As noted in Page 4 of relet, Miss JOHNSON, on various occasions, submitted to the American Embassy, Moscow, information she had developed through contacts with Soviet legal experts. A review of WFO files suggests that two of these Soviet legal experts are presently in the United States, one in Boston and another in New York. The following information concerning these experts and Miss JOHNSON is set forth for the assistance of Boston and New York.

BORIS SERGEYEVICH NIKOFOROV

Foreign Service Dispatch 423 from the Embassy in Moscow to the Department of State dated 3/19/56 transmitted a memorandum prepared by Miss JOHNSON concerning an interview she had 1/30/56 with several Soviet jurists. One of the Soviet jurists was BORIS SERGEYEVICH NIKOFOROV (criminal law).

NIKOFOROV is the subject of WFO file 105-55775 Bureau file and Boston file unknown. He was scheduled to arrive in Boston from London on or about 10/18/63 to lecture on Soviet criminal law at Harvard Law School until 12/21/63 when he is to return to Europe. His sponsor is Professor HAROLD J. BERMAN, Harvard Law School.

He visited the United States in 1962 as a member of the 63rd Soviet tourist group which was composed of highly placed Soviets in professional fields.

The foregoing information was furnished to Boston in Bulet 9/27/63 under the NIKOFOROV caption.

MR. BAGINYAN

Foreign Service Dispatch 173 from Moscow, to the Department of State dated 9/15/58, enclosed a number of memoranda which reported interviews had by Miss JOHNSON with various Soviets in the legal field. The dispatch noted that Miss JOHNSON had continuously advised the Embassy the results of her interviews and had also asked a number of questions posed by the Embassy. Among the interviews enclosed with the dispatch was one with Mr. BAGINYAN, an expert in international law.

BAGINYAN may be identical with KONSTANTIN ABRANOVICH BAGINYAN, Bufile 105-114293, NY 105-59762, WFO 105-50505. At the time he requested a visa to enter the United States as an employee of the U. N. Secretariat he was described as a Senior Scientific Worker, Institute of State and Law, USSR, Academy of Sciences. He arrived New York City 10/8/62; his wife arrived 12/9/62; they left the United States 4/20/63; and he returned to New York City 7/15/63. He resides at 147-25 Northern Blvd., Flushing, Long Island.

Miss JOHNSON's State Department security file, reviewed 10/29/63, contains the following information concerning her.

By telegram dated 6/10/60 the Embassy in Moscow notified the Department of State that Miss JOHNSON, a North American Newspaper Alliance (NANA) correspondent, had been informed that her accreditation as a correspondent had expired and would not be renewed. She was convinced that the action was not based upon any action of hers. The Embassy did not believe that further representation on its part would be helpful at that time.
