Loud street noises. No conversation at beginning of reel. Mr. and Mrs. KALININ exchange a few comments.

#### 2 August 1970

- A. KALININ
- B. KALININA

no - it's BAKULIN

- C. Valya (Valentin lnu, possibly SOKOLOV)
- D. Valya's wife

((Pootsteps, fragments of conversation at first.))

B. and D. discuss the cost of mattresses in various stores and where it is best to buy a mattress. B. says. "My friend Klava ((lnu)) bought one ((a mattress)) in New York, but since they were at the UH, all their furniture was bought at their own expense; the transfer/moving of their furniture ((probably back home)) was free. That mattress is just lying unused at the dacha. She doesn't need it. They don't live at the dacha. They're in Yugoslavia now. Her mother and father don't live at the dacha and it will probably be rented out. If I give Klava \$50 for it, she'll be glad to give it to me." A, comments, however, that it makes no sense buying the mattress from Klava because it is old already, the springs have rusted, etc. Furthermore, sending the mattress ((new)) back home won't be expensive - "the distance is small, and then by ship to Leningrad. He feels it's better to buy it here and send it. D. suggests "writing to the diplomatic mail," but C. says, "We don't have direct mail; we have to write through MID."

D. then talks about an employee ((unidentified)) who, in answer to Lena's ((lnu)) query how she should correspond with Vera ((lnu)) had "said in such a presumptuous tone — 'You can stand being without correspondence for a year.'" D. feels the same man had been upset because he had not been appointed an official/5" (nachal'nik), but had said later, "What am I upset for? If they don't want me, so what!" In connection with this B. says, "There's some sort of arrogance here; it's necessary to stay as far as possible from it."

SECRET

C. and D. ask that A. and B. ((presumably)) write a letter to some acquaintances ((unidentified, probably in the Soviet Union)) and find out "whether we can depend on them and if we are going to stop for a day, how much this will cost approximately, and where best is it to stay." D. adds, "I don't think it's necessary to mention the mattress. When we arrive there, we'll make arrangements about it. If it's no, then no. I'll manage very well. I have two very good beds." ((Apparently C. and D. are departing soon.))

D. continues that her friend Shura (Aleksandra - lnu) wrote her that she is frequently ill and it's difficult for her with only one mattress. However, D. has room to sleep three, a divan and two beds.

If someone visits, "Valya ((her husband)) and I sleep in one bed, but if I'm sick, I sleep on the divan, while Vovka ((her son, probably)) and Valya sleep on the beds. It's possible to maneuver somehow. If we had one bed and someone came to visit, it would be very difficult."

C. suddenly asks if they know a "hooligan" song, and at the request of the women he sings it. All laugh, after which D. tells a dirty joke. Again all laugh. After this they criticise modern youth. C. comments, "Education has a great influence on people." D. says, "You know, when I worked in (? our ?) department/administration there was a very pleasant engineer there. He was 45 years old. His daughter finished the Medical Institute. She went to work and then all the patients began to complain to the chief physician about her rudeness. She started to be terribly rude at home. Then it began, - she started cursing and hitting. They examined her and she had something wrong with (1-2G) and they put her in the insane asylum. Then periodically she was calm, was at home, and then suddenly she again became violently coarse. She was 24 years old but their other daughter was 6 years old, can you imagine? They were afraid she would beat the little girl to death. If she was home alone, she would almost beat her to death. Can you imagine what a tragedy this is? They gave her all kinds of medicines. We had a private/exclusive polyclinic; there were many high officials (svetil) there. Nothing helped her. They said ((it was caused by)), 'Over strain.' A thinks that "people have become weaker" now. But B. says,

B. Vovochka, I think it's simply because there's more information now.

- A. You yourself remember how much information we received at (16) and none of us went insane during the entire five years. At the University you've got to consider it this way, if five persons ((?go nuts?)) during a session, that's a small number.
- B. ((insists)) There are very many ((going insans)). I have a friend ((female)) who is a psychiatrist. She told me that there are many (?who are ill -- mentally?), very many. Sometimes she doesn't know (?how to handle all her work?).
- A. ((jokingly)) Perhaps information is affecting me now and (2G) in a hospital? I haven't gone insane up to now, but perhaps it doesn't depend upon the amount of information, but on the type of information. ((All laugh.))
- D. Ec. Volodya ((A.)), it was simpler previously. If you keep looking at such things ((possibly referring to TV)), you'll have nightmares.
- B. I only watch 'Lassie.' You know, it's a dog. I like it. I always try to watch it and I'm always affected by it.
- A. You know, I think we're especially affected by it because we know the particulars. That dog isn't specially trained; it belongs to a family. And the mother of the boy is a housewife. They just announced that during ((school)) examinations, the boy will not be photographed. There's going to be a hiatus in the ((TV)) programs.
- B. Vovochka, are you going by car? You're not leaving soon, are you?

  Don't forget (? the box ?). I've already packed the box.
- D. Do you have boxes?
- B. I do. Valerka ((lnu)) left them for us. Our carpenter made them.
- A. I've been looked at those boxes. I think that I stay here for four years, we won't be able to pack our baggage according to the box sizes, but will have to do the opposite ((get boxes to fit the baggage dimensions.))
- B. You know, we don't have so much junk. We bought things, thinking... ((loud noise covers remainder of sentence)).
- A. I'm telling you, it makes sense to overpay for packing because then everything will be in order.
- B. We have (2-3G) \$750.
- A. But our ambassador (3-40), more expensive; that's understandable.

