GAMBLING IN NATIONAL SPORTS RE: CRIMINAL INTELLIGENCE MATTER (DL 94-190)

On 11/6/62, Sports Editor, "Dallas Times Herald", and a trusted confidential source of the Dallas Office, advised that he had been able to obtain the films of the Texas A & M - Houston game played at Houston, 9/29/62. On 11/7/62 these films were reviewed by SA ROBERT M. BARRETT and DON KLOSTERMANN, in charge of player procurement for the Dallas Texans professional football league, who had obtained the films in the normal course of business. KLOSTERMANN's trustworthiness has been attested to by confidential source PAUL ROTHERMEL, a former Bureau Agent. PAUL ROTHERMEL and KLOSTERMANN are employed by the H. L. HUNT family in Dallas. The results of this review are being forwarded the Bureau and Kansas City by separate communication. It should be noted that suspected official JAMES FORD did call two very close fouls against Texas A & M in this ballgame, one of which led directly to the only touchdown scored, that being by Houston late in the game and which gave Houston a 6-3 victory.
