WEEKLY SUMMARY

WILLIAM KENNEY, Departmental Attorney, advised he had been informed by IRWIN POTTS that the Miami Herald newspaper is presently planning to conduct its own investigation to attempt to prove there is corruption among local law enforcement officials.

Sgt. JAMES I. MINIX, "Special Squad", Miami Police Department, advised on July 18, 1962, there was wide spread corruption among the old "hard core" officials in the Miami Police Department. He stated that prior to two years ago the city of Miami had been divided into districts with a lieutenant in charge of the district. Each lieutenant had his own "bag man" and controlled vice in his particular area. Now, according to MINIX, the city no longer is divided into police districts and each lieutenant or captain, as the case may be, is in business for himself so that there is no organized payoff as such anymore.

On July 19, 1962, MM 609-C advised he had heard that MOE ROCKFELD, FBI #296641, who was recently released from Raiford Prison, and MONTE GARDNER, formerly associated with the Gaiety Night Club in Miami had left the city within the past week and were to go to Charleston, South Carolina, where they planned to open a gambling club.