- But I'm paying 560 ((possibly dollars)) only half.
- B. (2-3G), \$3,000. The only thing is that we have to pay for an apartment there yet.
- A. We had a car, absolutely at our own expense.
- D. Tell me, why (2G)?
- B. They pay themselves now ((unspecified for what)). A woman went by plane; she paid.
- A. A year hasn't passed yet. They pay from September, or something like that. I think they started later, almost since January.
- B. There you are; (1G) arrived; (? he left ?) his car there for some reason.
- D. We don't have a car. Do you have a car?
- B. No.
- D. But he ((unidentified)) has one.
- B. There are two cars here for (2-3G). Oleg's ((1mu)) car (1-2G). But I don't understand why it's that way. Volodya spoiled him scandalously. He's young and he drives a car, but you're older and must...
- A. His wife can't walk.
- B. Too bad, let her move her ass.
  - (3-46), there was one car, one for two people. (3-46) That wife (16) is horrible/terrible. Valerka's ((lnu))/was in the hospital, ohildren
    Valerka's/were with me. I was working. Vovka ((lnu)) was taking care of them. Two little girls lived with me. So he ((unidentified)) called him ((Valerka)) and said, "Valera, put the car in for washing and I'll pick it up. I have to have it clean." He ((Valerka)) came to Valya ((D.'s husband)) and said, 'He didn't even ask how my wife is.' Valera had spent the night next to his wife Lyubka who had just been operated on. They cut out her glands under a general anesthetic; she was nauseous, but he said, "put the car in for washing; I need it," or, "wash the car'" In such a tone of voice.
- A. Such impudence!
- D. Yes. In general, his manner shows ((what he is)). He wasn't even interested in asking how his ((Valera's)) wife is, where the children are. That's unimportant to him. But wash his car for him, he needs it clean. I'll tell you, with such an

impudent person you can only be impudent because they ((such people)) don't understand.

- A. You see, in principle, he was a favorite/pet (lyubimchik); apparently he'll be that way now.
- D. But why do you think that he'll be that way now?
- A. Because he is also a khokhol ((derogatory term for Ukrainian)), (1-2G). ((Pause))
- D. Oleg three weeks ago or more (2G); he also knows how to be sick.
- B. Oleg knows how and she knows how.

  ((They are possibly talking about Oleg MECHIPORENKO or Oleg SHEVCHENKO, since both are Ukrainians, or as A. calls Oleg, "khokhol."))
- D. She was so (3-4G), turned about, and said nasty things about me.

  But outwardly she will chat and give a good impression. I recall

  when she came to the Embassy (3-4G).
- B. What is she, (20)?
- D. No, she was there (1-2G). In general, they scolded ((or, cursed)) and insulted her, and they scolded ((or, cursed)) Oleg... but Oleg is tactless in general.
- A. But he knows how to pretend to be tactful and courtsous.
- B. He once said some sort of thing you and I were sitting on the couch. I felt so (?awkward/uncomfortable?) "I'm probably 10 years older ((than you)). What right do you have to say such things." ((B. said to the man, probably the same Oleg.)) He said, "I was joking." I don't recall the joke, but it was so stupid, with some sort of vileness, that the joke was absolutely impossible.
- D. (?I liked?) it very much yesterday when Pavel ((lnu)) was joking.
- A. Pavel also knows how to joke.
- D. They/went swimming. Tamara said, "I don't feel well," and because of that she couldn't go swimming, that's without a doubt. He started pestering, "Girls, go swimming." We were bothered. Volodya didn't say a word, (?but he?) said, "Let's go swimming or else we won't feed you at lunch time. And Pavel kept insisting. But Tamara said, "Why are you pestering us. Maybe we can't go swimming." And Pavel said, "Oh! You're not at that age!" Can you imagine? She stared at him and didn't say a word.

- C. And how did you understand it when he tore her bathing suit?

  He came up and said, "VANOVSKIY, take away your wife's bathing suit because all her measurements can be seen." When she started telling him off!!!
- D. She really told him off. She's vicious; she gets wound up momentarily. Listen, I'll tell you this fact: women remain women. (?Once?) she got a pitcher and little napkins... Klava pulls out the pitcher with the napkins and says in front of everyone: "What do you do with this?" She answered, "I wash myself!" Kostya said, "You fool! Put it where it belongs!" Listen, strangers ((not identified)) were sitting there, can you imagine? And yesterday, well, all right, I'm older. Katya is older, but Tamara is younger than I.
- B. Tamara is probably 44. But, in general, that's not a subject for conversation with men.
- D. Any way, it's not that time yet when women have change of life.

  I don't even know how old Katya is. He was (? 50 years old ?).

  ((They are possibly talking about Pavel KOVALEV, the chauffeur, and his wife Yekaterina.)) No, you listen. He has the nerve to ask, "Who wants to see him ((lnu))?" ((Her comment to his question)) "What are you? Are you the Secretary or the First Department, or something? What business is it of yours who is going to ask for whom at the Embassy?"
- A. Whom?
- D. Well, when we arrived, he said, "Who wants to see him?" I said,
  "An acquaintance."
- A. Guess who! ((they laugh))
- D. No, I can't take him in such large doses! We had supper together the day before yesterday when we brought the boss/bosses. And Katya spilled wine on (?KUZ'MIN?). How he snapped at her!
- O. What happened there!
- D. How he did snap at her. Tamara said, "Such things aren't noticed usually." First he stared at her. That's his way, to stare first.
- A. He first has to let it sink in. Then he needs contact.
- D. I look, Katya was putting a whiskey glass on the table. (?The whiskey glass was empty?), and then he really let loose.
- B. Oh! So you were there?

