read that a secret transmitter could be built right into a button. Others made similar remarks and everyone seemed to be fully spooked. Elpidio INTERIAN was observed watching everyone closely to see their reactions. The Amb said that the imperialists play very dirty and have some very refined gadgetry. He said that care should be taken that names are not mentioned in sensitive conversations and reminded everyone that the telephones were not to be trusted. According to L-9, it is assumed that all Embassy phones are tapped.
 - c. At the same meeting Guillermo RUIZ spoke out a couple of times, saying that "this kmilesty is not functioning properly." He suggested that the staff should begin clipping newspapers in order to set up personality files on "exicans -- these files should show their activities, attitudes toward Cuba, and similar detail. APARICIO said he was not in favor of the idea, that it would take up too much time, that the staff is too small for such doings. The Amb then spoke out in favor of RUIZ and squashed APARICIO -- the reeling is mutual). Once the Amb had taken RUIZ' sido everyone else fell into line. L-9 has noticed that RUIZ is outspoken and that he seems to get his way most of the time, that even the Amb seems to be afraid to cross him.
 - d. At the same meeting the amb announced that a limit of 600 foreign

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students would be in Cuba at any one time on scholarships and that the staff should be quite frank with would-be "hocados" -- telling them that their chances of getting a free oducation in Cuba are slim, Only in truly exceptional cases should students be encouraged when they show up requesting scholarships. The restriction ecoms to be economic -- L-9 feels that 500 is a very small number for a country the size of Cula.

Av the meeting of Thursday, 26 March, a translation of a recent TIME lead article on diretapping and electronic evesdrouping was read by Pergrins WONSO. This brought out such exciting discoveries as the fact that a transmitter could be built in a space no larger than a lump of sugar. The Amb reminded those present that if the imperialists are willing to disclose this much information on their methods and abilities in the field it must be concluded that they have even more fancy things up their sleeves which they are not talking about. The Amb said that each person in the Embassy should keep to his own work and not inquire into that of the others (compartmentation) and said that he was not satisfied with the gatherings and bull sessions at the entrance to the Embassy where too much was being said and too much was being seen by too many - these sessions would have to stop -- it is nobody's business who comes to visit the Embassy. At this point Rogelio RODRIGUEZ and Buenaventura REYES spoke up and said they had seen a "tube moving behind a curtain in a house across from the consulate." (THIS IS PROBABLY A DISCOVERY OF A LIERODE CAMERA) It was agreed that people coming to the Embassy are probably being photographed. The Amb then told the following story: "Don't forget the case of the textile vendor who went to the American Embassy for a visa. They refused to give him a visa -told him that he had visited the Cuban Embassy. Then they proved it to him by showing him a picture of himself entering the Embassy here. He was really shocked!" (DON'T KNOW THE BACKGROUND OF THIS TALE -- CHECKING).

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It was announced at this 26 Mar meeting that/FelipeyLAGOSTERA will not be returning to Mexico. He will remain in Habana to work at MINREX.

Some concern was shown at the neeting about the disappearance of "Licha" who had left at noon Wednesday and had not returned. (L-9 said that he thought she was now back to work - probably took off on a Holy-Week bender in good Mexican fashion.)

- On 21 March L-7 briefly saw a man with a pockmarked face and several days' growth of beard in the Embassy -- about 30-35 years old. He heard someone call to him: ARAGON. No further details.
- i. On 21 March a man named Jorge WOHAL from the San Ignacio Textile plant in Puebla called and askel for Nico GARCIA. RUIZ seemed some-What disturbed that COGHAL had called Nico and impatiently told the girl taking the call to inform COGHAL that Nico was not in. (He was still in Cuba at the time).
- J. L-9 turned over the FRANCO-CALVENTI letter (see item 2,k, L-9 CR covering 20 Mar meeting) to MIRABAL XIRABAL seemed to feel he had a hot potato on his hands, was very unconfortable and even a bit scared and said, "I'll have to discuss this with the Ambassador," (L-9 notes that MRABAL is covarily, timorous, not at all like his predecessor AZCUE who was the epitons of self confidence and control.

L=9 finds this interesting since AZCUE was not a Communist and MEABAL is -- the Originals is really the weakling in spite of all the strength that supposedly comes from knowing that Marxistanials is right)

- k. APARICIO will soon be giving a lecture in Morelia, Michoacan,
- 1. On 31 March the Amb, APARICIO; and L-9 visited the "Jose Marti" School in Mexico City where they were shown all around and given VIP treatment. As so often happens, L-9 "upstaged" APARICIO by getting most of the attention. The Amb seemed to enjoy this; APARICIO didn't.
- m. The Cubana flight of Monday 30 Mar returned to Mexico after take-off owing to mechanical trouble.
- (Inu) CIPUT (check manifest for full name), new Algerian Amb to Cuba was in town a few days ago on his way to Habana, L-9 was the handholder because of his French. Z was angry at the delay he had experienced in the US when the Mexican Embassy took a long time to issue him a transit visa. He said that Algeria will soon establish diplomatic relations with Spain and then it will not be necessary to transit the US and Mexico to get to Cuba, Relations with Argentina and Mexico will also be established soon, Argentina first, Mexico within 3 months. The delay is due to financial considerations -- it costs a lot to open new Embassies. Brazil will be put off until later. Z had his choice of 3 countries - the US, Czechoslovakia, or Cuba -- chose Cuba and seems to be very pro-Cuban. Speaks excellent French, some English, He left for Habana numberships and on 30 Mar three other Algerian diplomats went to Habana. While Z was at the airport on 28 Mar waiting to leave he saw an American couple and told L-9 that these same two wore watching him in New York, that the man was "surely a KUBARK agent. They are everywhere these days."

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- o. L-9 has one supposedly "classified" document in his care -- because he has a lock on his desk. (METRAP brought up the occasion when APARICIO gave him this document some time ago). It deals with a Mexican named RUIZ Castaneda who is a senator and is president of the foreign relation; committee of the senate, He went on the interparliamentary trio to the USA recently. It is a letter from APARICIO to Habana about RC, saying that RC fould like to give lectures in Cuba but does not dare ask permission of the senate and LOPEZ Mateos to make the trip. In the letter APARICIO says that RC said that Mexico will not vote for Communist Chinese admission to the UN in order to avoid incurring the displeasure of the US.
- p. The Embassy is buying three new Ford cars a Galaxie, later a Fairlane, still later a Ford 200. On 24 March L.-9 gave Sr. Paniagua of Diplomatic Sales, Ford de Mexico, a check (No. 210314) payable to Ford Motor Company E.S.O. by the French American Bank, 120 Broadway, New York 10, N.Y. It was purchased at the Banco del Atlantico, S.A.—was for \$ 1350 US, down payment on the first car.

