

re: FLIGHT OF AXIS PERSONNEL TO ARGENTINA

An article which was published in the newspaper, "El Pueblo Argentino", Montevideo, Uruguay, on September 25, 1944, alleged that numerous Nazi officials were presently hiding in Argentina under assumed identities. Among the individuals listed as Nazi officials were Colonel Walter Osterkamp, Major General Hans Steudemann, one Dr. Frick, Karlheinz Von Dufais and Gottfried Sandstede.

One of the allegations in this article was to the effect that Major General Hans Steudemann was stopping at the "Hotel Adam", Calle Maipu 1288, Buenos Aires. He was said to be using false Argentine documents in the name of Pedro Cassmann. Investigation at the "Hotel Adam" has failed to uncover any record of any individual named Hans Steudemann or Pedro Cassmann. No record of the issuance of documents in the name of Pedro Cassmann has been located.

One Dr. Frick, an engineer, director of the steel works at Bochum, Germany, was alleged to be living at the "German Riding Club", Calle Echeverria, Belgrano, Buenos Aires, and was said to visit the German Embassy. It was also claimed that he was the bearer of a Lichtenstein passport in the name of Eduard Reden. Investigation at the "German Riding Club" indicates that Dr. Frick does not reside there at the present time. The German Embassy in Buenos Aires has been closed since the severance of relations between the Argentine and German governments in January 1944 and the Embassy is guarded twenty-four hours per day by the Buenos Aires Police Department. No record of the passport or other documents in the name of Eduard Reden has been encountered.

Inquiries in German circles in Buenos Aires have developed no information regarding any of the individuals alleged by this article to be seeking refuge in Argentina.

Information as to the original source of this article has not been developed. It is believed that the story was originated by the Communist Party in Argentina. It was reprinted in five clandestine Communist Party newspapers in Uruguay and Argentina.

Gottfried Sandstede, Godofredo Sandstede

Gottfried Sandstede was born in Oldenburg, Germany, on January 25, 1902. He was the son of Georg Sandstede and was married to Frieda Brandes.

Sandstede was the subject of numerous reports emanating from South America in 1939, 1940, and 1941, due to the fact that he was very active in German propaganda work. He was also a German espionage agent.

Wilhelm von Seidlitz, a confessed German agent who is presently in the custody of Argentine authorities, advised that he met Sandstede in Berlin, Germany during the last part of 1936. Sandstede had apparently lived in Argentina prior to this time. Von Seidlitz traveled from Berlin to Buenos Aires, Argentina, with Sandstede arriving in Buenos Aires December 15, 1936. At this time, both Von Seidlitz and Sandstede were employees of the German Railways, and Sandstede was head of this agency in Argentina. They were associated together in the offices of the "Central European Travel Agency" which was a subsidiary of the German Railways at Calle Florida 439, Buenos Aires, Argentina.

In 1939 Sandstede was called to Germany, apparently by the German Government. Von Seidlitz stated that he returned to Argentina on August 25, or August 26, 1939, with the title of Press and Propaganda Attache of the German Embassy, Buenos Aires, Argentina.

With the outbreak of war between Great Britain and Germany in September, 1939, Von Seidlitz determined to return to Europe. On this occasion he requested Sandstede to assist him in obtaining passage, but Sandstede advised him that it was his duty to remain in Argentina, since he could be of more value to Germany in that country by functioning as an espionage agent than by enrolling in the German Army. Sandstede advised him that he, Sandstede, had already been functioning as a German agent for some time. He was active in obtaining shipping information from Argentine harbors for forwarding to Germany through the German diplomatic pouch and by means of the Lati Airline.

Von Seidlitz agreed to assist Sandstede in obtaining this type of information, and thereafter he turned over a number of reports to the subject.

Another individual who was reported to have worked as a German agent with Sandstede was Heinz Lange, a known German agent who is presently believed to be in hiding in Argentina. Lange was cooperating with Sandstede in this regard as early as May, 1940.

One Hahn, an employee of the D.N.B. (German News Agency) Buenos Aires, was reported to have worked under Sandstede in obtaining general intelligence information in Argentina in the last part of 1940. The

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extent of Hahn's activities in this regard has not been clearly defined.

