According to information received on 3-5-64, from the Bundesamt fuer Verfassungsschutz (BfV - West German Federal Agency for the Protection of the Constitution) the November 29, 1963, issue of "Deutsche National-Zeitung und Soldaten-Zeitung" carried the article furnished with re Bulet. *(S)*

At this time the BfV can furnish no further information regarding the origin of the information in that article. It pointed out, however, that the same issue carried a rather lengthy article reporting what was described as a telephonic interview with General Edwin A. Walker by a representative of the paper. The report of the interview deals with Walker's comments on the assassination of President Kennedy and does include several references to Oswald and Ruby. However, according to the BfV the interview does not contain any information attributed to Walker which would indicate that Oswald was the person who attempted to shoot Walker. *(S)*

The BfV suggests the possibility that the article referred to in relet may have grown out of suggestions planted in the mind of the reporter during the interview with Walker and may have been the result of journalistic speculation on the part of the writer. *(S)*

Reurairtel 3-5-64 relating to two articles appearing in the "Deutsche National-Zeitung und Soldaten-Zeitung" on November 29, 1963, regarding General Edwin A. Walker and the assassination of President Kennedy.

Through sources available to your office you should attempt to obtain two copies each of the two articles which can be forwarded to the Bureau for translation and dissemination to the President's Commission.

In addition, you should determine from the Bundesamt fuer Verfassungsschutz (BfV - West German Federal Agency for the Protection of the Constitution) the status of their consideration for more precisely identifying the sources of the two articles and also obtain the specific circumstances regarding preparation of the articles. Submit results of your further inquiry promptly. (u) (JFK) 2/26/97

NOTE:

Articles in the "Deutsche National-Zeitung und Soldaten-Zeitung" of 11-29-63 related to General Edwin A. Walker, one article being a report of a transatlantic telephone interview with Walker by a representative of that paper and the second related to statment that Oswald made an attempt on the subject's life early in the summer of 1963, and following arrest he was released by order of Attorney General Robert Kennedy. The above publication has been identified as an extreme right wing publication by the BfV. The Bureau learned from Marina Oswald on 12-3-63 of Oswald's attempt on Walker's life in April, 1963, which is several days after the article appeared in Germany. The Bureau desires to determine

the basis for the allegations in the German newspaper, although Legat, Bonn, has advised that the [BfV] suggests the allegations resulted from speculation by a writer for the paper. [BfV] has advised Legat that it does not have sources close to the newspaper in question but is exploring the matter of pinning down the circumstances regarding preparation of the two articles. Bulet 2-20-64 requested Legat, Bonn, to determine if such articles did appear in the German newspaper since information of their appearance had been set forth in "The Herald of Freedom" Staten Island, New York.
