SUBJECT: United States v. Joseph Bonanno, et al.

The Attorney in charge of the subject case has been attempting to obtain copies of the flight manifest records for Mohawk Airlines' flights from Newark, New Jersey, to Binghamton, New York on November 14, 1957. He is particularly interested in the morning and early afternoon flights.

An official of the Airline has advised that the records for that day have been lost or destroyed. The same official has expressed the belief that these records were examined by Bureau agents. In the event that this is so and copies of these manifests are in the possession of the Bureau, we should like to have them for use at the trial.

In addition, if the Bureau has any other copies of flight manifests pertaining to the Apalachin gathering, we would appreciate receiving them. This would include Trafficante's flight from Miami, Larocca's and Genovese's flight from Pittsburgh and De Simone's and Scozzari's flight from Los Angeles.

An attempt is also being made to locate the originals or copies of records of the Hotel Frederick, Endicott, New York, for November 13 and 14, 1957. The New York State Police advise they did not take the originals or obtain copies of them. If copies have been obtained by the Bureau, we would appreciate receiving them.