In order to contact agents working with him, Sandstede retained an office at the "Central European Travel Agency" and he received a salary of \$3,250.00 monthly there in addition to his salary as an Attache of the German Embassy. There is some indication that the payments made to Sandstede at the office of the "Central European Travel Agency" were payments for distribution to propaganda and espionage agents.

In addition to his activities as an espionage agent, the subject was active in directing German propaganda in Colombia, Peru, Brazil, and Argentina. During the last part of 1940, Sandstede also maintained contact with Italian diplomatic officials in Argentina for propaganda purposes.

In August, 1940, Sandstede held a meeting in Buenos Aires, Argentina, with Hans Henning von Kossel, a German diplomatic official from Rio de Janeiro, concerning the measures to be adopted by the German Government in case the United States entered the war. It was agreed at that time that a press campaign would be undertaken in Brazil regarding the bad treatment accorded to Negroes by the United States through the "Transocean News Agency" and local Brazilian agencies. It was believed that this line of propaganda would appeal to numerous Brazilians with colored blood. These plans were accepted in Brazil and arrangements were made to carry out the same type of propaganda in Peru, Mexico, Bolivia and other countries with a large Indian population.

In addition, Sandstede agreed to reinforce the German and Italian influence in the Longshoremen's Union in Argentina.

On April 4, 1941, a number of prominent Nazis in Argentina are reported to have held a meeting at the German Athletic Club, Calle Cuba, 2410, Buenos Aires, Argentina. Sandstede and Heinrich Vollberg, who was head of the Nazi Party in Argentina, made speeches.

On April 23, 1941, prominent Nazis from all parts of Colombia held a meeting in the upper floors of the "Almacen Helda", Manizales, Colombia. Sandstede was in charge of this meeting and is reported to have arrived in Colombia, using an assumed name and false passport. The subjects under discussion at this meeting are not known.

During the middle of 1941 a report was received to the effect that one Werner Loewer, Calle Pampa 3799, Buenos Aires, Argentina, was a German agent working under Sandstede. Loewer was described as a chemist for the German firm "Thyssen Lametal Company", Calle Paseo Colon 532, Buenos Aires, Argentina. The nature of the duties performed by this individual is not known.

Membership lists of the Fascist organization "Afirmacion Argentina", Buenos Aires, reflect that Sandstede was one of the leaders in that organization.

On August 19, 1941, the special committee of the Chamber of Deputies of Argentina ordered the subject to appear before that body for questioning concerning his activities. Sandstede claimed that he had extra territorial rights as a result of his position as Press and Propaganda Attache of the German Embassy, and he refused to appear. The investigating committee then took the view that inasmuch as he was still head of the "Central European Travel Agency", that he must appear, and a warrant was issued for his arrest.

On August 26, 1941, Sandstede departed from Argentina by Condor plane for Brazil, apparently in order to avoid questioning. On September 4, 1941, he left Brazil for Europe by Lati plane.

Prior to his departure from Argentina, Sandstede instructed Wilhelm Von Seidlitz to take charge of the ship reporting service which he had been operating. Von Seidlitz agreed to do so, and Sandstede paid him 12,000 Argentine pesos (\$3,000.00) as an advance for expenditures.

Sandstede also furnished Von Seidlitz the following mail drop to be used for espionage communications: Jannick Ortner, Wilhelmstrasse 102, Berlin, Germany,

Information recently developed in Argentina is to the effect that during September, 1942, Sandstede was traveling for the German Government in Spain and Portugal. The nature of the work being performed by him there was not disclosed.

During August, 1943, one Rudolfo Amadeo was arrested by Argentine authorities while operating an unauthorized radio transmitter in the vicinity of Buenos Aires. Amadeo is reported to have been an associate of Sandstede when the subject was in Argentina. Apparently, this station was simply an unauthorized amateur station and not a clandestine radio transmitter.

According to accounts published in the German language newspaper "Deutsche La Plata Zeitung", Buenos Aires, on May 11, and May 12, 1944, Sandstede was killed while serving in an armored grenadier regiment in the German Army on the Eastern Front. The exact date of his death was not disclosed.

It has been suggested by various sources that the report of Sandstede's death might possibly be part of a scheme to enable him to return to Argentina under an assumed name. No information is available to show that Sandstede is not in fact dead.

