Re Beirut letter 7/18/74.

On 7/26/74, Captain A. Karim Ibrahim, Surete Generale (SG), Beirut, Lebanon, advised as follows

Investigation at the Sands Hotel, Beirut, reflected no information that the subject or CAROLYN CRUMLY MORRIS lodged there. The Arrival Cards for March 26, 1974, have been destroyed. The SG's Hotel Registration Records for the month of March, 1974, have been destroyed. A recheck of the Arrival-Departure Records reflect no additional information concerning the subject or MORRIS.

Investigation at the Golf Club of Lebanon (GCL), Beirut, reflected no additional information except that an employee of the GCL identified the photograph of MORRIS as possibly identical with the female who accompanied the subject at the GCL on one or two occasions.

Captain Ibrahim further advised that the SG personnel at the Beirut International Airport (BIA) and the employees of the GCL have been alerted concerning the subject and MORRIS, in addition to the stops placed at the BIA, and ordered to advise him immediately as soon as the subject and MORRIS arrive.
