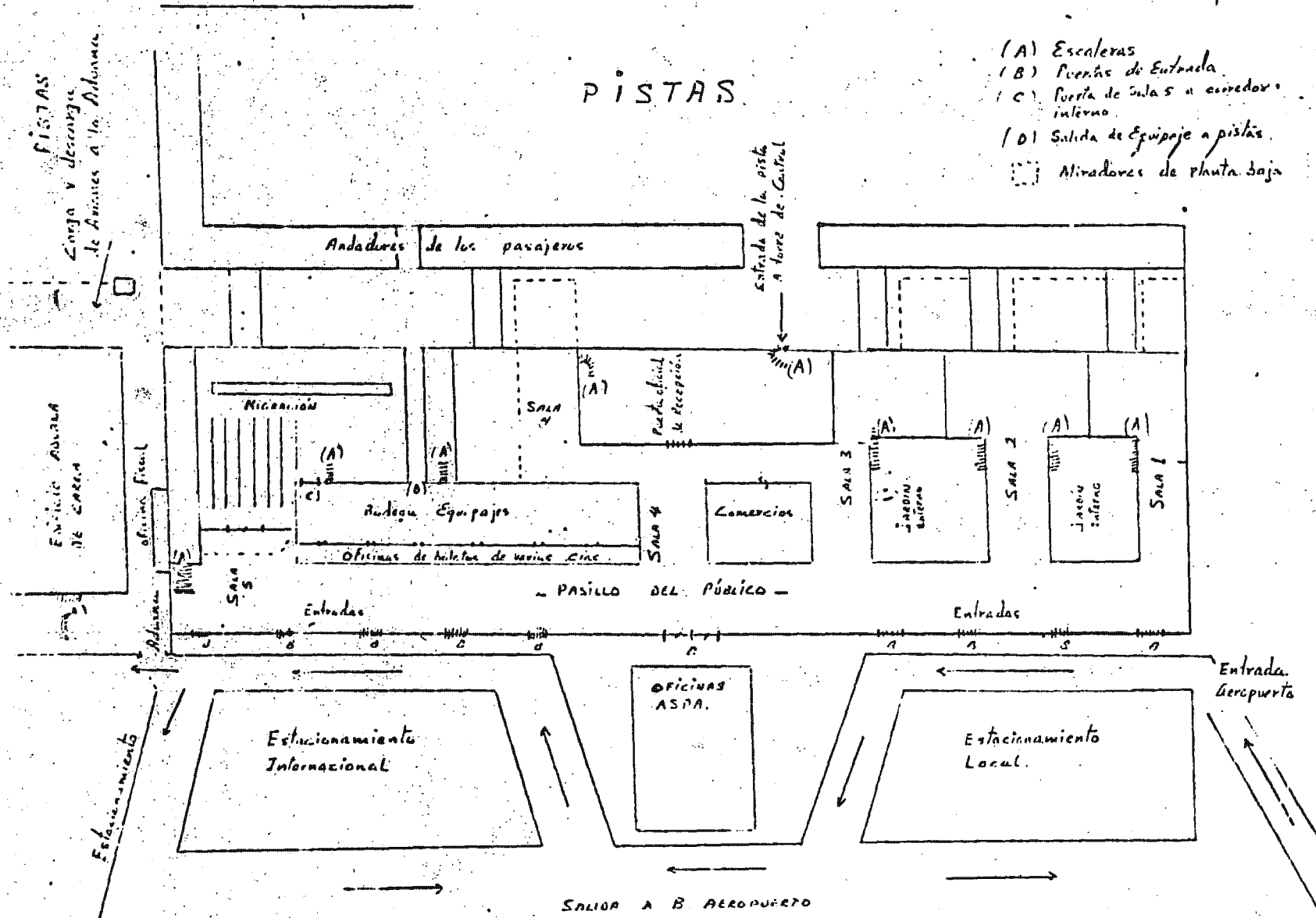
1. KDLADDER-2 ADVISED THAT JOAQUIN NOVAL FUENTES ARRIVED IN MEXICO CITY FROM A TRIP TO COSTA RICA AND NICARAGUA ON 31 MAY 1972. NOVAL WAS TO RETURN TO GUATEMALA ON THE WEEKEND OF 10 JUNE. NO DETAILS AVAILABLE ON TRIP WHICH FOR MOST PART SPENT IN NICARAGUA, PRESUMABLY WITH OFFICIALS OF THE PCN. NOVAL LEFT MEXICO CITY FOR SAN JOSE SOMETIME IN LATE APRIL 1972.

