Reference is made to my letter dated August 14, 1967, with enclosure which indicated that an official of the Office of Munitions Control advised that additional descriptive data or chemical analysis was necessary in order to make a determination as to whether the explosives in this case are on the Munitions Control List. (S)

On September 26, 1967, a confidential source abroad advised that the explosives recovered by the Mexican Federal Security Police and the Mexican Army in the State of Tamaulipas were still in the possession of the Mexican Army at the Department of Military Industry. The source advised that the Mexican Army has the capability of conducting an analysis to determine the chemical composition of the recovered explosives, but the source himself pointed out that he did not have such information. (S)

The source indicated that the results of any chemical analysis desired could be obtained upon the presentation of a formal request through official diplomatic channels by the Government of the United States directly to the Government of Mexico. (S)

You may desire to request that a chemical analysis be made through the appropriate diplomatic channels. In the event that this is done, it is requested that this Bureau be advised.

Re Mexico City letter 8/31/67, and Miami letter 9/14/67.

On September 26, 1967, FERNANDO GUTIERREZ BARRIOS, Director, Mexican Federal Security Police (DFS), who should be protected as a confidential source abroad, advised that the explosives recovered by the DFS and the Mexican Army in the State of Tamaulipas are still in the possession of the Mexican Army at the Department of Military Industry. He advised that the Mexican Army has the capability to conduct an analysis to determine the chemical composition of the recovered explosives but that he himself does not have such information. (S)

GUTIERREZ BARRIOS again indicated that the results of the chemical analysis desired may be obtained upon presentation of a formal request through official diplomatic channels by the government of the United States directly to the government of Mexico. (S)

Mexico City is placing this case in a pending-inactive status. *[Signature]*
