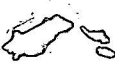

VIADUCT
ESPIONAGE - R (S)(U)

Reurnairtel 11/7/63 enclosing MI-5 Report Number 27 entitled "Personalities in Radio Moscow Known to Viaduct." Enclosed are three copies of self-explanatory letterhead memorandum dated 5/5/64 at Washington, D. C., and three copies of a photograph of six personalities associated with Radio Moscow as of 6/60. Furnish two copies of enclosed letterhead and photograph to your sources and request that Viaduct be interrogated in accordance with requests in the letterhead (S)

For your information not to be disseminated outside your office, Lee Harvey Oswald is believed to have participated in a taped interview thought to have been broadcast by Radio Moscow on a Sunday in late 1959. Documents in Oswald's handwriting made reference to such broadcast in which Oswald claimed to have spoken of his experiences as a tourist in Moscow. The name of Lev Setysev, his office telephone number and his residence address, as well as the inscription "Radio Moscow," were found in Oswald's address book and on a slip of paper in Oswald's wallet. Lev Setysev is believed to be identical with person of same name who is referred to in the enclosed letterhead. In furnishing results of requested interrogation of Viaduct (S) furnish sufficient copies for inclusion in Bureau's file on Oswald (Bufile 105-82555) and in Dallas' file of same case (DLfile 100-10461) (S)

For Dallas there is enclosed a copy of MI-5's Report Number 27 referred to herein. For your information Viaduct is a low-level KGB agent who defected to the British in 9/63. His bonafides have not been established, and at the present time, he is suspected to be furnishing disinformation to the British (S) For Dallas' information this communication relates to Bureau airtel and radiogram to Anchorage dated 7/29 and 7/31/64, respectively. (S)