Q. Barrera (fnu) of the chess team (incorrectly given as Herrera in item 2,b, of the last CR covering 20 Mar mtg) is a newspaperman with the paper Revolucion. He does not play chess, is apparently the political control officer for the team. Team came tack triumphant from Saltillo

on 1 April and is lodged at the Hotel Regis. Most will leave for Canada to play a match there -- leaving Friday, 3 April.

Team will have early breakfast with the Amb that norming at the Embassy. BARRERA got a cable reading thusly: SAA O II. 28.II.

Teresa PROENZA returned acting like she was coming back to work
and her passport contained a notation "Para reintegrarse a su cargo"
but this was just window dressing, a sop to her to make her feel
happier while she packs up to leave. She is going to return to Cuba
within about six weeks, L-9 does not know what her job will be there.
She reported that food in Cuba is much better, she seemed quite
optimistic about things there. She got together with APARICIO for
about an hour and talked over many things with him. (MKTRAP caught
some of this). She made no mention of the RODRIGUEZ Alfonso trial
in talking to L-9.

S. Teresa told L-9 that a friend had told her in Cuba about Fidel CASTRO's intervention when Raul ROA tried to get L-9 transferred out of Mexico about a year ago. CASTRO said to ROA: "If L-9 is doing a good job there in Mexico, why are you taking him away?" This ended the matter as ROA naturally agreed with Fidel. (L-9 heard exactly the same version of the conversation some time ago from his sister-in-law who contacted Fidel on the matter).

According to Teresa, ROA's decision to let L-9 take time off for painting was due to ROA's fear of incurring Fidel's displeasure again in connection with L-9.

Teresa haten ROA. Calls him "ese pequeno de Roa" and says that ROA spoke very harshly about Amb Hernandez Armas — calling him an idiot and "even worse things." She said ROA had used the expression "comemierdas" to refer to the Amb.

Felipe ROJAS is acting unnaturally. He now asks lots of questions whereas he used to be very quiet and unassuming. L-9 said to B:
"If he is ours, you better get word to him to slow down before people get too suspicious." B: "Maybe he's working for the Maxican Government." L-2: "Then you'd better tell the Maxicans!"

W. APARICIO is not a very likeable person. Uses rough language. He knows his diplomatic niceties from having majored in diplomacy in school but his knowledge is technical. The Amb doesn't like him, feels that A is a bit of a lambiscon (boot licker) and is not sincere.

- . Maxican senator ARAGON has been very nice to the Cuban chess team. The Amb has noted this with pleasure and has decided to put on the charm and win over ARAGON -- is going to send him a box of fine cigars and invite him to dine at the Embassy.
- y. It will be recalled that some months ago Cap. RABEL Numes tried to contact L-9 in Mexico. L-9 was instructed to report this to the Amb -- which he did. He also wrote to his sister-in-law about

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the incident and she wrote back telling him he had done the right thing to report this approach to the Amb. L-9 feels that the incident is nicely covered and will serve to show that he cannot be recruited even by old and very close friends.

s. Nico Garcia is back - seems to be hanging around Mexico City.

SUBJECT : Heeting with LITAMIL-2, 10 April 1964

1. A meeting was held with L=9 from 2000 until 2235 hours on 10 April - in B's car, parked in three different locations in the Lomas District.

2. L-9 was made aware of the content of a LDMD intercepted letter which, although dated July 1963 and mailed to Ambassador HERNANDEZ Armae in August, had just come to light singed it had been mislayed in our file room. This letter, from an unknown person, denounced L-9 to the Ambassador for accepting dollars from the Revolutionary Covernment and using them to support counter-revolutionaries such as his (L-9's) brother. The letter goes on to criticize L-9's sister-in-law and speaks of "nepotism in full socialism." It had been expected that L-9 would be upset by this, but when B informed him of the gist of the demunciation he said, "That is fine. This sort of thing actually helps me. Any reference to my sister-in-law is good since everyone knows how close she is to Fidel and this serves to enhance my protection." In short, L-9 was not the least bit disturbed about the denunciation. File copy of the letter will be filed with original of this CR.

3. L-9 reported as follows:

- a. The telephones at the Embassy have recently been "all mixed up" and on 7 April a phone company worker was at work on the pole at the Embassy corner trying to straighten things out.
- b. L-9 has gained points with the Embassy by his smooth work in acquiring the new Ford Galaxie sedan which has been ordered. (He requested that we refrain from tampering with this car since it is identified with him and any "bugs" or other gadgetry which might be planted and discovered might point to L-9)
- The Embassy Cadillac is on the fritz. The automatic transmission is broken, having been allowed to run dry. It will cost 4,000 peros to make the necessary repair or replacement.
- d. The Bulletin of the Cultural Department has not appeared recently because the Emhassy does not have sufficient money to publish it.
- e. On 3 April some woman with a name like Nore BOWL (phonetic) called the Embassy asking about the chess team and explaining that she likes chess. No further detail.
- f. JORRIN is no longer so nervous, has calmed down noticeably.
- g. Nico GARCIA seems to be in a very happy mood these days.
- h. L-9 recently ran into the Mexican leftist journalist Rosa CASTRO 10 in a bookstope. She said that the Mexican writers Carlos YUENTES and Fernands Fernand

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a very few perronn shout their disillusionment. It seems that they did not find what they expected in Russia -- it did not live up to advance billing -- and both were affected by the attitude of the people who seemed beaten down and morose, certainly not nearly as gay and full of life as the Mexicans.

- i. On 6 April the neuroscient Reliance (mentioned in an earlier CR) was at the Employ again, dealing with Aparicio. L-9 overheard him comenting on the fact that Ramirez and Ramirez of the newspaper El Dia had "gone over" to the PRI and that Arelland Belloc was having trouble placing his own material in the newspaper Novedades.
- J. There was no staff meeting on h April. L-9 believes this was due to the probability that staff members would discuss Brazil if they got together. When the Ambassador does not want to discuss a matter he endeavors to insure that the staff will not get together.
- k. On 7 April the Ambassador asked L-9 for ideas on redecorating the downstairs salons of the Embassy, speaking of the need for new curtains, etc. (If this redecoration is to extend to the offices or living quarters it may give us an opportunity to extend our audio surveillance of the Embassy).
- 1. On the night of 7 April L-9 and the Amb went to an exposition of Dutch art at Bellas Artes. The Amb got into a cozy-conversation with the Yugoslavian Ambassador but L-9 does not know what they discussed although he believes they were on the topic _f Frazil since he overheard the Yugo Amb telling Hernandez Armas that it was bad that "there is no Ambassador there." Hdz Armas also spoke with Gorostiza at this affair -- just a handshake and a few words.
- m. On 10 April Aparicio left for Morelia, Michoacan, to deliver a lecture, presumably at the University.
- n. On 8 April, about 1300 hours, a Cuban, age about 40, wearing glasses, came by to see Aparicio was attended by Felipe Rojas. This man, who drives an old car, picks up propaganda material for distribution in barber shops.
- o. On 8 April the group of physicians who had been attending a conference in Montevideo, Uruguay, and who had just returned to Mexico in transit to Habana asked for and received 5-day extensions on their Mexican transit visas.