While Garreton has returned to Chile, he has not yet assumed the directorship of the Division of Investigations, and it has been reliably reported that he departed on October 20, 1944, for a six weeks tour throughout Latin American as the personal representative of President Rios. It has been said that Garreton will return as Director of the Division of Investigations upon the completion of this trip.

Department 50 of the Division of Investigations has been headed by Hernan Barros Bianchi both under Garreton and Labarca. There has been no indication that Barros will be removed from this position.

An Argentine opposition publication of 25 September claims that the following Nazi functionaries are currently in Argentina under assumed identities: We would appreciate any information you may have on the identities and activities of these persons, in Germany and anything you might know about their departure from there.

1. Colonel Walter OSTERKAMP, "ex-commander of fighter-plane school in Werneuchen, Germany." Now uses false identity as Theodor SCHWIMDT (or SCHWINDT), born in Coronel Suárez, Argentina.

2. Major General Hans STEUDEMANN, of the Luftwaffe Chiefs of Staff. Has false documents as Pedro CASSMANN, born in Diamante, Entre Ríos Province, Argentina.

3. Dr. FRICK, engineer and director of steel factory in Bochum, Germany. Has Lichtenstein passport in name of Eduard REDEL.

4. Karlheinz von DUFAYS, "SS Sturmartendfuhrer" and radio-telegraph expert.

5. Gottfried SANDSTEDE, former press attache of the German Embassy in Buenos Aires, now reported back in Argentina, although Deutsche La Plata Zeitung reported he had been killed on Russian front on May 27, 1944

Regarding your request for information on Antonio Santa Cruz, the FBI advises they do not have a record of the individual.

The Bureau advises they are still checking for information on Valentin R. Garfias.

Concerning Emilio Cervi and his son of Mexico City, the following is a report from the FBI on these individuals:

"The Bureau has a record of an Emilio S. Cervi who was head of the Sinarquista movement in Mexico, and was responsible for publication of a Sinarquista pamphlet. Cervi was born in Tuxtepec, Vera Cruz, Mexico and now resides at Orzabá St., Mexico City. Cervi is a lawyer, 57 years old, and resided in the U.S. from 1925 to 1929.

"The files of the Bureau reveal that Emilio Cervi (García), father of Emilio S. Cervi above, is approximately 77 years old. He has been seen attending a meeting of the "Casa de España", a society whose members are known to be pro-Franco. This society propagandized for the Spanish Falange and disbanded shortly after the U.S. entered the war."

ACCION REVOLUCIONARIA MEXICANISTA (CAMISA DORADA)

This Party has been known by the following names other than the above: Los Dorados, Gold Shirts and Brown Shirts. This organization was first founded in 1934-1935, and was headed by General Nicolas Rodriguez. As the old Gold Shirt organization, it was a strongly nationalistic group and was involved in the Cadillo revolt. This Party often clashed with organized labor and in the year 1935 there were two armed assaults at the offices of the Communist Party. About ten persons died as a result of this conflict. The following year, about the middle of 1936, President Cardenas ordered this Party to be dissolved and from thereon, when it did function, it did so as an illegal secret party. Colonel Aniceto Lopez is now associated with the organization. It has been used as a vehicle of anti-Semitic propaganda and is said to have Fascist sympathies.

VANGUARDIA NACIONALISTA

This organization advocates neutrality for Mexico. This thesis, however, is not genuine, as it has been advanced as purely German propaganda. The organizer of the Party is Adolf Leon Ossorio who was on the pay roll of the German Legation as a propaganda agent. It also has an apparent anti-Jewish policy and seeks to prejudice the Mexicans against the influence of the United States. It is in close contact with the Partido de Accion Nacional, representing it as a shock or action force. Hitler has been openly praised by officials of the Vanguardia Nacionalista for his so-called great accomplishments in Europe.

PARTIDO DE ACCION NACIONAL

Manuel Gomez Morin is President of this Party. This Party is composed chiefly of the professional and business elements of Mexico and is said to often furnish the intellectual leadership for the Sinarquista group. It has been known in the past to be allegedly anti-axis, anti-Communist, and opposed to American influence in Mexican affairs. However, it has also been known to manifest certain sympathies in the direction of Fascism. The organization gives considerable study to rural developments, social problems, and general questions of economic and political policies affecting the Mexican nation.

