Re San Antonio letter to Miami, 10-19-67.

An additional copy of this letter is being submitted to the Bureau for information of their file on "LEE HARVEY OSWALD, IS - RUSSIA - CUBA".

For information of the Bureau and other offices, at approximately 9:00 P.M., 10-16-67, an individual, who did not wish to furnish his identity, telephoned the San Antonio FBI office. He advised that he wanted to furnish that office some information about a Mexican citizen named ROBERTO NIETO. The caller said that NIETO is a personal friend of FIDEL CASTRO and that he has traveled to Cuba at least three times in the last 18 months to see CASTRO. NIETO, according to the caller, is presently living in, or has been living in, Miami. His purpose there is to keep track of the Cuban refugees in Miami. He was supposedly enrolled in one of the local universities as a cover.

The caller advised that NIETO is a very wealthy man, that he had a concession from the Mexican Government to transport oil and butane from Mexico into the interior, but he has fallen out of favor with the Mexican Government and lost his concession. The caller further stated that NIETO is an extreme liberal. He did not know NIETO's address in Miami and could not furnish a description of him. The

He had a C plus average at the University of Miami, and his transcript had been sent from the University of Miami to another destination, identity of which was not indicated in the record. The record indicated that NIETO's parents were deceased; his foreign address was listed as Guadalupe #86, Celaya, Mexico. There was no local address listed in the record as maintained by the University of Miami.

The office of the Dean of Men at the University of Miami had no record pertaining to NIETO.

A check of the records of the following agencies on 11-21-67, by IC CLIFFORD M. WERNER resulted negatively in locating information concerning the subject, born 12-5-32, in Mexico:
