The records of the Selective Service Board 39, 2312 West Harrison, Chicago, Illinois, show that **SAMUEL M. GIANCANA**, registered for Selective Service while an inmate of the Federal Penitentiary at Terre Haute, Indiana, on 12/14/42. He did not submit to a physical examination until subsequent to his release from Terre Haute. A report of GIANCANA's physical examination dated 2/12/44, reveals that he was rejected for military service because of a constitutional psychopathic state and inadequate personality, manifested by strong anti-social trends. (u)

Although informants and other sources of the Chicago Office furnish varying dates for the succession of GIANCANA to the "commission", it is the consensus of opinion that GIANCANA succeeded **ANTHONY J. ACCARDO** in 1956. (u)

During an interview with **MARIE PERNO** by SA **RALPH R. HILL**, now assigned to the Miami Office, it was his observation that the name of **KEELEY SMITH** was embedded in the concrete of a retaining wall or planter located in front of GIANCANA's residence at 1147 South Wenonah, Oak Park, Illinois. It is noted that **MARIE PERNO** resided at 1147 South Wenonah and that the interview took place there. No further details concerning the nature of this inscription is available. (u)

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Although CG 6443-C advised in 1961 that GIANCANA and WILLIAM DADANO are "kissing cousins", there is no information available indicating a direct blood relationship between GIANCANA and DADANO, and it is believed that this was the method by which the informant meant to indicate the close friendship and association which existed between these two leaders of organized crime in Chicago. (U)
