Superintendent F. E. WILMOT, New Scotland Yard Metropolitan Police London, England, informs that on December 15, 1955, a "Wanted" notice without any covering communication was received at New Scotland Yard purporting to emanate from the Chief of Police, Irving, Texas, U.S.A. The notice related to JOE LECURTO, alias JOSEPH LECURT, alias JOSEPH BONDS, aged 45, FBI No. 237527, wanted on warrant for sodomy, and says he may be accompanied by RUTH COLLINS BONDS alias DALE BELMONT.

Superintendent WILMOT states that to confirm the authenticity of the notice, they wrote to the Chief of Police, Irving, Texas, and a reply has now been received that his Patrolman BURNS advises that the Federal Bureau of Investigation in Dallas has information that the wanted man is in London. He stated the Irving Police did not answer the question in their letter whether they would be prepared to extradite BONDS should he be located in this country, and although the "Wanted" notice says "Will Extradite," that may only refer to inter-state extradition.

It is requested that the Bureau and the Dallas Office provide any information it may have on subject, particularly his presence in the United Kingdom and also whether the Irving Police would be willing to extradite subject from this country if later located here.

Superintendent F. WILMOT of New Scotland Yard informs that a check has been made of Home Office (Alien Department) records but there is no record that subject has visited England. He also stated that arrangements had been made for New Scotland Yard to be informed should subject later enter this country and that his name has also been recorded in the Wanted Index so that in the event he does come to ~~London~~ notice this office will be immediately informed.

Superintendent WILMOT also informed that this information has been forwarded to the Chief of Police, Irving, Texas.