From the information furnished, it has not been possible to establish the identity of the following organizations:

Union Nacional Mexicana de Yucatan
Partido Nacional Civilista
Comite Pro-Raza
Movimiento Unificador Nacionalista

MARIA ALFARO:

A Maria Alfaro (De Mata) is listed as a Communist and holds the position of Assistant Secretary of the Communist Revolutionary Union. This person is also a director of the Escuela Atlantici. (X)

CARMEN CALERO:

The above person is associated with the Partido Anti-Revolucionista Accion. This individual is an elderly woman physician and has been active in different Fascist groups. (C)

ANTONIO F. ESCOBAR:

The above Antonio F. Escobar was a member of the "Los Dorados" organization in Mexico City. He is reputed to have been one of the organizers of "Los Dorados" and indications are that his sentiments are pro-Fascist. He also is associated with the "Union Nacionalist Mexicana."

GUSTAVO SAENZ DE SICILIA:

This person is said to have been the leader of the Mexican Fascist Party which he started to organize in November 1942 in Jalapa, Veracruz, Mexico. At one time this organization was reported to have had four hundred twenty branches. In professional life this individual was an engineer. (C)

DIEGO ARENAS GUZMAN:

The above person is reportedly associated with the Mexico City periodical, "El Nuevo Dia," also "El Hombre Libre," a German subsidized newspaper. The magazine, "El Nuevo Dia," is a propaganda instrument of the Nazis in Mexico, and its publication was suspended. (C)

GENERAL NICOLAS RODRIGUEZ:

This person was one of the founders of the old "Los Dorados" organization (also known as the "Gold Shirts") which was subsequently outlawed by the Mexican Government and never legally reinstated. Its off-spring was the "Accion Revolucionaria Mexicanista." The General was very anti-Jewish and his organization was used to disseminate anti-Semitic literature. The General was also involved in the Cudillo Revolution and is reported to come directly under German influence. General Rodriguez died in 1940. Dr. A. D. Cook of Laredo, Texas, is said to have been associated with General Nicolas Rodriguez. (C)

FRANCISCO CAYON Y COS:

Francisco Cayon y Cos is reported to be a close friend of Ibanes Serrano, a high ranking confidant of General Franco of Spain and a member of the Falange of the "Liga de Hispanidad Ibero Americana." This organization is to be found in all Central American countries. It is purported to be a civic and cultural organization for the purpose of defending Mexican Hispanic culture and the promotion of the union of Spanish-American people. This organization is financially (C)

supported by Ibanez Ferrero and comes under the influence of Falangist ideology. This person is likewise a chief of the Propaganda Service of the Spanish Falange.

CABINO VIZCARRA CALPOS:

This person may be identical with a Cabino Vizcarro who is an associate of German agents and a responsible official in General Almazan's campaign organization.

ING. H. CARRASCO:

This person may be identical with Honorato Carrasco who was in charge of financing and paying of all propaganda operations for the Nazi-Communist espionage setup in Mexico during 1941 prior to the German-Russian War.

LEON OSSORIO:

This person is reported to have been an organizer of Mexican-Nazi activities and a leader of the Mexican-Fascist Party which was dissolved by the Cardenas Government. A Leon Ossorio, Niagara 8, Mexico City, may be identical with Adolfo Leon Ossord at the same address.

ROBERTO CARRIEDO:

A Roberto Carriedo Rosales living at Palma Norte 402, Mexico City, is reported to be sympathetic with the "Accion Nacional."

GENERAL EULALIO GUTIERREZ:

A person bearing the name of Eulalio Gutierrez was formerly president of the Grand Liberal Party in Mexico. It is reported that General Gutierrez was associated with General Antonio S. Villareal in a contemplated revolutionary movement. General Gutierrez was once the Provisional President of Mexico, and instigated revolutionary activity at Durango on March 16, 1929.

MANUEL GOMEZ MORIN:

This person is the leader of the "Accion Nacional" organization which is regarded as one of the most important oppositionist groups in Mexico. It was founded in 1933 as a non-political organization, and its object was to lay the basis for a "new spiritual rebirth of citizenship." It claims a membership of forty thousand. Its main strength is to be found among the professional and business men of Mexico. Morin is reported to be a political advisor of Ibanez Ferrero and was at one time a member of the "Council of the Hispanidad Movement."

