1. Reference is made to a communication from your Bureau dated 23 August 1964.

2. This Agency has received the following information on Subject from a source who is considered unreliable. Fr. Martin Luther KING met with various leaders of the Italian Communist Party (PCI) and of the Italian Socialist Party (PSI) on 16 September 1964 in Rome. He discussed with these Italian politicians the program of demonstrations against segregation in the United States which are to be organized in Italy during the months immediately ahead. Fr. KING reportedly conferred with PCI Senators Vito GIARDINO and Ugo LAFFRANCESCHI, with PSI Senator Paolo VITTORELLI, and with Deputy Lucio INZIGNATO of the Italian Socialist Party of Proletarian Unity (PSIUP).