2. ON 8 JUNE 1972, "ALVARO", A YOUNG MEMBER OF THE PGT LEADERSHIP IN SAN MARCOS, RETURNED TO GUATEMALA VIA TAPACHULA AFTER SPENDING OVER A MONTH IN MEXICO. ALVARO WAS WOUNDED AND HAD COME HERE TO CONVALESCENCE.

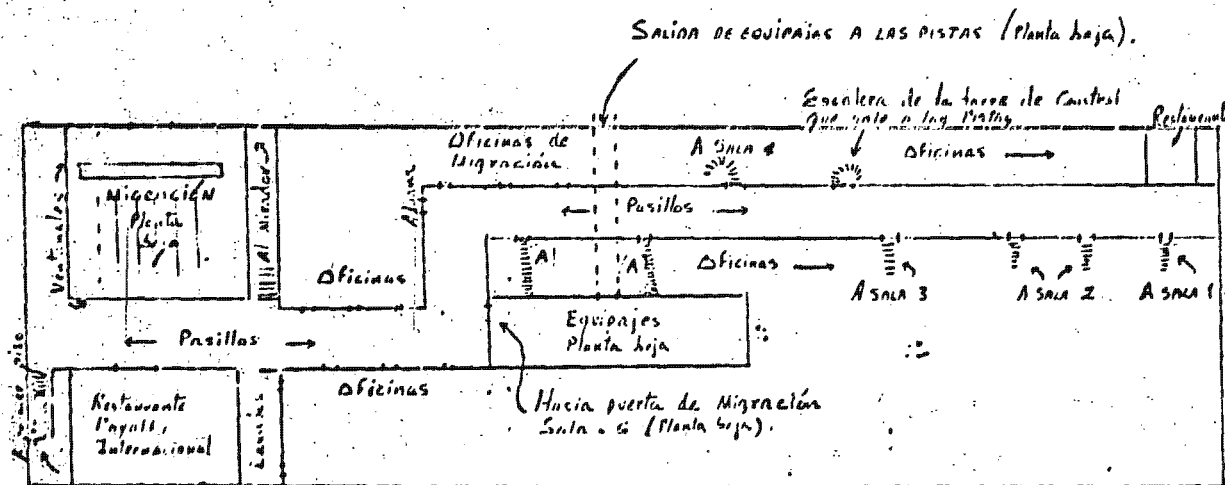

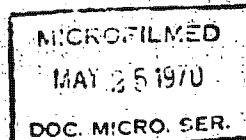


AEROPUERTO 1. de la Ciudad de México.

SUBJECT C: Frank Camden (U), (AFISHD HQD 127-498)

1. Your memorandum entitled Frank Camden (U) dated 9 March 1970 provided this Agency with an operational plan and a photograph of Subject who was scheduled to meet with a Soviet contact in Mexico City on 14 March 1970.

2. Our memorandum entitled Frank Camden (Case HQD 127-498), dated 19 March 1970, provided you with the results of the scheduled meeting and available details on a male who appeared at the meeting site. Our representative in Mexico City subsequently reported that this male was photographed. Attached are three photographs of this individual. Our representative in Mexico City also reported that this individual is not identical with any Soviet who is currently assigned to Mexico.

