On 2/2/62 Departmental Attorney WILLIAM KEHOE, currently conducting a FGJ in Pittsburgh to inquire into the activities of the MANNARINOS and their associates, advised SA THOMAS G. FORSYTH, III as follows:

He has heard that [redacted], aka [redacted], who was convicted for his participation in the case captioned "STUART SUTOR, et al; TGP; ITSP; FFA; NM; CONSPIRACY," and is currently incarcerated in the Federal Penitentiary, Lewisburg, Pa., is very unhappy. While his convicted co-defendants are taking their imprisonments in the best possible spirits, [redacted] becomes increasingly unsettled. Although [redacted] was an unfaithful spouse, he was always a doting father, and the forced separation from his only son, a ten year old, grieves him greatly.

When [redacted] was arrested during the IRS raid on the MANNARINO horse room-gambling casino on 8/24/61, KEHOE noted that [redacted] would not talk with anyone connected with the Federal Government until he was brought into the Federal Building, Pittsburgh, to await his turn at a USC hearing. At that time, [redacted] was observed by KEHOE to leave his associates and approach SA FORSYTH who was present merely as an observer, and it was noted that [redacted] spoke earnestly, courteously and at length with SA FORSYTH.

It is KEHOE's feeling that [redacted], if he were so inclined, could make an excellent witness against the MANNARINOS and KEHOE feels he should be interviewed with this purpose in mind at the earliest possible date. KEHOE requested that

SA FORSYTH go to Federal Penitentiary, Lewisburg, to conduct the interview, rather than have it conducted by a SA from the Philadelphia Division, because SA FORSYTH is thoroughly conversant with all aspects of the MANNARINO investigations and has established a speaking relationship with [ ] which now might prove effectual in persuading [ ] to cooperate.

It is noted that KEHOE indicated that he might have a "deal" to offer [ ] should [ ] decide to cooperate with the Government against the MANNARINOS. At this juncture, KEHOE was advised that SA FORSYTH could not take any part in discussions concerning any deals and did not even want to hear the nature of the inducement KEHOE would offer [ ]. KEHOE was advised that if Bureau permission was received, SA FORSYTH would welcome an opportunity to talk with [ ] and would bend every effort to persuade [ ] to cooperate, but SA FORSYTH could not relay any message concerning a "deal." KEHOE was told that any such message would have to be gotten to [ ] by some other means and KEHOE replied that he understood and would, at the appropriate time, make his own arrangements.

Bureau permission is therefore requested for SA FORSYTH to travel to Federal Penitentiary, Lewisburg, Pa., and to interview [ ].
