Members of the Flemish Social People's Movement (Vlaamse Sociale Volks-Beweging) led by the Movement's speaker, Gerard Koops of Herzele, Belgium, LHB Rue Mitoyenne, took part in the special congress of the European Liaison Center (Europäische Verbindungsstelle - EVJ) held at Huisingen, near Brussels, on 9 October 1954. This congress was dissolved by the Belgian police. (Another section of the congress was held in Lubeck and was not disturbed by the police.) At this Belgian congress, G. A. Axandrus of Lensame, leader of the EVJ, was asked to comment on the decisions reached at the Rome and Kalmec congresses. When he revealed that he had no information on this subject, he was accused by members of the Flemish Social Movement of trying to split up the nationalist forces of Europe. The Flemish delegation, embittered by Axandrus's position, left the congress before it was over, and gave their representative Koops only authority to discuss with the European Social Movement (Europäische Soziale Bewegung) ways of cooperating with this latter group. Koops, in turn, charged that the LHB special congress had failed completely in all aspects, that the EVJ had unclear political goals, and that its leaders did not command confidence.
