NORMAN ROTHMAN

On January 21, 1968, a confidential informant, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that Norman Rothman of Dallas, Texas, contacted Dominican Ambassador Manuel de Moya. (S)

According to the informant, Rothman desired to know if any decision had been made concerning Rothman's working for the Dominican Government "on a year-round basis." De Moya indicated that he was familiar with the above but indicated that he must submit the matter to the Dominican Republic for approval. He further told Rothman that when a decision has been reached by the Dominican Government, he, De Moya, would notify Rothman. (S)

Rothman, according to the informant, stated that he, Rothman, had some plans which would do the Dominican's "some good." Rothman further stated that in view of the fact that the "Dominican Fair" is starting, he thought he might go to the Dominican Republic and speak with Generalissimo Rafael L. Trujillo concerning the matter. De Moya reiterated that he would advise Rothman when his government had made a decision. (S)