- D. Well, that was the day before yesterday.
- B. Well, you should have said something about it. That's the version /episode we were talking about.
- A. I'm sorry for Katya. Those things frequently affect her quicker.

  She's simply affected more quickly by them.
- B. Ida ((DEMINA)) was saying, "I came upset at something at Sasha ((DEMIN)), it was something he did, or had not answered properly, and Katya said, "You see how spoiled you are, while all of my life I only see such things." When Ida started working, he chewed out Katya together with (1G), saying, "Go work. How is it that Ida went to work and you're sitting at home? The wife of an official went to work, but you sit at home?" He kept picking on her until the wife of (?KRASNOVSKIY?) there was such a man here until (?KRASNOVSKIY's?) wife came and told Ira about this and said, "Ira, speak with Semonovich ((lnu)) so that he will call Pavel in and speak with him." And Katya said, "Where am I going to work? I'm no good any more as a doctor's assistant (fel'dsher), and to go as a cleaning woman itsidifficult/hard for me now."
- D. Listen, of course. Tamara tells me that she is at the age when it's time for her to stop working as a cleaning woman. She has to guard her health. Her heart constantly (?hurts?) her.
- B. No, really? Konstantin Nikandrovich ((BOGATYREV)) asked, so she even began working in a second place.
- D. Yes? And how about that one ((woman)) who knows everything?

  Is she working already?
- A. I don't know. Those problems don't bother me at all.
- B. (3-4G).
- A. What's it to her. She can type on all typewriters, and with touch typing. She can also work as a bookkeeper. She can do anything you want.
- B. Listen, and how is (?SHCHUCHKIN's?) wife?
- C. (?SHCHUCHKIN?) arrived and the first thing he did was to run to me to work. He didn't discuss anything with (?Vladya?), but ran to me asked where he could get a job for his wife. And that's with two children. They had five children.
- B. Maybe they feel the wife should work so there wouldn't be more

chiliren?

C. Further, he ran to the office, saying, "My wife knows English, Spanish; she knows the typewriter." He ran around everywhere.

And finally he got her in. And he's always around the Ambassador, and everything, and he finally got her a job. The children hang around in the Embassy and she works. Do you understand?

(?And that's?) the First Secretary: ((Pause)) Vovochka, shall we go ((probably by car))? I'm dragging you away from your wife.

((B. and D. chat about cooking various dishes for a while.))

a snag, however, in the wake of the Armidriff defection, and pessibly also due to the operation against AESEASICK. In most cases, our MHHARSH friends have suddenly become inaccessible. There were three functions of the Consular Corps, including the annual election of officers, within about two weeks of ARMIDRIFF's defection and subsequent press conference (which took some cracks at the members of the MHHARSH consular section, indicating that they spent 90 percent of their time doing intelligence work and very little time issuing visas). The MHHARSH representation in the Consular Corps Association had always been a strong one, and one of their people was normally an officer (formerly AED) I EHARD, more recently 201-305870). However, none of them attended any of these functions, including the elections. 201-305870, a consular officer, had an invitation to the home of Dexter E. ROSTEDT on 13 March. Not only did he not show up, ROSTEDT was never able to get him on the phone to confirm the invitation. A January volleyball match between the MHHARSH Embassy and LNPURE was supposed to have been followed by return engagements. 201-305870 was in charge of this, and he has suddenly lost interest in the follow-up. On the other hand, the MRHARSHers who belong to AllCOSAD have behaved more normally. ALJALISCO, the MHARSH representative on the AMCOSAD board of directors, took part in an excursion to Baja California 28 February (no LNPURE officers went) and was present with a half-dozen of his colleagues at the AMCOSAD annual election lunch on 19 March. (At the 19 March affair, AEJALISCO was uncharacteristically nervous, but would not say what was bothering him. It will be noted that the AESEASICK operation reached its denouement the night before.)

- 3. In support of the evidence above that the MHHARSHers have gone into their shell, at least to some extent, as a result of AEMIDRIFF's defection, LIBACON-1 has reported that a TDY technician with whom he had been working as a translator, told him that it was now much more difficult to get away to go out on the town with LIBACON-1. When asked why, he said it was due to AEMIDRIFF, "who really s--- on us, even we [TDYers] are being watched." In general, the line given out by MHHARSHers asked about AEMIDRIFF's defection sticks to the story that she was just a dumb secretary who fell in love with a Mexican. She not only knows nothing, she will probably be very sorry she ever had anything to do with that Latin Lover.
- 4. It is probable that the MHHARSHers will slowly come out of their shells and will begin to circulate once more. If so, the Station's policy of supplementing the SB operational program with personal contacts will continue, and, as stated, will concentrate on obtaining this type of contact with the selected targets. In this way, our assessment and knowledge of the target can be supplemented by a case officer's expert assessment. Headquarters will be kept advised of developments.
- 5. This dispatch was in preparation when Reference B arrived. The assessments of AEJALISCO and 201-305870, requested in Reference B, are included in the attachment. PCQs have been filled out in certain instances, and a batch on AEJALISCO will be forwarded shortly. The Spanish-language PCQ's promised in Reference B will be most welcome.

SUBJECT: Vincent P. RIZZUTO's Soviet Contacts

Largely through the medium of AMCOSAD, RIZZUTO has met a number of Soviets. With many it is little more than a nodding acquaintance, but with some it is a little deeper than that.

