The "New York Post" Eswepaper, issue of March 8, 1956, page 12, reflected that subject had took rotained as the Colense attorney for DAVID H. HITCHELL ILE, an objector to the current Selective Service laws, who was to be tried in the United States District Court (USIC), sareford, Commedicut, on March 15, 1955.

On January 12, 1926, NY T-2, a confidential course obread, furnished a copy of the Ranion nowspaper, "Lolland-Palaters Polketidense", issue of January 4, 1966, which in part stated as follows: (4)

"Mark Lane has now finished reading the proofs of his book dealing with the cossesingtion of Fresident Honnedy and entitled 'Ruch to Judgement. (6)

NY T-3 stated that in checking the manuscript, Viking Press had discovered inaccuracies and exaggraphical which they downded the subject clarify.
