A confidential informant, contact with whom has been insufficient to establish his reliability. Muring January, 1967 Jadvised that in connection with the assassination of President John Fitzgerald Ennedy, at was / concluded by the ESB Headquarters in Massoutthat he was killed by representatives of a group of monopolists connected with the south and the east of the United States. This group of monopolists, characterized as the militaryindustrial complex, felt that Kennedy had tried to limit their activities and hurt their interests and therefore they planned his assassination.

Informant advised that this conclusion was drawn after the KGB had spent between gix months and a year to study information to determine the cause of the assassination. Source stated that the most reliable EGB agents in the world were mobilized, in addition to other official contacts in order to gather, in a wide scope, information concerning the reason for the assassination.

A group of officers in Moscow carefully gathered the information and conducted extensive research and analysis and came to the conclusion that it was the military-industrial, complex who were responsible for the death of Kennedy.

Informant advised that the Soviets felt Kennedy's death was a great loss, not only for the United States, not only for the Soviet Union, but for the whole world. He was realistic in his analysis of international
