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

On 4-12-67 Attorney VAZQUEZ advised that he had been in contact with Attorney JORGE CASTILLO Z. Plaza de Republica No. 32. It is noted that this attorney previously represented Subject in his efforts to secure immigrant mestatus in Mexico, and also has represented Subject's associate, RICHARD CAIN and his wife, HARRIETTE BLAKE CAIN. He noted that this attorney is considered a reputable local attorney specializing in immigration matters, and considered it unlikely that he would furnish false information to the Mexican Immigration Service, where good will is vital to his practice.

According to this attorney, Subject, to his knowledge, has not been in Mexico since September, 1966


In discussing this matter on 2-12-67 with Attorney RAFAEL HERNANDEZ OCHOA, Assistant Secretary of Government for Mexico, he specifically advised that not only could Subject not be granted citizenship, he would not knowingly be granted any type of immigrant or tourist-type status in Mexico and, if located in Mexico, would be subject to expulsion.

He was advised that Subject's associate, CAIN, was reported to have returned to Chicago, and he stated that the Mexican Government has issued an order to deny CAIN re-entry privileges to Mexico.

Sources throughout Mexico have been alerted to the possible presence of Subject in Mexico and to continue efforts to develop information as to his activities.
