 [redacted], a potential criminal informant of the Miami Division, has advised that he heard Carlos Marcello through his political connections intends to approach the Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS) representative who will preside at the INS deportation hearing July 10, 1961, at New Orleans, Louisiana. They intend to offer him a substantial sum of money if he will delay Marcello's deportation from this country. This source could not furnish further details concerning the method to be used by Marcello in handling this matter.

[redacted] advised Marcello believes that if he can delay his deportation long enough, his political connections and associates in the State of Louisiana, which allegedly include Governor James Davis and Senator Russell B. Long, U.S. Senator (both Democrats) may be able to have some influence in choosing the successor of General Swing, Commissioner, INS, who is expected to retire in the near future. He feels a new Commissioner would be more sympathetic toward him than General Swing has been in the past and he may be successful in having the Government charges dropped against him, thus avoiding deportation from this country.

*X* [redacted] source for this information is William F. Abraham, Baton Rouge, Louisiana, contractor. Our New Orleans Office advises Abraham is possibly identical with the former manager of the Rendezvous Night Club, Alexandria, Louisiana, where gambling was known to have taken place. Between September, 1946, and October, 1948, he was arrested seven times for violation of "Sunday laws and gambling."

By way of background, Marcello, who was deported on April 4, 1961, to Guatemala, is presently free on two bonds of \$10,000 each. One bond was provided on deportation charges for which a hearing is scheduled July 10, 1961, at New Orleans. The second bond is for the subject's release on Federal criminal charges of illegal entry into the United States from Guatemala after deportation to that country.

*As to INS 7-5-61 TLG:swb*  
 Our New Orleans Office advises that INS headquarters, Washington, D. C., will designate a special inquiry officer to conduct the deportation hearings on July 10, and also designate an examining officer to act as prosecutor at that hearing. It is not known whether or not these officers have been designated by INS, and no public release has been made as to their identities.
