KENT said that the life in USA became happier since KHRUSHCHEV's visit. Said that the visit brought many hopes to the humanity. STRELNIKOV said that many Ukrainian youngsters, grandchildren of immigrants of 50 years ago, attended the meeting and danced native dances in national costumes. Said that CAROL BOR, a participant in the World Festival in Vienna. spoke re: meetings of the American boys and girls with Soviet youth. Said that youths' hope is Peace and Friendship. S. said that Dr CORLIS LAMONT then addressed the meeting.