- r. At about 1030 hours 7 April a youns Mexican writer named Fernando XCIJFRO Cortes visited Aparicio. He is trying to peddle his novels for publication in Cuba but has no talent.

On the night of 9 april a group from the Cuban Embassy in Rie arrived -- (battom) (filler from Parties, 8 women, 3 children. on 9 April Josefina GONZALEZ de VILASECA, wife of the Vice President of the National Bank of Cuba, came by to see L-9 who has known her for some time - both are artists. L-9 took her in to see the Amb and in the ensuing conversation the Amb made the following remarks:

It appears that the military junta in Brazil will not break relations with us right away but they can be counted on to vote against us in the OAS.

There are many Korean war veterans in Brazil who influence things against Cuba.

Brizola is our one hope. He is decisive and audacious.

Chile has a well organized labor movement. In Brazil most of the people are farm workers and they lack political preparation.

The same day, 9 April, L-9 went with Josefina CONZALEZ de VILASECA to visit Xavier GUERRERO and his wife Clara Porset de GUERRERO, Also present at this affair: Sra, Victoriatus LA CRUZ, a Cuban cardiclogist, close friend of the wife of ADMIN ROA -- she is in Mexico on her way to San Salvador and Colombia. Clara PORSET spoke about the trial in Habana of Marcos RODRIGUEZ Alfonso -- said she remembered him when he was in Mexico in the old days and that he was such a skinny, non-descript fellow she was surprised to learn later that he was an imperialist spy; that it was not until the Czechs began to follow him in Prague that it was learned that he was contacting foreign embassies; that he must have been working for CIA; that Fidel CASTRO has managed to set the record straight; that it appears that Faure CHONON was trying to create division in the ranks of the revolutionaries.

v. While here, Josefina ONZALEZ de VILASECA also visited with Jose CHAVEZ Morado, Mexican Communist painter.

5. L-9 was aksed about <u>Deenal ROYFR</u> who had come up on MXTRAP traffic. He said he had met her but that she spent most of her time talking with Aparicio. He began to speak to her in French but she switched to Spanish which she doesn't handle too well -- this led him to believe that she doesn't speak French too well either. L-9 felt, was not sure, that she was on a photo-journalistic jaunt to Cuba and might be working for Paris Match.

6. On the off chance that Humberto GARCIA (Cuban friend of Celia SANCHEZ who is in Mexico ostensibly to recover from asthma and who has been passing himself off as anti-Castro) might be the mysterious new ANTICE-1 case officer "Julian." 7. L-9 was in good spirits throughout the meeting but got a bit queasy toward the end, perhaps from smoking one of the cigars he had earlier presented to B.

Meeting with LITAMIL-9, 30 Jan 1964

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1. A meeting with L-9 took place from 2010 until 2145 hours 30 Jan 1964 at the safe grantient. 1=9 was in surprisingly good spirits, showed none of his usual depression.

2. L-9 reported on the following:

a. On Saturday 18 Jan at the usual Embassy staff meeting, several new assignments were passed out. A "three month plan" was announced and during this period staff members, in addition to their usual duties, will prepare special reports on several topics. [Raul AFARICIO will do a report on the National University = physical plant, student body, activities, ways in which the Cuban government can exert influence, etc. L-9 will do a similar report on the National Institute of Fine Arts (Bellas Artes). Dra. p 8511 MACHADO will do a report on countries which have diplomatic relations with Cuty -- emphasizing how contact with representatives here in Mexico of such countries may be parlayed into something more worthwhile for the Grane government. Rogelio RODRIGUEZ was given an assignment as Political Reporting Officer.

At this meeting Guillermo RUTZ of the Commercial Office -- who has recently been energing as a Canatical Fidelista -- spoke out about the recent accord between the UDSR and Cuba, saying that it was convenient for the USSR to keep on the good side of Cuba and thus keep a dagger in the back of the imperialists. Ambassador HERNANDEZ Armas, schewhat taken aback by RUIZ' language, pointed out that the relationship between the USSE and Cuba is based, above all, on the highest principles of international friendship.

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b. Last Wednesday (29 Jan) a Soviét official, Boris T. RUDENKO, visited the Cultural Department and spoke with APARICIO and L-9. L-9 took pains to "be a good Communist" during this encounter. (This conversation was picked up by METRAF) RUDENKO was also at the home of Horacio FLORES Sancher on the 23th after the Marti hamage session at the Cuben Cultural Institute.

A Bolivian woman -- name possibly VIILALBA -- was recently at the Hotel Oxford with 7 children, whiting to go to Cube to join her husband she works there. L-9 believes she has gone on to Cuba.

On 17 January Cuban delegates to the CEPAL Conference visited the Embansy and spoke with Embansy employees. One of these delegates, referring to the Bicaro plant in Cuba, said that only 12 engineers of the original 37 remained, Of these, a man named (fnu) PRESILIA was still doing an excellent jeb although he is physically in poor condition. The Nicoro plant opecifically, and technicians throughout Cuba in general, are baving a hard time with the decimal system used by the USSA in its technical equipment. 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As Temesa FROENIA was leaving AFARTON gave her a personal letter alignessed to PORTIONS. Temes a told L-9 about this but warmed him not to tell anyone. A AREUIO is a close friend of ructo

- On Fednesday and Thursday (29 and 30 Jan) URBIETA, an employee of the Cornercial Section, was graphling about the "kids" who supposedly work there - AUIZ, CONCEPCION, and GARCIA - but who can't seem to get surthing done and only succeed in messing up paper. URBIETA was quite disgusted.
- Suillerno RUIZ has been showing himself to be quite aggressive politically in staff meetings. He appears to be a violent . partisan of the Castro regime.
- MIRABAL has been less aggressive than before, has recently been down in the dumps and has been spending a lot of time talking to Dra. MACHADO. The Ambassador told Dra. MACHADO that MIRABAL and Mexican food don't get along together.