The latter are discussed below. It should be pointed out that each of these Soviets is very likely aware of RIZZUTO's RVROCK affiliation.

A. Valentin V. BAKULIN (201-201813) - RIZZUTO has known him for over two years. BAKULIN is a smooth-talking, smooth-appearing diplomat. He speaks excellent Spanish, but has never been known to talk about anything more controversial than the weather, the landscape, or his family. His wife is a pleasant woman, but she rarely accompanies him on excursions. He has a teen-aged son of whom he is very proud. The son visited him in the summer of 1969, and the son exhibited a pretty good working knowledge of English, which he had been studying in school in Moscow. BAKULIN appears to be a bit of a hypochondriac. He complains often of stomach ailments, and for this reason rarely takes a drink (at least in public). In spite of his good Spanish and his very presentable appearance, he does not seem to mix much with non-Soviets. In common with most of his colleagues (notably excepting Boris A. CHMYKHOV and Boris A. KAZANTSEV), BAKULIN seems to prefer the company of his own people, and does not go out of his way to talk to others. When he is approached, he is very asiable. He never talks about his job (he is one of the First Secretarics but does not appear to have any overt job), but did say once that he and CHMYKHOV could not go on home leave at the same time because one had to cover for the other. AMCOSAD functions appear to provide the only occasion for BAKULIN to appear in public. When RIZZUTO has been to functions at the Soviet Embassy, BAKULIN has always been the proper host -- polite and hospitable. The real BAKULIN never shows through. Since he is a neighbor (same floor of same apartment building) as well as frequent companion of CHMYKHOV, he is undoubtedly aware of the relationship between RIZZUTO and CHMYKHOV, and he stays out of it, probably on purpose.

B. Yuriy CHERNYSH (201-825743) - RIZZUTO has met CHERNYSH only three times, the firs two meetings being well over a year apart. However, all meetings resulted in relatively lengthy conversations. CHERNYSH made no bones about getting RIZZUTO's name correctly (most Soviets do not seem to bother and usually act as if they do not remember the name). He will talk, intelligently, about almost any topic, controversial or not. He is very intense, as if he is working hard to remember everything that was said, and every quirk





On 26 June 1969, LILYRIC reported seeing BAKULIN enter the Soviet Embassy in the company of a young man whom LILYRIC identified as BAKULIN's son. The BAKULINs have one son, Vladimir born 30 Juneary 1954 whe is presently studying in the USSR. Vladimir was in Mexico City visiting his parents in the summer of 1968 for summer vacations. There is no indication that BAKULINs son is again in Mexico visiting. Nonetheless, LILYRIC reported this young man as BAKULIN's son.

SUBJECT: ALCOSAD trib to Chinnahua and Pinazloa, 25-27 April 69

- among the 60 AMOSAD members who flew to Chihuahua on 25 April and thence as in the attached itinerary. Participation was heavily Western European, with relatively few Latin Americans and surprisingly only three Soviets (all with wives): CHMYKHOV, PHOVOROV, and BAKULTR. Other Bloc types were LUKASZ (poland) and DOSAI (Hungary), both with wives. No Cubansk. The trips was very interesting, and a resounding success.
- As usual, my conversations with the Soviets didn't amount None of the wives had anything to say, and they stuck to eachother like glue. PRO VOROV (P-2183) speaks only when spoken to and even then he says nothing. I don't know why they send him on these things. BAKULIN (P-6059) is a real somooth article. He mixes well, speaks excellent Spanish, but never discusses anything controversial -- the weather, the scenery, etc.. Ir CHU of China told me that Mrs. BAKULI: is a very intelligent and well-read woman. by buddy CHAKHOV/was of course wall over the lot. he is popular and charting but nobody has the faintest idea what he is talking about because he speaks such awaul Spanish. He wasn't up to his usual EXERCISE Tricks of pouring drinks for everybody. The three Sovs actually were quiet and well-behaved this time, probably because they were greatly outnumbered and all had their wives along. Except when CHATESV was going around making points, they stuck pretty nuch together.
- had a few brief con ersations with CHMYKHUV on Friday, but Mr. CHU was histarget for that evening. The CHMYKHUVs and CHUs shared a table for dinner, and Mr CHU reported the conversation to me id creat detail the following morning on the train. The main topic of the conversation wad the Chinese-Soviet border dispute,

and Chu took great delight in telling CHEYMHOV that the Poviets would have been better of if they had predicted CHEALG to stay in pure in Ghina. CHEYMHOV's point seemed to be that the dispute would eventually be settled. We is a great one for pouring oil on troubled vaters, no matter where they are. Mr. CHU said that CHEYMHOV and now only seeks him out on occasions like this, where waxes some sort of diplomatic function throws them together. We never makes a lunch date. CHU believes that this is in line title Soviet policy, which is to talk to Taiwan waxes government representatives without being saxwize conspictious about it. (CHEYMHOV sat next to Bill MILLS at the Foreign Minister's lunch for the ALCOSAD Junta Directiva on 23 April and spent most of the time talking about the same topic—or at least MILLS thinks that was shall be was talking about.)

