During the latter part of the evening, the informant, at one point, mentioned that he had recently received a traffic ticket, whereupon, MISHUKOV stated (5) that on one occasion in the past, while in Brooklyn, New York, attending a party given at the home of some Russian speaking students from Brooklyn College, he had also gotten a traffic ticket. Informant reported that MISHUKOV and not specify just when this party occurred nor did he further identify the students from Brooklyn College.

NY T-7 and MISHUKOV left the Hotel Earle Bar at approximately 11:00 p.m. and the Soviet drove the informant to his residence. Upon parting, no definite arrangements were made for their next meeting but MISHUKOV (5) stated that he would contact NY T-7 in the future.

D. Contact with Others & (u)

On January 21, 1960 and January 28, 1960, NY T-8 furnished the New York Office of the FBI with the circumstances surrounding his original meetings and subsequent contacts with various Soviet nationals while he (informant) was employed as an instructor at the Berlitz School of Languages, Rockefeller Center, New York City, in 1958 and 1959. YURIY A. MISHUKOV was one of the Soviets and NY T-8 furnished the following pertinent information:

Informant first met MISHUKOV at a party given by NY T-8 during August or September, 1958. Informant, while inviting Soviet LEONID A. KOVALEV to this party(s) suggested that he bring some of his friends. As a result, KOVALEV brought MISHUKOV to the party

At this party, NY T-8 had little personal contact with MISHUKOV but noticed that this Soviet (S) associated freely during the evening with DENNIS (ARBER. Informant identified HARBER as another instructor at the Berlitz School.

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