1. L-9 did not make the scheduled safehouse meeting of 5 Feb. An alternate meeting was laid on for 2000 hours at the Thiers-Gutenberg circle and he appeared on time. He explained that at 1915 hours 5 Feb as he emerged from a taxicab about five blocks from the safehouse he spotted AM-IE-1 standing nearby. L-9 immediately called out to him, "What are you doing here? How about joining me for a drink?" AMLIE was not in a very sociable mood so L-9 went into a nearby furniture stors to look at some chairs and left soon thereefter, going uptown and moseying about for several hours before going home. It would appear that AMLIE's presence on Insurgentes Sur was not related to L-9's meeting with Barker, L-9 was told that he had done right to skip the meeting -- he was somewhat upset since he had never before missed a meeting.

- 2. L-9 was told that B would be out of town during the coming week and that he, I-S, should make another foray into the general area of the safehouse -- perhaps have suppor at Chalunas at the corner of Insurgentes Sur and San Antonio -- just in case someone might be watching him.
- 3. As the meeting was held in B's car the LIERODE photos were not taken along. Eacklog of these photos will be shown to him at the next safehouse meeting.
- 4. L-9 was shown a photo of INTERIAN and wife made a positive identification of these two. Said INTERIAN is a "police type" and very probably has the codes. His wife is often around the kitchen at the Embassy. They have two young daughters. INTERIAN is very friendly, a mice person. His wife is baving some female troubles which INTERIAN told L-9 all about. L-9 was instructed to concentrate on INTERIAN and be prepared to report on him at each subsequent meeting.
- 5. L-9 reported that a Cuban physician named STLVANTO had finally received his visa to return to Cuba -- he had been trying for several years to get back home. APARICIO helped him to get the visa. It was issued 4 Feb.
- 6. POPOCA formal, a Communist from Northwest Mexico, and adherent of Braulio MALDONAFO, was in the imbassy on a Reb. He spoke with APARICIO. (METRAP should bring this up).
- 7. A mexican named AVEDAÑO (fnu) was in the Embassy 4 Feb trying to get a visa.
- 8. ONT: It was agreed that in any phone conversation with B, the meeting places would be termed THE OLD FLACE (Thiers & Gutenberg), THE STORE (Reformals Altal), THE RESTAURANT (Safehouse).
 - 9. NEXT (STORA): Open. To be initiated by B upon return from trip.

SUBJECT : Meeting with LITAKIL-9, 1 March 1964. MICROFILMED AUG 2 3 1905 DOC MICRO. SER

1. A four-hour twenty-minute meeting was held with L-9 beginning at 2000 hours, Sunday 1 March. The meeting took place at B's home with B's wife handling the gate. No security problems were noted except that L-9 saw Eli de GORTARI in the vicinity of the pick-up point -- GORTARI and L-9 were both browsing in the same bookstore.

- 2. L=9 was in pretty good spirits. He reported as follows:
 - Reson SINOBAS, wife, and children came in to Mexi on the Cubana plane of 1 March, SINOBAS was scheduled to leave for Santiago, Chile that night where he will take up a position in the Cubsn Pubassy. L-9 planned to see him off at the sirport about 6100 hours. L-9 described SINCRAC! wife as very common, a "cheap" woman, looks like a "putita."
 - The Ambassador of Guinea in Habana was at the Embassy on 1 Harch - planning to go to Cuba on the Cubara flight same date. He told L-9 that he will soon be going to Ethiopia -- had formerly been in the UNO. He will be replaced in Habana by the present Amb. from Guinea in Brazil -- a man whom he feels will fit in well with the Cubans.
 - c. L-9 is hoping to exhibit his Suban engravings in Morelia, Michoacan before long.
 - d. A medical doctor named (fnu) QUIJANO Mareco, residing at Polanco 68, telephone 1.5-1.3-90, will be going to Cuba soon.
 - e. On 15 February the Ambassador (HERMANIEZ Armas) and Lacaro CARDENAS went on a trip to Pico Toluca. Their jeep was bogged down in the mud and they had to abandon it. This information came from Coty SOLORFANO.
 - f. Paul PIPELL, has some sort of churry relationship with Sr. (fnu) CARLILLERO who is a close immend of Horacio FLORES Sanches of the Bellas Artes institute: APARICIO recently wondered aloud just "what the hell Pereira is up to."
 - g. INTERIAN did not attend the staff meeting of 15 February.
 - h. Ramon CUFHCA Mantoto has returned to Habana. As he left he vold L-9, "I'll see you in Habara."
 - i. The other day during a volleyhall game at the Embassy EMTERIAN complained that his arms were getting vired - "something that never happened when I was a mason (albafil)."
 - A Cuban delegate to some sort of conference in Brazil come in on the Cubara plane of 1 March with his wife -- name may have been Barrera -- 1-9 not sure. While on the plane he lost the credent

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secrediting him at Cuton delegate to the conference. He planned to leave for Rio that same night (1 March). This man was recently at a UNESCO meeting in Paris. L-9.SUCCESTED THAT ME MIGHT WISH TO LOUSE THINGS UP FOR THIS MIN IN BRAZIL BY HAVING SOMEONE CHALLENGE HIS RIGHT TO REPRESENT JULY ** THIS IN VIEW OF HIS NOT HAVING A VALID CREDENTIAL.

The Russian writer NITTHY (who has come up on MATERP) recently spoke at an affair at the Soviet Cultural Institute and a tall, thin Mexican, about 55 years old, did a SUPERB job (L-9 repeated this several times) of harmassing RUDERB. The Mexican kept making emarks from the Moor which compared the Russian revolution unfavorably to the Mexican revolution -- he succeeded in winning a lot of support from persons present and made RUDENKO look ridiculous. L-9 remarked, "If this man was yours, he should be congratulated."