I didn't see much of CHEYEDV on the train ride on Saturday (he was in the other car, and I didn't care to risk life and himb to pass inform one car to the other). At one sight-seeing stop I took a dicture for him (with his camera) of him pretending to rush his wife into the Barranca de Cobre. I kept telling them to back up, but they didn't go far enough. Dinner was rather late that night (2330 hours to be exact) didn't show up. CMAYAHOV claimed that she was tired and not hungry, but I wonder if he just told her to stay in her room. I was his target for the evening. He sat rext to me (we were at long tables) and as he was at the end I was his only conversation partner. All I got out of it was a strained left ear. The conversation rarely got into serious topics (once he said we were making good propaganda in Czrchoslovakia, to which I replied that propaganda was hardly necessary since the facts speak for themselves. He simply shrugged atthis and cha ged the subject.) He also, apropos of nothing that I can remember, started talking of X SORGE and spies. I went along with the gag and told him he'd better leave his camera belind when he we went to Topolobanno or held be accused of spying on the port facilities. This was gold for a few chuckles. He has brought up this topic before, and I can only assume it's his way of te ling me that he and I each xxx we're in the same

business. He also told in that hold been in M Hew York once several years ago on a courier trip to the Soviet UN mission. I didn't really understand the point of his story. We also claims to be studying English several hours a week with Mrs. KUPLIAKOV.

I didn't a test his English, which can only be worse than his Aspenish if that's possible. He will be going on home leave this summer and will return for at least ant her year. CMLYKHOV had no real explanation for the fact that so wany Soviet regulars (free loaders) were missing from this trip. He said that KAZANTSEV was in Guadalajera on business, and that the others, like KUPLIAKOV, just couldn't get away (LTEVOY indicates that KOLUMIK OV and PROMHODKO canceled out at the last minute, reason not stated).

- 5. DSAI (P-12487), a very pleasant person, as is his wife, is about to leave PCS. His wife is eleaving in a month, and he will follow a nonth after that. They both claim to be looking forward to the teturn, although a more completely Westernized pair of Hungarians I have never seen. I can only assme they expect another tour abroad eventually.
- 6. LEKASZ (P-12468) denonstrated why Polack jokes are so widely told and believed. The property plane was not when we got on it, and he promptly to k off coat, tie, and sairt, and sat there in his undershirt.

- 7. MARRE, the German, slowed why Germans are still beloved throughout the world. Comenow they were not called by the hotel on Sunday morning. By the tile they figured the call might not come, the bus was ready to deave, so they got no breakfast. They got on the bus, when to Topolobampo and rubber-necked with the rest of us, an then announced that they were going to stay there to have breakfast. Someone offered to diffyethem to a rendezvous point to meet the bus, but even with that we had to wait a good half hour. They got

on the by pleasantly burping and picking their teeth and sat down without a word of apology. The only thing missing from this picture was a pur e made out of human skin for Mrs. NAMES. dishared a taxi from the airport Surday evening with the two Frenc, couples who were along, who were and ous to get back and checc the election results. They were pulling for DeGaulle. I wonder how much longer they'll be here.

. In response to a phone call from Subject, I met him from 1515 to 1545 at his hotel.

- 2. Subject told me that he's on the verge of bankruptcy and that this time He's not kidding. He has been unable to pay his employees their full wages and, recently, the newspapers have begun attacking him as a foreigner, exploiter of workers, etc. He seemed exceptionally cheery in spite of the gloomy prospects and I indicated that I feel sure He'll figure a way out of his problems. His one possibility is to get the money he needs from "Baby" but the price is too high: him. "Baby" would like Subject to divorce his wife which he refuses to do.
- 3. The main thing on Subject's mind was that he had a visit from Valentin BAKULIN (P- 6059) on Saturday, 22 February, at the factory. BAKULIN brought Subject a bottle of vodka and he bought about \$600 (pesos) worth of Subject's products to send back to the USSR. He apparently sent some previously and he said they went over so well that he wanted more. BAKULIN came with his wife and with another Soviet couple but Subject didn't know their names. BAKULIN said he's going to send Subject some little wooden dolls. BAKULIN brought regatds from CHMYKOV and from LOGINOV/ BAKULIN didn't have a card to leave with Subject

Physical Description: During her tour in Mexico BAKULINA was short, rather stout, had blond hair and occasionally wore glasses A phôtograph is attached (20).

in Mexico (2).

b. English: Subject spoke fair English in August 1960 (3).

### 9. PHYSICAL DESCRIPTION AND PHOTOS:

Photographs of Subject taken during his tour in Mexico are attached.

## 10. PERSONALITY, CHARACTER, HABITS:

In May 1963, Subject was reported to be drinking to excess and worried about his position and future (12). Also in 1963 he was reported to be very unprofessional in his handling of one agent, drinking too much and discouraged about his job (2). This information, obtained through two double agent cases, was not otherwise contirmed.

# 1. CURRICULUM VITAE:

"In 1950 a Valentin BAKULIN was mentioned as having spent several months in the Philippines reviewing the political situation and make a report on it to a conference in Prague which was concerned with working out a plan of action for the Far East." (6).

5 Nov 1959

Subject, accompanied by his wife and son, arrived in Mexico (1). Subject was assigned as Exployee of the Soviet Enbassy (10), replacing Viktor Lukich KHUKHOREV (201-192029).

19 Jun 1962

Subject, his wife and son left Mexico on home leave (3).

.

Subject, his wife and son returned to Mexico (11).

18 Sep 1962 12 Jan 1964

Subject, his wife and son left Mexico PCS (16). Subject was replaced by the same KHUKHOREV above (201-192029), who by then had been promoted to the rank of Third Secretary (3).

