CRIMINAL INTELLIGENCE MATTERS

Re Bureau airtel to Albany, 5/7/62, and Dallas letter to Bureau, 7/10/62.

On 7/12/62, JOSEPH FRANCIS CIVELLO, subject of Dallas file 92-36 captioned "JOSEPH FRANCIS CIVELLO, aka. AR", was observed by Bureau Agents at the Egyptian Lounge, 5610 Mockingbird Lane, Dallas. CIVELLO is a known close associate of the owners of this establishment, JOE and SAM CAMPISI. CIVELLO was interviewed at this time by the Agents and appeared to be most cordial and cooperative.

The recent robbery of SAM CAMPISI was discussed with CIVELLO, and CIVELLO was of the opinion that CAMPISI had been "set up" by someone close to CAMPISI as the bandits appeared to have thorough knowledge of CAMPISI's movements and habits. The Agents intimated to CIVELLO that they had knowledge of the person who had set up CAMPISI, as well as the identity of the bandits. CIVELLO appeared to be astonished and also appeared most desirous of asking the Agents for these identities, but it was noted he could not bring himself around to this.

The interview was terminated, but it is believed that possible further contact with CIVELLO may be productive.

On 6/19/62, GEORGE FUQUA, subject of Dallas file 92-61, was arrested in Kansas and subsequently interviewed by Bureau Agent in Kansas. He appeared to be cooperative and stated he would assist the Bureau in an attempt to locate Bureau Top Ten Fugitive JOHN GIBSON DILLON. He also furnished information concerning his knowledge of New Orleans the odlum CARLOS MARCELLO and Tampa hoodlum SANTOS TRAFFICANTY $\int_{u=0}^{100}$

Arrangements were made by the FBI in Kansas for FUQUA to contact FBI, Dallas, upon his return. On 8/6/62, FUQUA made such contact and was subsequently interviewed by Bureau Agents at Dallas on 8/6, 8/62.

FUQUA furnished pertinent information concerning TRAFFICANTI, Dallas gambler AL MEADOWS, and information concerning the activities of WILLIAM RAY DAVIS, GILBERT LEE BECKLEY, and WILLIAM MEADOR SMITH, who are subjects of Dallas file 165-29. He also reiterated information previously furnished concerning DILLON. Some of the information furnished by FUQUA is known to be true and correct based on prior investigation by the Dallas Office. Attempts to verify the other information are being made. Contacts with FUQUA will be continued. The substantive case file concerning FUQUA (Dallas 92-61) has been closed and a new PCI file has been opened by Dallas as this is one of the goals of the criminal intelligence program.
