

On 2/4/65, SANTANA JIMENEZ, Chief-of Investigations, Coahuila State Police, Saltillo, Coahuila, Mexico, advised that GABRIEL LOPEZ GUERRERO had no immigration papers and the Mexican U S. DEPT. Immigration authorities would await the outcome of a check with United States police agencies to decide on LOPEZ GUERRERO's deportation following any sentence he might receive as a result of his arrest.

In a Foreign Police Cooperation case, which was immediately opened under the name of GABRIEL LOPEZ GUERRERO (MC 163-3990), the FBI Identification Division furnished LOPEZ GUERRERO's arrest record which accounts for his aliases under FBI No. 265951A. The arrest record verifies his admitted arrests and showed him not to be wanted by any agency. This information was furnished to SANTANA JIMENEZ on 2/15/65. SANTANA JIMENEZ stated that LOPEZ GUERRERU would probably be deported to the United States within a week. He also stated that LOPEZ GUERRERO mentioned to him that upon his deportation to the United States, he would probably return to his home in Beaumont, Texas.