3. From a visa request, with photograph submitted, to the American Embassy in Mexico City on 3 April 1970, this individual has been identified as Yuriy Dmitriyevich Bulygin who was born on 18 June 1929 in Leningrad, USSR. He carries Soviet diplomatic passport No. 029475 which was issued on 10 February 1970. His Mexican visa was issued in Moscow on 19 February 1970 and is valid for forty days. Bulygin transited Brussels on 7 March 1970, and flight manifests show that he arrived in Mexico City on Sabena flight 555, on 7 March 1970. He was to depart Mexico City for New York on Air France flight 700 on 8 April and was scheduled to fly AEROFLOT

to Moscow on 9 April 1970.

4. Bulygin is a known GRU officer according to Oleg Penkovskiy. From 18 December 1964 to 4 June 1969 he was assigned to the Soviet Embassy, Bangkok, Thailand, as a Second Secretary and Information Officer. Bulygin has been very active in the cultivation of United States citizens in the United States Air Force. Based on Bulygin's itinerary, TDI status, and background, we believe he went to Mexico specifically for the meeting with Camden.

5. We would appreciate receiving the dates, and if possible copies, of the three letters sent to Camden by his former Soviet handler, Aleksandr Yegorovich Matyehkin, Third Secretary Soviet Embassy, Bangkok, and suspect GRU officer, which were mentioned in your memorandum dated 9 March 1970. Also please advise this Agency if Camden can identify the attached photographs and add any information to our current knowledge of Bulygin.

6. In a memorandum dated 8 April 1970, the Federal Bureau of Investigation requested this Agency to forward to them results of the photographic surveillance of the 14 March 1970 meeting site. It is suggested that your office forward a summary of the above information, along with copies of the attached photographs, to the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

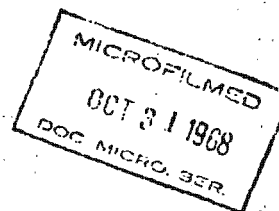

DIBUJO COMPLEMENTO DEL REPORTE DEL DIA 2 DE OCTUBRE DE 1968.

En este dibujo tratamos de explicar mejor y dar una idea como entraron los soldados y de donde les dispararon.

Los monitos que aparecen en primer termino son los soldados con flechas por donde llegaron los circulos pequenos los estudiantes que escuchaban a los oradores.

Los monitos del fondo son los hombres que reportamos vestidos de obscuro, con gabardina y sombrero, que se parapetaron en los elevadores, para disparar desde alli.

Los monitos del tercer piso (parece que fue el cuarto piso) son los oradores y de donde iniciaron el fuego contra los soldados y practicamente tambien sobre los mismos estudiantes.

Y por último arriba del lado izquierdo donde estaban nuestros hombres los Nos. 4, 10 y A.

REPORTE DE LOS DISTURBIOS OCURRIDOS HOY EN LA PLAZA DE LAS
TRES CULTURAS DE CIUDAD TLATELOLCO.

