Re Paris cable 4/22/59.

As indicated in recable, FRANCIS GUERON, Swiss Central Police Bureau, Bern, Switzerland, reported on 4/22/59 that GUS ALEX, born 4/1/14, reportedly visited St. Moritz, Switzerland, on 3/4/59. On this same date a local jewelry shop at St. Moritz was robbed of jewelry to a value of approximately 400,000 Swiss francs (\$100,000.00 US).

Inasmuch as the Paris file did not reflect the whereabouts of ALEX on the date in question, GUERON was telephonically contacted and questioned as to whether he considered that the individual visiting at St. Moritz was in fact identical with the subject of this case. GUERON stated that he was so informed by local police at St. Moritz, who had previously made inquiry in this case. GUERON advised that he had already requested the St. Moritz police to furnish further details, and upon receipt these details would be forwarded to this office.

Photographs of ALEX and his wife were forwarded to GUERON on 4/22/59.

As requested by Paris cable, it would be appreciated if a set of subject's fingerprints could be forwarded at the earliest possible date.
