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discrimination against Jews and other minorities in those countries. The general tenor of his articles was to the effect that these "new democracies" had been quite successful in eliminating that evil.

In his article in the PEOPLES VOICE of June 21, 1947 on Page 17, PITTMAN relates his interview with VASILE LUCA, a Roumanian leader. According to LUCA, American military and press representatives in Roumania tried to create hostility between Roumanians and Hungarians in order that Transilvania would not be kept by Roumania. PITTMAN reported that LUCA said there was a tendency of nationalities to form alliances among themselves and suggested that idea as a possible solution for minorities in the United States.

Confidential Informant ND-183 in a report dated April 24, 1947 advised that JOHN PITTMAN from the Pacific Coast had returned from Europe with his wife, the former PAUL FOX, and according to this informant PITTMAN was to replace ROBERT MINOR on a mid-west speaking tour and following this would return to the Pacific Coast.

Confidential Informant T-1 on November 10, 1947 supplied SA Everett K. Deane with a signed copy of JOHN PITTMAN'S report to the Educational-Organizational Department of the Communist Party U.S.A. regarding his speaking tour in Indiana and Chicago made by him between April 27th and May 7, 1947. He reported on his attendance at Communist meetings in Indianapolis, Evansville, Fort Wayne, South Bend, Gary, and Chicago, giving a few details on each meeting.

In a paragraph entitled "OVERALL OBSERVATIONS" he said that his impression was that the Comrades in Indiana are still hampered by left sectarianism and that they lack bold approach to any persons but the working class and failed to attempt to popularize the Communist Party line.

Regarding Chicago he said that he had heard from Negro comrades there that white chauvinism is rampant there and that Negro organizations are left to shift for themselves. He concluded his report with an expression of gratitude to the Ed-Org Commission for the opportunity to meet Party and non-Party people in that center of industrial America and he described it as a re-orienting experience necessary to get him back quickly into the



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sense of things. PITTMAN's financial account, which was part of this report, reflected that he spent a total of \$110 on the tour in addition to the price of an airplane ticket to Indianapolis.

On July 18, 1947 Confidential Informant T-1 furnished SA Herbert P. Larson with a memorandum dated July 15, 1947 submitted by JOHN PITTMAN and HOWARD BOLDT to the Editorial Board of the DAILY WORKER. This memorandum outlined their proposals to increase the circulation of the SUNDAY WORKER. They suggested mass subscription drives in trade unions plus mass organizations, and other groups, and a program in which Communist Party leaders would implement this drive with the DAILY WORKER printing stories of their efforts. There was also suggested a number of journalistic improvements, such as an increase in features and human interest stories and improvement of the "Fun Page" of the SUNDAY WORKER.

On July 18, 1947 T-1 furnished SE J. O'Shaughnessy with a pay envelope of FREEDOM OF THE PRESS, INC. which publishes the DAILY WORKER. This envelope was made out to PATTERSON, presumably the subject, indicating a weekly salary of \$70 with a net payment to him of \$59.10. From information previously furnished by this informant it may be assumed that this was the weekly salary of JOHN PITTMAN.

Confidential Informant ND*183 on August 7, 1947 reported that JOHN PITTMAN was then working for the DAILY-WORKER with BOWARD SOLDT.

On November 2, 1947 ND-183 advised that JOHN PITTMAN was residing at 370 Manhattan Avenue, New York City, apartment 5G, telephone Monument 2-8643, and that PAULA PITTMAN was residing at 66 West 69th Street, New York City, telephone Trafalgar 7-1700.

According to the Telephone Directory Monument 2-8643 is listed for S.O. RUTHERFORD who, according to the election records, is more fully identified as SEPTIMUS RUTHERFORD.

SEPTIMUS RUTHERFORD was mentioned in copies of the PILOT dated March 21, 1946 and December 3, 1946 which described him as a candidate for the general elections being held by the National Maritime Union in that year. According to confidential Informant ND=399 RUTHERFORD ran for Field Patrolman and was defeated. ND-399 has stated that RUTHERFORD was a member of the Communist Party until about 1942, when he dropped out.

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The DAILY WORKER of January 4, 1948, page 11, Section 1, features a review of the Book "Russia's Europe" by HALFLEHRMAN. This review, written by JOHN PITTMAN, denounces LEHRMAN's book as "more grist for the warmongers' mill" and PITTMAN declares that LEHRMAN'S book is filled with misstatements. PITTMAN ends his review with the statement of regret that "a LEHRMAN rather than a HENRY WALLACE, is typical of what has come to be known as an American Liberal".

Confidential Informant ND-183 advised that on January 26, 1948 JOHN PITTMAN dispatched a telegram to CLAIRE GRAHAM, apartment 63, 244 Kearney Street, San Francisco, California, reading as follows:

"YOUR DECISION WISE. YOU WILL PULL THROUGH EVEN IF NEXT

SHORT PERIOD IS TOUGH. WRITING SPECIAL DELIVERY TONIGHT.

TAKE IT EASY TIL GET OKAY FROM ME.

/s/ JOHN

Inasmuch as the nature and extent of JOHN PITTMAN's activities in connection with the Communist Party have been determined, and his employment and residence address established, no further investigation is being conducted at this time.



VISIT OF JOHN PITTMAN, COFFESPONDENT OF THE eclassify do: ONOR JA on June 11, 1947, John Pittman, correspondent of the "People's World', gave a report at a special Communist Party meeting in San Francisco on his trip to Europe. John Fittman, a Negro, was born at Atlanta, Georgia, on September 17, 1905. Prior to going to Europe, John Pittman served as Executive Editor

of the "People's World", West Coast Communist dominated newspaper.

John Pittman told the Communist Party functionaries in San Prancisco that he had visited in England, France, Poland, Rumania, Bulgaria, Czechoslovakia and hungary on his recent trip to Europe.

Pittman indicated that he was going to write a book and regardless of whether or not the book brings a profit from the sale, it would be worth putting out. He stated that the great interest of progressive Americans in the coming months would tend more and more to create a market for this book and the receipts from same may be sufficient to cancel the debts brought about by his trip.

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In France Pittman was able to see Jacques Duclos and Maurice Thorez, the editors of L'Humanite" and other Party members engaged in other activities.

In Czechoslovakia Fittman said he saw the head of the Farty there, namely Slonsky (ph). He said that he would have seen Klement Gottwald except that he was ill at the time and had gone away from the city on a vacation. Pittman said that he talked to the people of De Buni Pravle" (ph) and other comrades in the Information Ministry and other places.

In Poland littman stated that he was able to talk to Jakub Berman and other trade union leaders who were in the Party, the editors of the proces, to the resident of the Republic who is a "non-Party person officially," and to many comrades in the various aspects of the Polish fight.

In Rumania Fittman stated he saw Vasile Luca, who is one of the land three Secretaries of the Party. He also talked with the Executive of the Party at Transylvania, the whole Executive Committee, the press people there, the mr. Trace at Transylvania, and the trade union movement and, generally, many other comrades,