Sufficient information was lacking to establish a record on the following individuals: Juan B. Marzal, Orlando Herrera Moguel, Enrique Garcia Raballedo, General Daniel Rios Zertuche, General Miguel M. Ramos, Genaro Garibay, Lic. Fernando de la Fuente, Alejandro Clavarría, Everardo H. Hernandez, Ricardo A. San Bartolome, Lic. M. del Villar, Pablo Mascañani.


This Branch is engaged in a survey of the above subject, including secret inks. Obviously, the first thing we want is a survey of the present state of the art. We have canvassed every interested agency except the FBI.

We have, on 22 February 1944, shown our devices and sabotage weapons to Messrs. Coffey, Flanagan and Parsons of the FBI. These gentlemen suggested that an official request from you for entree to their laboratory on the above subject of secret inks, etc., would be well received.

The study of this subject is in the hands of one man only. He is a chemist and ink expert of international repute and for security reasons works entirely in a secret laboratory in Rochester, N.Y.

It is suggested that opening this subject to our appointee will not be entirely a gift on the part of the Bureau to us, but that highly interesting information will thereby be made available to the FBI laboratory.

Unfortunately, speed is very necessary to prevent duplication of effort, and I would appreciate a high priority action on the above request.

Mr. Lovell intimated that his primary purpose in wanting to go to FBI would be to explore. He wanted to give them some techniques of SO work against industry which have various advantages over many techniques, yet are very simple. Lovell stated this pertained to activities against American industry. Lovell stated he had an arsenal of weapons which he was going to show Friday at the Maryland Research Lab in Area F. Mr. Peters asked if they could provide transportation for Hoover to this show, to which Lovell replied they could not. He added it was only 12 miles. Mr. Peters asked him if he knew when the meeting on Friday was. Lovell stated he did not know the exact time. Lovell added he would ^{rather} Hoover did not come to the show, that it was being put on for Theater Officers, and that it would probably be a repeat performance for anyone on Hoover's level. Mr. Peters said he would tell Norris that Lovell wanted to come to his office and explain the techniques. Mr. Lovell said he thought he had some new information that FBI didn't know about. Lovell said he would like to go into the name subject later. Lovell said he could carry a satchel full of devices but he did not want to do that. Mr. Peters said he would see Tamm tomorrow. Lovell asked for an appointment with FBI for tomorrow afternoon.

SUBJECT: Biographical Records.

1. There is hereby established in the Central Information Division of the Research and Analysis Branch of the Office of Strategic Services a section to be known as Biographical Records.

2. Biographical Records shall be responsible for the systematic collection and recording of information about foreign persons abroad and in this country who may be of interest for purpose of psychological warfare and military occupation, and generally for the preparation of such dossiers on persons as may be required by the various operations of OSS.

3. Biographical Records shall make the fullest possible use of existing facilities of OSS in the collection and evaluation of the material.

4. All name information now available in or hereafter acquired by the several branches of OSS shall be systematically made available to the new section. The procedure to be followed with respect to SI material is set forth in Appendix "A" attached.

5. The personnel and files of the Geographic Index of Persons in SI are hereby transferred to the new section.

6. The personnel and budgetary requirements for the section are hereby approved as submitted.

Appendix "A"Relationship of SI Material to Biographical Records

The following procedure shall be followed in handling biographical data derived from SI sources:

1. SI material (other than operational and strictly CE records and material) is to be made available to ER. Unless authorized to include such data, ER will omit any reference to subversive or undercover activities of individuals, except where an individual is a notorious agent, or otherwise is so conducting his activities that secrecy respecting them is useless or unnecessary.

2. Where an individual is of interest to ER, and is also engaged in undercover activities, ER may record straight biographical data and may also indicate:

(a) the subject's political views - e.g., "Pro-Ally" - "Pro-Axis;"

(b) his trustworthiness - e.g., "can be trusted" - "cannot be trusted;" and

(c) his willingness or unwillingness to cooperate, or similar phrases, provided the comments are of a type in general use in the records and are not calculated to suggest undercover activities.

3. In cases where material regarding subversives is made available from SI, an appropriate punch should be made in IBM cards to indicate the individual is under observation by SI.

4. ER shall be free to record any data on subversive activities received from sources other than SI, and shall arrange to make such data available to SI.

5. In certain cases where evidence of the subversive activities of individuals would be embarrassing to CE operations, the evidence should be suppressed upon the request of CE.