# 12. Intriligence Appiliation: Known GRU

Subject was the case officer for two double agents, one of whom has been handled by other GRU officers. On 24 February 1961 a caller was told that Subject could be reached on telephone number 055, which was the number of the Military Attache Office (2). On 28 June 1961, when Subject and known GRU officer Vladimir Nikolayevich Mayru (201-289295) were in Tampico, Subject called the Soviet Embassy and asked to speak to "one of our people, Pavel or someone else." Known GRU officer Pavel Fedorovich KOVALEV (201-029068) took the phone and talked to SMYSHLYAVEV, who said to tell their wives and Aleksandr Georgiyevich sIDOROV (201-018498, known GRU and presumed resident) that they would be back in Mexico City the following day. (3).

### 13. INTRILIGENCE ACTIVITIES:

a. On 30 December 1959 Subject took over a double agent from known GRU officer Pavel Fedorovich KOVALEV (201-029068). When Subject want on home leave in summer 1962, the agent was met on 7 July 1962 and subsequently by known GRU officer

Vadim Aleksandrovich SHENOK (201-278697). On 30 October 1962 SHENOK told the agent that he was now the regular case officer, although Subject had by then returned to Mexico. SHENOK left Exxico PCS, nowever, in July 1963, and on 3 September 1963 Subject again took the agent over. When Subject left Mexico in January 1966 he gave the agent emergency contact arrangements with one "Mikolas," who from the description should have been Subject's replacement, Viktor Lukich KHUKHOREV (201-192029). Since the agent then left Mexico, no contact with KHUKHOREV was made. In May 1964 the agent was picked up by known GRU officer Yuriy Nikolayevich ISAYEV (201-741377).

- b. In May 1963 it was learned that Subject was handling another double agent, on whom Subject levied requirements for US Army manuals and information on US air bases. Subject blast meeting with this agent was in October 1963. The agent is not believed to have been turned over to anyone else. (12, 13, 15).
- d. Cf. below for Subject's visit to Morelia, 17-18 April 1961.

### 14. ROR-INTELLIGENCE ACTIVITIES:

From at least May 1960 until the end of his tour in Mexico, Subject was reported handling the loan of documentary films from the Soviet Embassy, and as such he was nominally a member of the Cultural Section of the Embassy (3, 4). Subject took this job over from his predecessor, Viktor Lukich KHUKEOREV (4), and KHUKEOREV took the same job on again when he replaced Subject in 1964 (3). Subject's office hours in this job varied slightly but were notmally from 1000 to 1200 hours on Mondays and Fridays (3). Subject was also occasionally reported accompanying visiting Soviet delegations apparently as part of his Cultural Section duties (3). While Subject was on home leave in summer 1962, the loan of films was handled by Assistant Cultural Attache Nikolay Sergeyevich LEOMOV (201-132139, known KGB) (3).

In June 1960 Subject was reported to be living in Amatlan 123, Apt. 2 (5). On 22 August 1960 he moved to an unknown address (3). In June 1962 he was reported living at Cuautla 161, Apt. 7, where he is believed to have remained through the rest of his tour in Mexico (3).

Subject is reported to have taken the following trips in Mexico:

CA. 23-28 Nov 1960

Subject travelled with a visiting Soviet parliamentary delegation (3).

**3-5** Dec 1960

Subject was in Acapulco, probably attending the Film Festival (3).

ca. 14-21 Apr 1961

Subject, Yevgeniy Semenovich BOCHKOV (201-072041, suspect GRU) and Yuriy Konstantinovich ALEKSANDROV (201-262821, suspect KGB) visited Morelia and Guadalajara (3). On 17-18 April these three Soviets were reportedly in Morelia, where they reportedly gave money to Communist students with orders to burn down the US/Mexican Cultural Institute; this was done on 18 April after the Soviets had left town. (7, 9).

June 1961

On 22 June 1961, Subject and two other Soviets were reportedly in Maevo Laredo, probably to pick up a car (3), but they also reportedly distributed propaganda (9). On 28 June 1961 Subject and V. H. SHYSHLYAYEV were in Tampico, apparently an extension of the same trip, and planned to return to Mexico City on 29 June 1961 (3).

3 Dec 1962

Subject was reported in Acapulco, appareatly at the Film Festival (3).

During his toer in Mexico, Subject was reported constantly coming and going at the Soviet Embassy, even during the time when he estensibly had office hours. In 1959-60 Subject drove a car with diplomatic tags # 97; then from November 1960 until his home leave in June 1962 tags # 91 (changed to D-363 in January 1962) (this car was often used also by V. S. FROLOV); after his home leave he first used D-363, which was then taken over by Aleksandr Mikhaylovich DENISOV (201-726491, known GRU), and Subject switched to D-361, which was taken over by his successor, V. L. KEUKEOREV (21).

#### 15. CONTACTS

### a. Boviet Contacts:

On 3 June 1961 Subject was reported planning to take Georgiy Andreyevich to see the pyramids; they used the familiar form of address (3). This was presumably Georgiy Andreyevich MITEREY, representative of the Soviet Red Cross who was then visiting Mexico.

There is little information on Subject's close friends among the Soviets stationed in Hexico. On 24 October 1961 Subject asked Ivan Gavrilovich ALPERYEV (201-236701, known KGB) to go to the movies with him, but ALPERYEY could not go (3). On 1 December 1963 Subject, Vasiliy Mikhaylevich DZONOV (201-067914, known GRU), Vadim Aleksandrovich SHENOK (201-278697, known GRU) and possibly Aleksandr Mikhaylovich DENISOV (201-726491, known GRU) planned to take their children on an outing to the spa of Cuautla (3). On 26 February 1964 the wife of Aleksandr Georgiyevich SIDOROV (201-018494, known GRU, probably resident) said that she had received a letter from Subject's wife (3).