- RUDENKO was unable to speak at the Cuban institute -- pleading insufficient time. L-9 feels that the hazing he got at the Aussian institute may have had screening to do with this.
- f In mid-February President MOPSZ Mateos dedicated several schools -dependencies of the UMAM -- in the Tacubeya area. L-9 was with the Ambassador and on three occasions the Ambassador tried to great LM with an abrazo -- he was unsuccessful, all the president would do was give him a wave of the hand.
- a. Dolores de la MOPA has gore to Malisco on an extended trip.
- o. Enrique ALVAREZ M. and Alberto PEREZ Razo, both members of the Comite Revolucionario de la Universidad Michoacana (in Morelia) - both students -- visited the Entassy on 27 February. That eftermoon AND THE WATER, rector of the University of Micheacan, spoke with Raul APAPICIO and invited APARICIO to give a lecture at the University some time in Morch. L-9 thinks it might be a good idea to harass APARIOTO at this time.
- p. On 10 February I con TRICH. Outan Ambassador to Japan went through Nexico. He greened L-7 effusively. L-9 sold that shout a year ago ANTICH went to the Embassy in Newi as an imprector of MINNEX and recorneded later in his report that L-9 be laid off as "unnecessary." L-9 found this change of tune interesting. MINTER had heretofore considered L-9 not sufficiently revolutionary but now makes great efforts to prove his iriendship.
- q. Sra. MATAMO, wife of a physician, was recently refused a visa by the American Erbossy - she says that this was due to her close association with Ariassulor HTRNALDEZ Armas. APAPICIO told 1-9 about this -- APARIOTO Rinds it strange that the American Embassy should know of the association.
- On 24 Feb, at 1130 hours, Victor FLORES Olea was in the Embasey with APARICIO.
- s. A Mexican backer (female) named Genia MRII Henwandez, who resides at Calle Earcelona 3, Interior 4, Colonia Guaren, D.F., has been SECRE

recommended by the Cultural Department of the Embassy for a teaching job in Cuba. APARICIO recommended her on 20 Feb.

L-9 attended an affair at the Soviet Embassy on 24 February -anniversary of the Red Arry. A Mexican official named MADERO
was there -- spoke at length with the Yugoslavian Ambassador.
The Yugoslavian Ambassador remarked that Antonio RODRIGUEZ, a
critic who writes for the magazine Siempre had been discovered
to be "not as friendly to the Russians as some people think -that's why he is not here today." RODRIGUEZ was reported to be
friendly to the Castro regime.

On 2h February a short assembly was held at the Embassy to celebrate the Grito de Daire and representatives of the Grupo Jose Martí (the institute crowd) and the Escuela Jose Martí attended. No representative case from the Escuela República de Cuba. (fnu) IALOMARIS spoke for the Grupo Jose Marti:

Dr. Puben PARFAL, a Polivian physician, has been invited to go to Cuba by the Cuban Medical College.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE RECORD

SUBJECT : Meeting with LITAMIL-0, 16 Jan 64

I. A meeting was held with L-9 on the night of 16 Jan. Pick-up was made at the corner of Reforms and Altai (Lonas) and L-9 was driven to the vicinity of the recently acquired safe apartment which will be used for this operation in the future. When he learned that the meeting would be held in an apartment he got a bad case of nerves, said "I don't like this one bit," and came very close to refusing. Barker finally convinced him that this one meeting should be held there and that if, after talking things over, L-9 did not feel safe there the place would not be used for further meetings. Be entered the safe apartment at 2017 and L-9 showed up at 2016. By this time he was almost shaking. Feginning by reminding L-9 that the two had always worked together well by being perfectly frank and open with each other, B proposed that L-9 state his reasons for being afraid of holding meetings in a safe apartment, after which B would state his reasons in favor of the proposition, at the end of which L-9 would be allowed to decide whether the apartment should be used in the future.

- 2. L-9 rambled all over the map, referred to his many meetings with his earlier C/O Shrycck, sometimes two or three in one day; said he had absolute confidence in B, but didn't trust other people, etc., etc. The reasons for his allergy to safehouses did not become evident so B began his spiel and held forth on the good points of the new meeting place -- L-9 and B would never be together except behind these walls -- could not be seen together -- a cover story for use of the apartment explained to the portera B's presence (she could be counted on to spread it around a bit); there are two good looking women living in other apartments in the same building which could explain L-S's having entered if anyone knowing him were to see him go in (he is a bachelor); the person from whom the apartment is sub-leased does not know B's name or identity; B's can would never be parked in front of the house, etc., etc. L-9 acknowledged all this but repeated his statement that he doesn't trust other people. Then it finally came out, he was under the impression that the apartment was to be used by B for meeting numerous other agents - apparently he could not conceive of our obtaining an apartment to use for meeting one lone agent. As soon as he was assured that he was the only agent who would be met there he calmed down and relaxed noticeably. In his mind's eye he had been seeing a penetration agent point out the apartment and causing it to be watched by the opposition which would eventually catch L-9 going in. L-9 required B's assurances three different times during the meeting that other persons would not be met there. This caused B to deliver a short course on commartmentation and show L-9 that we would consider it folly to meet more than one agent in the same place. (For the record, it should be noted that agent DEGRIP may be net there from time to time -- it is not planned that the apartment will be exposed to any other assets).
- 3. L-9 explained that he would have to loave by 2200 hours since he had to go to the simport to meet an unremed Polici technician. He showed B two cables received by the Embassy announcing that a "tecnico Polones" would arrive by VARIG on 16 January and that the Embassy should meet him and arrange his travel to Havana on Cubana 20 Jan. L-9 was chosen to meet this man who was obviously Rio asset ESTIDS.

L-9 reported on the following matters:

An Enbassy staff meeting was held on 2 January to discuss the the furctions held that day to celebrate the 5th anniversaty of the revolution. Ambassador HERNANDEZ Armas asked Nico CARCIA why Erma CASTRO didn't turn up. Nico replied that she was probably in Acapulco - that Peregrina ALONSO took care to see that she got an invitation. It was amounced that neither LCMARDO Toledano nor Lazaro CARDENAS had showed up - both had been invited. APARICIO said that Teresa FFDENZA told him that CARDENAS didn't come because his invitation was sent by mail instoad of being delivered by hand. The Ambassador. obviously miffed, said that between friends such protectl should not be required. Other invitees, particularly Commists, explained their absence by saying that it was not "convenient" for them to appear at the Cuban Embassy. In review, the Ambassador said that the moontime reception was a real success because even COR STIZA from the Mexican Foreign Office showed up. On the other hand, the evening reception was a flop and he, the Amb, did not agree that people should stay away because it was not converient to be seen around there. He had a few good words to say for L-9's skilful handling of the Frenchspeaking guests, referring to "L-9, the Frenchman's friend."

b. On 8 January L-9 heard over the interphone that someone named Carol MILLER (phonetic) was being called into FERNANDEZ Roa's office at 1130 hours.

e. An IPN student named Francisco LAGUNEZ came to the Embassy looking for Teresa FRCENZA a few days ago. He identified himself to L-9 by showing his PCH credential No. 2262. Teresa was, of course, not in.