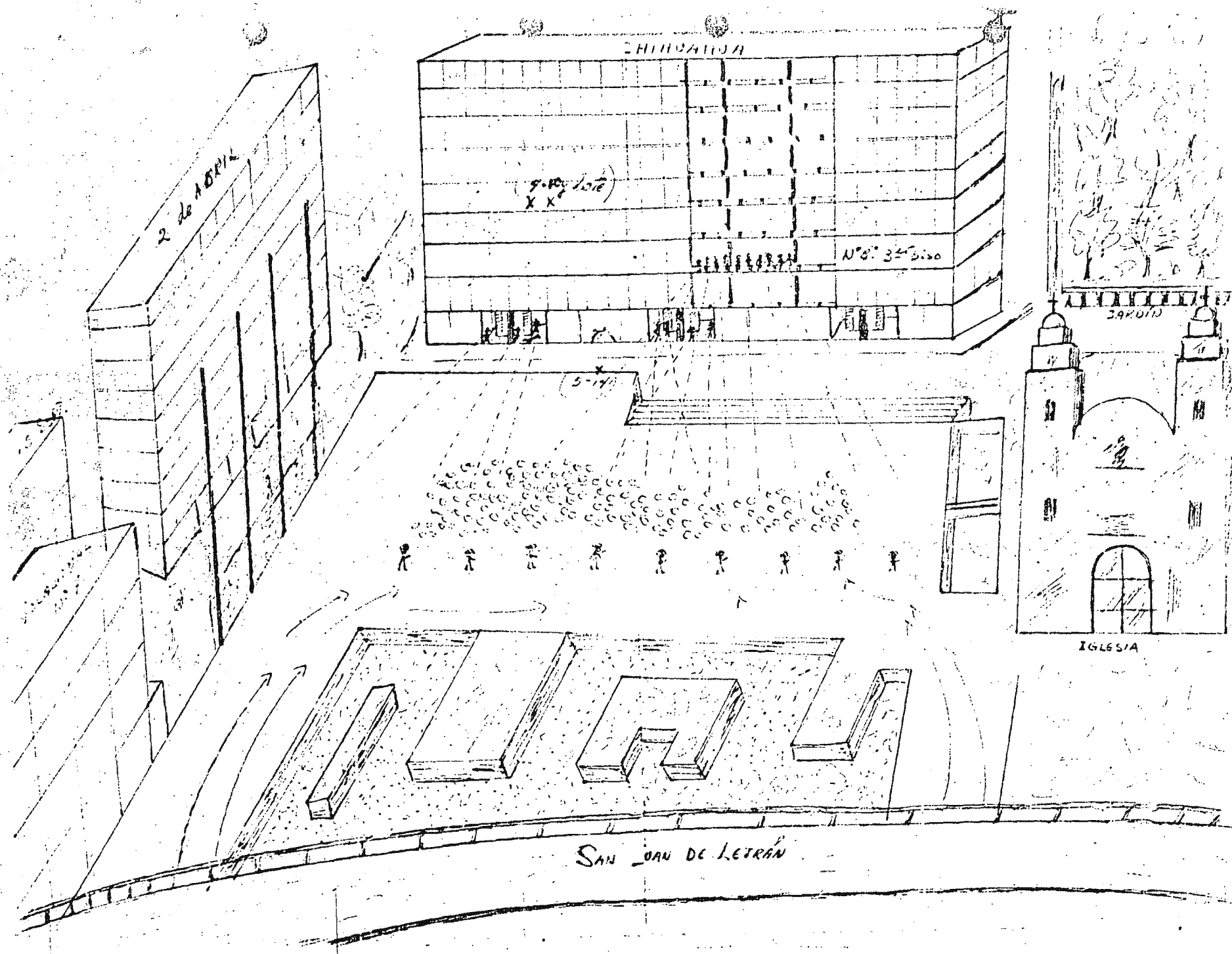
- 1615 Presentes en la Plaza de las Tres Culturas de Tlatelolco. A esa hora, como amenazaba lluvia, se ve poca concurrencia de estudiantes. Checamos los alrededores y vemos que van llegando estudiantes de varias partes en grupos pequeños, más o menos de seis personas. Localizamos en la esquina de la calle de Manuel González e Insurgentes siete carichos con granaderos y tres más de pasajeros con granaderos también.
- 1725 Ante una multitud de aproximadamente cuatro mil personas, la mayoría con tipo de estudiante, se inicia el mitin. Primeramente toma la palabra un hombre joven quien dice que la manifestación que tenía planeada de ese lugar hasta Santo Tomás ya no se va a efectuar porque se tienen informes de que hay granaderos y soldados apostados en el trayecto planeado. (Ya tenían mantas con letreros ofensivos al gobierno, al presidente y a los granaderos, listas para usarlas en el desfile). Les dice que la suspenden para evitar violencias; pero les promete que harán otra al Zócalo y que después se les informará la fecha.- En seguida hablaron cuatro miembros del Comité de Huelga. No dieron sus nombres, sólo la escuela a la que pertenecían. Uno de la Escuela de Economía del IPN, otro de la Facultad de Ciencias Políticas de la UNAM, otro de Ingeniería Textil del IPN y otro de Físico Matemáticas del IPN. Todos coincidieron en atacar al gobierno, a la prensa y al presidente. Propusieron se formaran brigadas para politizar al pueblo, visitando fábricas, colonias y parques públicos. Propusieron también boicotear a la prensa, no comprando periódicos y no comprar ropa para boicotear al comercio.
- 1915 Llegan los soldados en varios camiones por la Av. San Juan de Letrán, por el Norte y por el Sur. Se bajan con bayoneta calada invitando a los estudiantes a dispersarse sin hacer uso de la violencia. Cuando los soldados se acercaron a la tribuna de oradores fueron recibidos a balazos con pistolas y metralletas por un grupo corto de 12 sujetos jóvenes vestidos con pantalones negros, gabardinas negras y sombreros que estaban abajo de la tribuna. También recibieron tiros de las los pisos altos de los edificios.

