On 12/18/62 Dr. ALFRED CARRELL, Director, Swiss / Csntral Police Bureau, Bern, was furnished a copy of undated memorandum received by Bureau routing slip dated 12/12/62, as well as information from Bucab dated 12/17/62. On 12/21/62 he was informed of information contained in reBucab.

Dr. CARRELL stated that he would take immediate steps to notify Swiss Cantonal Police authorities to have the necessary coverage instituted. He pointed out, however, that it would be extremely unlikely that Alex would hire a car and drive from Zurich to St. Moritz since all routes in this area go through mountain passes and are almost completely snowed in at this time of year. He also thought that the police at St. Moritz might not be able to give coverage as complete as might be desired, since that town would be extremely crowded at this time of year and the police would be very busy with routine matters. He stated he would do his best to impress local authorities with the importance of this matter, however.

Since Legat, Paris, has covered previous leads in Switzerland in this case, it is requested that Legat, Paris, send Legat, Bern, copies of pertinent serials showing Alex's background and previous coverage of him in Switzerland.