- d. A medical student who has hopes of going to Cuba to ctudy has been writing six months for a Cuban visa. His name is Aleja ROMFRO.

e. Lazaro AVIIA Cisneros who lives at Multifamiliar Juares,
D-11-201, has sent in a letter askin; for a scholarship to
study in Cuba.

f. On 15 January a Ferdean named Tomas SORIANO brought some envelopes for the Ambassador, APARICID, and PROENZA. He also carried a copy of a book or pamphlet entitled "Yo Atuso" and written by Demetrio VALLEJO, the imprisoned RR union leader. SORIANO took 15 copies of the Embassy builtin with him when he left.

18290 g. At 1125 hours on 9 Jan Dr. CEVALIOS, a frequent visitor, cane to see APARICIO.

h. At 1100 hours on 9 Jan a Mexican writer named Luisa Josefina HERMANDEZ came to see AFARICIO. Her visit had something to do with the Literary contest being rum by the Casa de Las Americas in Cuba.

Teresa PROENZA has a ticket to go to Cuba on Honday 20 Jan (confirmed by LIEYVOI).

- A Spanish Communist named Juan REJANO told Teresa PROENZA that he could get 1 0 signatures on any paper decanding justice for her. She politely asked him not to do so.
- k. APARICIO says that he understands that Teresa is trying to get a position in Cuba and that former-Ambassador FORTIDADO is somehow involved in this.
- 1. A man named (fnu) * ROPOCA, Communist from Mexicali, B.C. probably mixed up with Braulio MALDONADO, was at the Embassy on 16 Jan. L-9 does not know who he dealt with.
- Dra. MACHADO is "going crazy" now that LITAMIL-? is away on vacation. She recently pointed to a pile of papers on her desk and said, "If L-7 doesn't come back soon I'll die." L-9 says that this shows how important L-7 is to the smooth functioning of the office. As an aside to B, he remarked, "You know, L-7 is. on our side." She is in Caxaca on vacation.
- On Saturday 11 Jan many of the Embassy staff were invited to a social afternoon at the Soviet Embassy -- all the other Socialist Embassies received similar invitations. The Yagoslava were conspicuously absent. L-9 noted that the Soviet Ambassador was especially interested in greeting APARICIO. Those present played volleyball and chess or just sat around and visited.

- Silvia DUFAN was visiting the consulate on the morning of 15 Jan -- talking with Buenaventura RETES. L-9 said, Pare you back with us, Silvita?" to which she replied, "No, you folks don't love me anymore,"
- p. The Embassy had a short ceremony in commemoration of the death of Mella - the Ambassador, APARICIO, and MIRABAL spoke.
- There will be an affair at the Cultural Institute on the 28th celebrating Marti's birthday. Photographs will be achibited and a few speeches will be made. Among the speakers will be (fnu) MELO, Ermilo (lnu), APARICIO, and Essanuel CARBALLO,
- On Wednesday morning (15 Jan) L-9 and APARICIO visited the Sociedad Mexicana de Planificacion. This was merely a certesy visit -- no real business was transacted. (LIENVOI shows this visit). and other activities in 1984

- 5. In connection with the Literary Contest/of the Casa de Las Americas in Havana, L-9 reported as follows:
 - A number of people from Mexico are expected to travel to Havana to act as judges in this contest/ Among there are: and to give lectures.

VERBITSKY Aletandro VERVITAYE (phon) who will be ready to go in January. europain to initiation at all P. 7:14

Gabriel FEREAMDEZ Loderna will go in April to be there when Soviet material is judged.

Leopoldo MENDEZ will go in May. -3- SECRET

Henrique CONZALEZ Casanova, one of the judges, expected to be in Cuba by 20 Jan.

Manuel CONZALEZ Casanova can go at any time to give lectures on motion pictures.

B. CASTRO Villagrama will go in September to give a 15 day

Prof. Alberto RUZ will go to Caba in December 1964.

- Ing. Jorge L. TAMA TO was in Havana in Dec 63. He will be available to visit any month to give a 1 week lecture course.
- Prof. Eli de GORTAN is willing to go to give a short course.

Prof. (fnu) SANCHEZ Vasques can go as a contest judge.

A man named TRARGUENCOITIA, now living in California, USA, is going to visit Cuba about 15 February on Casa de Las Americas business.

Juan RULFO, considered to be somewhat of a "big wheel" was takked into going to Havana by Carlos SOLORZANO but will not be able to go in time — he was due to visit early in the year. This has H. Leiseca quite upset. (There was not enough time to ask L-9 who Leiseca is).

Jean CASSOU of France has not answered the invitation sent him. He sent to the Casa de Las americas a list of people in Latin America who are qualified to judge French material.

- MOTE: On the above, time was so short that a detailed review was not possible. This information is set out from L-9's rather sketchy notes.
- 6. Since time was running short it was decided that B would drive L-9 cut to the airport so that he could pick up BETIDE. On the way to the airport L-9 asked if he might "have a bit of time off to settle his nerves" so it was decided that no meeting would be held for two weeks. NEXT MEETING: 2000 hours Thursday 30 Jan at the safehouse.

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7. A good bit of time at this recting was devoted to rebuilding a shattered L-9 and a bit of bald flattery helped to do the trick. It was made clear to L-9 that, as he must already know, we are constantly looking for other agents within the Cuban government and, naturally, in the same Embassy where he works. He was teld that while it must be apparent to anyone that a DSE officer would be worth more from the standpoint of access to information of value than an officer in L-9's position, L-9, because of his unusual perspicacity, was considered to be an exceedingly valuable asset. This word — perspicacity — did the trick; he picked it up and used it (surprisingly stumbling over it in his native Spanish each time) and "agreed" that it fit him to a "T." His flagging spirits were about back up to normal when the meeting enied. It is clear that he was absolutely terrified at the thought of using a safe apartment which he thought would be used by other agents. Even though he was disabused of this idea he was not quite over the shakes by the end of the evening. At the next meeting B is going to digress a bit and discuss Spanish literature of the Golden Age with L-9 — anything to calm him down!

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8. OPERATIONAL NOTE: The MITRAP phone is still in APARICIO's old office. The Conversial Section is expected to move into this area shortly at this time the office is not in use. APARICIO might go back in there himself. Lately the office has been used for storage while new construction is in pregress.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE RECORD

Meeting with LITANIL-9, 6 January 1964

1. A meeting was held with L-9 from 2000 hours until 2320 hours 6 Jan - pick-up and drop-off were made by ear, the meeting took place at B's home with B's wife working the gate.