Quando los soldados respondieron el fuego, los sujetos vestidos de negro se parapetaron en los elevadores que estaban abiertos. Dichos empistolados disparaban pecho a tierra. Los soldados fueron auxiliados por agentes probablemente de la DFS vestidos como estudiantes con ropa sport, los cuales se distinguían por traer únicamente un guante en la mano derecha. Hubo numerosas bajas en las filas de los soldados, sin poder precisar el número de muertos o heridos. Los soldados se dedicaron a hacer prisioneros y a los que se decimajenos al fin les pedían su identificación. La balacera en forma intensa duró aproximadamente una hora. Los estudiantes dispersados se dedicaron a incendiar autobuses y tranvías.

El edificio que está frente a la tribuna de los oradores se incendió al romperse las tuberías del gas, lo cual pudo ser accidental o provocado. El edificio fue evacuado y vinieron los bomberos. Por este motivo ^{hubo} una tregua en la balacera; pero en cuanto se dominó el incendio y se oscureció siguieron disparando a los soldados desde los pisos altos. Así continuó la situación hasta las 2330 hs. en que nos retiramos por haber sido cortada la circulación en una zona muy grande de la ciudad alrededor de Tlatelolco.

En mi opinión, los estudiantes ya estaban preparados para provocar el choque y tenían armas y municiones en algunos lugares de los edificios.

Un grupo de estudiantes de los que fueron dispersados iba por el jardín que está en Lerdo y Sol y al pasar una camioneta panel con xxx policías les dispararon numerosos tiros. No pudimos ver si hubo heridos o muertos, porque la camioneta no se detuvo sino que aceleró más.

In June 1968 LIEMERACE team provided good surveillance of Griselda LOPEZ, Panamanian double agent working for ACSI and KGB. When cross checked with ACSI, the results of the surveillance should give a very useful indication of her reliability.

Since there has been almost no reporting on the very important subject of Communist influence in the Mexican education system in recent years, this report was received with appreciation. It is however, a very small drop in the well of our need. Since the last reporting on the subject the entire teacher and student situation has changed and the bare facts and names in this report are just a small portion of what Mexican analysts need to know. How influential as teachers are these Marxist SNTE officials? Do they have much political influence, either nationally or locally? (One of the most suspect former SNTE officials, Jorge Cruickshank, is now a federal deputy. Why?) The SNTE is also an important segment of the FSTSE, Federation of Government Employees. Does the Marxist influence extend significantly into FSTSE?

More information on student groups in Mexico, particularly at the university level, would be very helpful in better understanding events like the recent-- and continuing difficulties in Puebla. Communist influence among them is known to exist, as it is in Morelia, at UNAM and elsewhere, but there has been no information received on the subject in recent years. Even the reporting on Bremauntz' assumption of the rectorship at Morelia was more confusing than enlightening, as has been the reporting on Ignacio Chavez, rector at UNAM. IS he or isn't he working with the Communists? We know he's far leftist but there is much more that could be ascertained about him, as, for instance, why he moved as strongly against Communist student groups as against others early in this administration.

With a new govt about to take office, the role of teachers, students and other interest groups will change. Significant reporting, not just unrelated details would be appreciated.