#### b. Non-Soviet Contacts:

1). "Ojovidrio" (i.e. Glasseye).

On 25 May 1962 Ojovidrio called Subject, but Subject said that he would not be able to see him until after Subject got back from home leave (3).

2). Donato LNU.

On 7 October 1960 Donato, who used the familiar form of address with Rubject, zekel Eubject for some films to be shown at "the cultural center." Donato invited Subject to go to the center that evening, but Subject was busy (3).

# 3). Jose Luis LMV.

On 27 May 1960 Jose Luis informed Subject that his children Salvador and Eduardo were sick with hepatitis. Subject said that in that case they had better postpone "this matter" for a couple of weeks. (4).

4). Stanislaw ADAMOVICZ (P-2304, 201-198884), former/commercial employee in Mexico.

On 20 July 1960 ADAMOWICZ asked Subject if he could borrow some films for their holiday on 22 July (3).

5). Javier PALVAREZ, probably identical with the Javier ALVAREZ Vega who in 1963 was reported to be cleaning semething at the Soviet Embessy.

On 28 Earch 1962 Subject called ALVAREZ at 12-53-26 to ask about his typewriter (3).

6). Or Ricardo ALVAREZ del Castillo (P-5318), reported born 21 April 1917 in Eszico, D.F., apparently originally in contact with the Soviets as a medical consultant and later on a social basis. No recent contact with Soviets known.

On 2 April 1960 ALVAREZ reminded Subject that they had met in the resort of Cuernavaca and invited Subject and his wife to dinner (4). On 3 November 1960 ALVAREZ complained that he had not gotten his invitation to the 7 November reception at the Soviet Embassy and said that Subject was a very good friend of his (3). On 22 May 1961 Subject and ALVAREZ made a chess date, and ALVAREZ invited Subject's family to come over also (3). On 22 May 1963 Mrs. ALVAREZ said that her husband was travelling around Latin America and complained that she had not seen Subject for a long time. Hrs. ALVAREZ wanted Subject to help a friend of her, Mrs. EXESUMZA, who wanted to travel to the USSR, and Subject said he would take care of her when she came to the Embassy (3). On 7 November 1963 ALVAREZ again complained that he had not received his invitation to the Soviet Embassy reception, and Subject said that he had it for him (3).

7). (Engineer) fru ANGE, not further identified.

On 14 September 1960 ARGE, located at telephone 22-05-93, the Civil Aeronautics Office, told Subject that he had been unable to go the day before. Subject said he would meet ARGE and his father that day "there." Subject and ARGE used the familiar form of address. (3).

P. B). F. Enrique ARGELI L. of Campeche, probably identical with Fernando Enrique ARGELI, professor in Campeche who in October 1965 was listed as an active member of the Movimiento de Liberacion Macional, a pro-Cuba Communist front organization.

On 15 August 1983 ARGELI contacted the Soviet Embassy in Mexico City, saying that he was a friend of Subject's but that the last time he had been in Mexico City he had been told that Subject had returned to the USSR. ANGELI asked for Subject's current address and also for information on travel to the USSR, as he was planning a trip (14).

9). (fmu ARREDONDO, of the National University.

On 5 August 1963 ARREDONDO made arrangements to see Subject at the Soviet Embassy in order to borrow some files (3).

10). (Engineer) fnu ATALA, Jr., located at telephone number 24-39-30, listed to Talleres Electronicos Sea (television), not further identified.

On 26 April 1963 Subject asked AYALA to return the films he had borroved (3).

11). Enrique BORDES Mangel (P-4717), Mexican pro-Communist employed as photographer with Prensa Latina, the Cuban news agency in Mexico. BORDES has taken photographs at Soviet Embassy receptions.

On 27 February 1962 Subject thanked BORDES for the photographs and asked what he owed him, but BORDES said only a bottle of works (3).

✓12). (Architect) fou BRENA, not further identified.

On 31 May 1961 BREMA asked Subject if he could see him the following day, but Subject said he would be out of town. BREMA said he would call the following week and perhaps they could get together with their wives. Subject and BREMA used the familiar form of address (3). On 22 November 1962 BREMA tried to reach Subject, but he was out. (3).

(13). Enrique CALDEBON not further identified.

On 12 June 1961 Subject left a message with CALDERON's sister at telephone 18-93-36 for Subject to return the films (3). (This phone was listed to Cesar GAMADO Carcia, Revillagizedo 52-6).
On 18 September 1961 Subject called CALDERON at 16-25-79 again asking him to return some films (3). (This phone number was listed to Super Autos Sesma Armando, used cars.)

14). Ariel CAMPOS, of the Cine Club Coloso. In 1964 Ariel CAMPOS received a letter from an American machinery firm addressed to him at the firm Maquinaria Coloso. The general manager of this firm in 1961 was Francisco AMADO Granados (201-108887), Guatemalan Communist living in Mexico who was involved in arms smuggling for guerrillas. The firm was owned by AMADO's wife. AMADO was reported to have been in evidently clandestine contact in 1957 with Boris Pavlovich EDLOMYAKOV (201-107668, known EGB). AMADO is not dead.

On 26 May 1961 CAMPOS mentioned to Subject that he had seen him the previous Saturday and given him a letter. CAMPOS asked if there was any news about getting (something; possibly films) and arranged to go to see Subject that day before noon (3).

(15). Arturo CASTILLO and wife Ana CASTILLO (P-6004), both reportedly leftists and frequent Boviet cultural contacts.

