Today, Friday, March 27, 1964, I met at CIA headquarters with Mr. Rocca to review the CIA file on Lee Hervey Oswald. The file contains those materials furnished to us previously by CIA. In addition, it contains the following materials:

Cable reports from the CIA station in Mexico of Movember 22 and 23, 1963 relating to photographs of a person who had visited the Cuban and Soviet Erbassics in Mexico City during October and November 1953; and reports on these cables furnished on Hovember 23 by CIA to the Secret Service. These messages are accurately paraphrased in the attachments to the CIA memorandum of March 24, 1964 (Commission Document #674).

Cable of October 10 from CIA Mexico City station to CIA headquarters reporting on Oswald contact at Soviet Embassy, and October 10, 1963 message from CIA headquarters to Mexico City station of background information on Oswald. These messages are accurately reported in the CIA memorandum of January 31, 1964.

I did not review any materials later than November 23, 1963.

Mr. Rocca also showed me the "printout" of the references to Oswald documents in the CIA electronic data storage system. There was no item listed which we have not been given either in full text or paraphrased.

When I evidenced an interest in the CIA electronic data processing system, Mr. Rocca said that he would arrange a detailed · 02explanation at a future visit.



  - t. We are not in a position to supply copies of telegrams sent between the Soviet Embassies in Washington and Mexico City.
  - 2. Translations of the two police interrogation reports of Silvia DURAN are being forwarded to the Commission under separate cover.
  - 3. The file on OSWALD which Silvin DURAN mentions is the one she opened on him at that time and which she logisting again when CSWALD's name was published as the probability mensula of President Kennedy.

We do not know who might have told CEWALD that AZCUE or any other Cuban had been or was to be replaced, but we speculate that Silvia DURAN or some Soviet official might have mentioned it if CSWALD complained about AZCOTPONIUM with him.

11. We have an identified information on CSWALD's activities by Menico City. This part of the investigation was hadden in the feed Bureau of investigation through its own facilities. All of our sources have been queried for further information but none has been developed. Neither pro- nor enti-CASTRO persons or groups have produced what we regard as hard information.

12. We can only guess why Silvia DURAN described CSWALD as a blonde. Perhaps his complexion seemed light to her, compared with that of most Latin Americans. When she was arrested, she had not seen CSWALD for about two mosths, but apparently she had blonde in her Consular records.
