was receptive to being interviewed and has agreed to advise Agent KEARNEY of GIANCANA's whereabouts and activities when in the Greater Miami, Florida, area. It is anticipated that the Miami Office, supplied with information from this source will be in a position to provide discreet coverage of GIANCANA in this area.

recently in Las Vegas, Nevada, and observed that "celebrities" DEAN MARTIN, FRANK SINATRA, and EDDIE FISHER were friendly with GIANCANA and treated him as a "big shot." He recalled that FISHER came over to GIANCANA's table and was most cordial to him. He said that GIANCANA, referring to the recent ruling of a Chicago court, said that he was pleased and satisfied that he made the Bureau "cop the fifth."