2. L-9 was musually depressed -- had just received a letter from Spain indicating that his sister had been forced to leave her work as a result of excessive fatigue and the "never ending round of discussions and study circles" etc. She had not received much sympathy from the Cuban FOMIN and her request for 2 months leave in Spain was denied pending further study. L-9, who is quite fond of his sisters, took this new to heart and it ate away at him and compounded his usual reservable feeling. The first part of the meeting was taken up in a C/O delivered pep talk.

3. L-9 had the following to report:

a. At the evening reception of 2 Jan at the Embassy, the TASS representative remarked that he believed KHRUSHCHEV did not travel to Cuba to attend the anniversary celebrations because of the revelation of an exile plot to bomb Havana -- revelations which came about as the result of the arrest by the US Coast Guard of some var-like Cubans with bombs in their possession. The TASS man said that he believed that KHRUSHCHEV would show up scheday in Havana quite unannounced as did CASTRO in the USSR.

Terera-FROENZA may be hired back by the Embassy -- APARICIO recently remarked to L-?, "Surely they will re-hire her." It is quite clear that APARICIO doesn't want her in his office again and he expressed the wish that if she were to be rehired she would work in the main embassy building.

In regard to the PROEMA firing, ROJAS of Cubana de Aviacion, who is married to Tereca's sister, said that he had written to FOMI; Raul ROA in her behalf but had received no reply.

Ambassador HERMAIDEZ Armas sent a Christmas present to COMOSTIZA of the Maricon Foreign Office this year - it was really a New Year's present, sent 31 Dec. L-9 does not know what it was.

4. L-9 was asked whatgall the ruckus was at the simport on 5 Jan. This drew a blank. B then said he had heard that a phalanx of Emtassy officers was out there apparently guarding someone who was on his way to Cuba. L-9 didn't know anything about it. B remarked that two Cuban officials were supposedly on the flight to Havana -- one from the Embassy in Montevideo. At this point, L-9 slarped his felherd and said, "My Goi, FEREZI I forgot about him." He then related the details of a conversation he had had with EarleyPEREZ Friman at the Enbassy on 2 Jan - datails sent to HQS separately by cable. (See HEXI 7659 L-9 was not aware that FEREZ had been on the 5 Jan flight -- he described him perfectly. He was not made aware of KUBARK involvement in the alleged "assault" nor was he told anything about PEREZ' appearance at TPENDE.

5. L-9 identified a number of persons appearing in the photos taken at the diploratic reception held at the Embassy 2 Jan. Identifications were noted

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on the photos.

- 6. L-9 revealed that he had relocated in the New Year at Nico GARCIA: home -- at Migot's invitation, When Nico picked him up at the Empassy they made a swing by a house at 131 Al janiro Duran, Polance, where Mico wanted to drop a comple of bottles off with a friend hand Mary, a Cuban, L-9 tried to remain in the car -- was not dressed for calling -- but Nico insisted that he come in. Mary was not there but her sister was -- she had just recently arrived from Cuba, Another Cuban and woman were there -- anti-Castro types who were very sed at being eary from their homeland - the man was softly crying -- probably a bit liquored up. Nico fit right in -- L-9 says that he is a master at getting along with people, even those on the other side of the political fence, (This tallies with info on file). The Mexican landlady -- an old crone -- tried to put the make on L-9, really flipped for him, and wanted him to stay but he and Nico finally drove off. L-9 does not know who these people are (to be checked out). They then went over to Nico's placewhere L-9 joined the family for a Cuban dinner. Nico's mother-in-law was there ishe recently came out of Cuba to be with her daughter (Nico's wife) while she has a buby - due goon. Jorrin a peared goon thereafter and joined in the meal. Nico put on some popular and light classical records, working his way from dance music to Tchcikovsky. When a carload of Embassy people -- Rogelio RODRIGUEZ and wife, Dra. MACHADO, Berta MACHADO, and Buenaventure REYES appeared in front Nico quickly took off the music and put on a record of Fidel CASTRO intoning his Second Declaration of Havana - the new arrivals were greeted with this as they care in the door. L-9 says that Nico is a superb actor and know just what to do when the Patria o Muerte types showed
- 7. In response to questioning L-9 revealed that Nico looks upon him as a Fidelista but definitely not a Communist. He says that Nico is very self assured, a calm man who cannot be ruffled! He appears to have no complexes about being a Negro. Asked whether he felt there might be any chance that Nico would cooperate against CAST(0), L-9 said, "Let us face the fact that many people are becoming more and more convinced that the revolution is here to stay. This man GARCIA is one of them. On the other hand, if he could be "got to" he would be invaluable. He would be a great loss to the Embassy. I would say that the chances are slin but it would probably be worth the effort to try to win him over. He has many friends from all walks of life, many of them among the anti-Castro elements."
- 8. L-9 showed B some documents regarding Cultural plans of the Embassy which did not seem to merit reporting. He turned over two long lists of persons invited to the 2 Jan receptions.
- 9. L-9 reported that Mr. Dudley MOMPSON, an opposition senator from Jamaica had been in town and he identified THOMPSON from among those photographed at the Diplomatic Reception of 2 Jan. T was in Nairobi, Kenya, two weeks ago and arrived in Mexico from Miani on 1 Jan. He hoped to continue on to Cuba right away but was unable to make the trip since he could not be assured of getting there and back to Jamaica by 6 Jan -- he had to be in Jamaica on the 6th to attend a meeting of those opposing the BUSTAMANTE regime and had to attend another meeting on 10 Jan which was to be attended by Cheddi JAGAN of British Guiana and leaders from Earbados. He hoped to be able to go to Cuba to see Jesus CANIZARNS of the INNA in order to brief C about land reform measures in Kenya. He told L-9 that he would probably be back in Mexico in February 1964 to arrange to go to Cuba, L-9 says that T appears to be a very will educated, bright person.

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10. The latter portion of the meeting was taken up with small talk, good Cuban cigars, and a bit of scotch. L-9 relaxed a bit to some Brazilian music and even produced a few laures when a couple of canady records by the Spaniard Gila were put on. By 2300 hours he secred to have calmed down completely. It is a shape this man cannot take a vacation but apparently under present Cuban Foreign Office rules all vacations of any length must be taken in Cuba -- since L-9 is seeing goblins under his bed every day it is not likely that he would profit much from a sojourn inside Cuba at this time. He does not appear to be in danger of cracking up at this time but if the Cuban problem should remain unsolved for another year or two it is likely that L-9 might care apart from the strain he feels he is under. Pep talks and remotivation sessions will continue to be required in handling this agent.

