## MARGARITE ADLER PITTMAN

T-1, a confidential source abroad, adviced on October 1, 1959, that JCHN PITIMAN, his wife and two children arrived in the United Kingdom at London Airport from Paris, France, at 11:00 P.M., September 30, 1959.

T-1 advised that upon arrival the subjects stated they would remain in the United Kingdom until Sunday, October 4, 1959, and would reside at the Mitre House, 180 Subsex Gardens, London, W. 2. T-1 further advised that the passports of the subjects contained no Soviet viess. (6)

On October 5, 1959, T-1 again advised that the subjects departed London via Air France for Paris at 10:00 P.M. on October 4, 1959. No information was obtained regarding their future travel plans and T-1 again stated that their passports did not contain Soviet vises. 6/
