BASIS FOR INQUIRY

On February 4, 1935, Mr. BANTANA JIMENEZ, Chief of Investigations, Coahuila State Police, State Building, Saltillo, Coahuila, advised that the Baltillo Police Department had arrested the captioned individual at 1:00 p.m. on February 3, 1965, for being drunk and assaulting a woman at a local hotel. Upon arrest, LOPEZ GUERRERO resisted violently and created much embarrassment for the arresting officers. Once he was jailed, he began shouting vulgar expressions, insulting the officers and the employees of the jail. During these ravings, he said that he was wanted by the police, but mentioned nothing specifically as to why or where he was wanted. He shouted that he would kill the Governor of Coahuila and then shouted, "I had something to do with President KENNEDY's death."

SANTANA JIMENEZ described LOPEZ GUERRERO as a white, male, American, 5 feet 8 inches in height, weighing 185 pounds, with black hair and brown eyes, whose home was at 1104 Victoria Street, Beaumont, Texas. He claimed he was born on July 21, 1931, at Bessmay, Texas. He served in the United States Air Force as an enlisted man from 1949 to 1952. He has an eleventh grade education. He was formerly married to MARIA MACIAS RUBACLAVA, who was last known to reside in Sacramento, California.
