On December 15, 1963 at 3:15 PM eight women and 10 men held a meeting at the Hungarian Inn, five miles east of Lakeland on the old Winter Haven Road.

The meeting was opened by TAFT.

He said the meeting was to try to get members for the rights party and to start clubs wherever possible. He said there had been a club in Lakeland in about 1960, but it disbanded.

TAFT stated he will be working all over Florida trying to get the party set up in every town. TAFT turned the floor over to STONER who said he is the one that defended some men in St. Augustine who had been arrested for beating up some Negroes.

STONER said the people of St. Augustine have put up more of a fight against integration than the Negroes thought they would and he said the people there are not going to integrate. He stated the Negro has said they will not be satisfied if they get everything they are demanding now. When they get these things they will start a new list of things. He stated the Negro will not be happy until they