On 8 July 1963 Mr. CASTILLO contacted Subject in order to borrow some films for his wife, the director of the Coyoacan Ballet Academy. On 23 July 1963 Mrs. CASTILLO herself asked Subject about films (3).

16). Maria de la Paz CERVANTES (P-8848), employee of Sabena Airlines, in contact with the Soviet Embassy in regard to travel arrangements.

On 25 April 1963 CEEVANTES asked Subject about borrawing films (3).

17). fnu DIAZ. of the firm Diaz y Suarez, not further identified.

On 10 July 1963 DIAZ asked Subject about a film on the components (3).

18). Fernando DIAZ, not further identified. On 25 August 1961 DIAZ arranged to come by and get a film from Subject (3).

129). Salvador DIAZ de Sollano (Soyano), no other traces.

From July 1961 to April 1962 Subject was frequently reported in contact with Subject about bornwing films; usually Subject was trying to get DIAZ to return films he had borrowed (3).

20). Alejandro SERISTAIN Flores Sanchez, no traces. Nephew of Horacio FLORES Sanchez (P-133), Mexican leftist professor who has been friendly with several Soviets.

On 29 July 1963 Horacio asked Subject why his nephew had had trouble in borrowing films from Subject for Preparatory School # 5, and Subject said that he had to have a signature of someone who would be responsible for the return of the films. On 19 August 1963 Alejandro asked Subject about borrowing films (3).

On 24 May 1963 FORTIKO tried to locate Subject on behalf of the Chilean Ambassador in regard to copies of speeches (not further explained) (3).

WW 22). Eduardo GARCIA Marquez, of the Mational University, no traces.

On 10 February 1961 Aleksandr Mikhaylovich BROVKIN (201-185114), cultural afficer of the Soviet Embassy, contacted GARCIA, who knew Subject, and said that he wanted to discuss an exchange of films (3).

23). Eariano GARCIA Perez (P-8007, 201-334094), former Cuban Consul in Mexico.

On 15 March 1963 GARCIA asked Subject about a film. GARCIA said a friend of his would pick it up, because GARCIA was leaving that day for Cuba. On 12 June 1963 Subject said he would have the film ready for Subject's next trip (to Cuba). (3).

24). Carlos Hario VELASCO Gil (P-7643, 201-274071), Mexican Communist working for Press Latina, Soviet press contact.

On 18 December Subject called Mario GIL from downtown Mexico City, saying he had the book that GIL wanted. GIL agreed to meet Subject in ten binutes at the "same place as last time." (3).

25). Carlos GONEZ Romero, employee of the Institute for Mexican-76-201 Russian Cultural Exchange in Mexico City (IICMR).

> In 1963 and 1963 GOMEZ Romero was occasionally reported contacting Subject in regard to films, presumably for showing at the JICHR (3).

26). Estela +GONZALEZ, no traces.

On 22 August 1960 CONSALEZ asked Subject about borrowing a film (3)

27). Manuel GONZALEZ Casanova (P-11156), head of cinema section of Difusion Cultural at the National University, reportedly a leftist.

On 28 September and 13 October 1960 Subject reportedly asked GONZALEZ Casanova to return films he had borrowed (3).

28). fnu GUTIERREZ Galindo, of Revista Cuauhtemoc, not further identified.

On 5 September 1960 GUTIERREZ Galindo reminded Subject that they had met at a Soviet Embassy film showing. GUTIERREZ Galindo wanted to borrow a film to show at his home and invited Subject to come (3). On 16 June 1961 GUTIERREZ Galindo invited Subject to go with "us" the next day, but Subject said he would be out of town and would call when he got back. On 30 June 1961 GUTIERREZ Galindo said he wanted to see Subject and would come by. On 6 July 1961 GUTIERREZ Galindo said he would go to see Subject the next day. (3).

29). fnu HERNANDEZ, of Department of Communications, not further identified.

On 22 August 1961 HERNANDEZ told Subject that he had a new office, and Subject said he would go there and have lunch with Subject one day. Subject sent regards to HERNANDEZ' son. (3).

30). Bail HRADECKY (P-3640, 201-204656), former Czech Commercial Counselor in Mexico and identified intelligence officer.

On 23 April 1960 HRADECEY and Subject talked about going on a Sunday outing jogother, perhaps in two weeks (4).

51). Jose Antonio TBARRA Cordoba) no traces.

On 22 February 1964 IBARDA asked at the Soviet Embassy for an invitation to the 23 February reception. IBARDA described himself as a good friend of Subject's and of his friend "Yuriy." (3). (Yuriy might be GRU officer Yuriy Mikolayevich IEAYEV, 201-741377.)

/32). Raul WLOPEZ Calvillo, no traces.

On 8 January 1962 LOPEZ Calvillo contacted Subject, saying that he did not know how long he would be staying in Hexico City. He asked Subject to translate an article on hydraulic engineering for him that had been sent him from the USSR. LOPEZ Calvillo arranged to go to see Subject that day (3).

33). (Engineer) fnu LOPEZ Costilla, not otherwise identified.

On 10 September 1960 LOPEZ Costilla left a message that Subject had forgotten to send an invitation to (Ing.) Gerardo CRUICKSHAHK (3). (Comment: The latter must be (Ing.) Gerardo CRUICKSHAHK \(\lambda\) (CRUICKSHAHK \(\la

54). (Professor) Leopoldo \*\*\*BORRILLA Ornelas, biology teacher at the Mational University, leftist.