11. DEVELOPMENTS: On 7 Jan B looked over a prospective safe apartment near the bullring -- well away from Polanco, where L-9 lives, and Louis, where the C/O lives. This apartment would appear to be ideal for meeting L-9 and if secure arrangements can be made for renting it, it will be used for that purpose.

12. NEXT MEETING: Thursday 16 Jan. Auto pick-up at new pick-up point, phone booth on corner east of the LIECERIA in Louis -- on Reforma.

SUBJECT: Meeting with LITAMIL-9, 27 December 1963

1. A meeting with L-9 was held in B's car from 2000 until 2140 hours 27 December.

2. LITANUL-9 reported on the recent firing of Tercoe PROFINA Promosa #359 6 and this was made the subject of two cables to Headquarters in view of her importance in the ALMOD operation. (See NEXI 7613 and NEXI 7625)

3. L=9 was asked for further detail on <u>Silvia Durants</u> statements regarding the visit of Les Harvey Commid to the <u>Ouban Consulate</u> in September. He had no further information to offer about this but reported that Silvia had not returned to work at the Consulate since her release from arrest the second time. This was reported to HQS. (See MEXI 7615)

4. B apolegized for not having been able to find in the States some oil paints which L-9 needs. Six different art supply dealers in Arizon and California were tried without results. The paints will be requested from EQS.

- 5. L-9 reported on the following additional topics:
- a. L-9 had received as of that date only one Christmas/New Years greeting card from a Mexican Government official. In past years he received large numbers of these cards. The one cans from the Mexican Sub-Director of Cultural Relations. L-9 ascribes this to the resonance caused among Mexican officialdom by the strong note received from Raul ROA, Cuban FOMEN, in regard to the detention of Silvin Duran. Apparently word had been passed to Mexican officials that they were to give the Cubans the cold shoulder.
- b. Reidelfo REYES, a Mexican citizen who works in Cuba for the Cuban Featro Felkicrico, was recently in term. He said that Fidel CASTED had recently remarked that Cuba should use its theatrical group to earn dellars abread, REYES said that a M. FLANGHON and oin other Parisian empresaries connected with the Tentro de las Naciones in Paris would be travelling to Cuba in the near future to see what could be done about putting the Cuban show on the read.
- c. The well-known Maxican carteonist RIUS (true mins Eduardo DEL RIO) who was scheduled to be a guest of the Guban government at the Anniversary celebration on 2 Jan in Havana, did not get a Guban visa. A cable came into to Embassy advising of this and caying that RIUS would be notified directly by a separate letter of the reasons for this refund. Since RIUS is an outstanding propagandlet for the Communist came, L-7 could only conjecture that this development was related to the RDA note flap and the Guban Government's desire to avoid antagenising the Memican government further. Another cartoonist, who uses a mane scheduling like RAM (?) also got the same treatment.
- d. Regelio RODRIGUEZ of the Embassy received some gifts from someone inside the Czech Embassy at Christmastime.
 - e. An Australian newspaper in named Julian or Julian ROPERTSON was in town on 23 December, staying at Room both of the Gran Hotel Isabel, Isabel La Catolica # 65. She was trying to get a vica to visit Outu but was unsuccessful

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and returned to Fannua whene the had come to pick up transportation to Australia. She wanted to interview Fidel CASTRO.

- g. About two weeks ago (as of 27 Dec) FOMIN ROA sent a note to the Embassy announcing that the former home leave practice of giving Embassy functionaries 1 month in Cuba after 11 months abroad had been changed to 2 months in Cuba after 22 months abroad. This change is an economy measure -- according to MINREX too much money is being spont on official travel. Embassies were also cautioned against spending so much on cables -- it was announced that a study had shown that the COC was spending much more on cables than other governments with similar representations abroad.
 - h. Two Embassy functions were to be held on 2 January (anniversary celebrations) -- one in the afternoon, one in the evening.
 - i. Raul APARICIO Negales seems glad that Teresa PROENZA has been fired -- now he is really bees of the Cultural Office.
 - j. INTERIAN seems like a "police type" -- he is always out of sight and is apparently doing some secret work. Code work ?
 - R. A Canadian Communist was recently in the Embassy: Michel CHARTPAND, President of the Socialist Farty in Quebco, 1870 Est. Foul. St-Joseph, Montreal, Quebco, Canada, phone 522 8119. This man is a printer, establishment called Presses Sociales, 54 Foul. Quinn, phone 674-1231. He was sent to the Cuban Embassy by America Crun, Cuban Ambassador to Canada, and planned to travel to Cuba en 30 Dec. He tried to get Ambassador Hermandez Armas to put him is touch with "Genmunist Forty and Socialist Farty representatives in Mexico." Armas seemed quite upset about this, teld L-2 "put him in touch with the FRI and LOMEARDO Toledano -- noone else." CHARTRAID was public and not at all pleased by this brush off.
 - 1. Teresa FROENZA recently said that Coty SCLORZANO has a lover in Mexico named Jesus SOTO.
 - m. The Commercial Department is taking over the offices now occupied by the Cultural Office. New partitions are being built.
 - n. Exceptio AZCUE went to see Dr. DOFAL (father of Elsa DOFAL the Dr. is now in the US) before he left for Cuba second very nervous. The doctor told him baldly, "The reason for your nervousness is that you are returning to Cuba and you don't really want to go!" AZCUE didn't centradict him.
 - o. A comple of Cuban non -- one Negro, one white, have been staying at Calle Marando 17h. The white min is nomed (finu) MODRIGUEZ and is hoping to get a visa to go to Brazil on some sort of mission. The Negro has already returned to Cuba.

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- 6. L-9 erro up with that he inquisit might be a good CA girmick: The Outen Intercy is blessening cut, with less of care experently nore than the ruch larger Scribs. L-9 thinks it might be a good idea to make some hay by planting in a local paper scription about this and mentioning that the Outens are living like fat case or arms expelied by the Soviet Union while the Soviets are publing in their belts and commissing he feels this might cause some friction between the Outens and Soviets and might cause some disconforture to the Outens in any event.
- To L-9 gave B a book on archaeology (favorité subject) as a Christmas present -- also à few good Chian eigars.
- 8. L-9, asked about repercussions of he ROA note to the Mexican Foreign Office, said that talk about this is tabu in the Embassy he has heard no-one discussing it. His percentl opinion was that ROA went off half cocked.
- 9. Next meeting: 6 Cannary -- REFORMA Londs, half a block south of the LIBRERIA (nw pick up point).
- 10. ACTION: Get a safehouse for mostings with L-9. A-lead on what sounds like a good apartment will be followed up 7 January.
