You are referred to information furnished to your agency between October 2, 1968, and January 22, 1969, entitled "International Anti-Communist Brigade---Frank Anthony Sturgis, -- Et Al - Internal Security-Cuba, NM-Cuba." In connection with information in the memorandum dated October 13, 1967, concerning reported plans to blow up a Cuban ship in a Mexican port, the Assistant Attorney General, Internal Security Division, Department of Justice, advised on December 4, 1967, that a communication had been sent to the Director, Office of Munitions Control. Department of State, requesting that certain inquiriess be made through appropriate diplomatic channels. In March, 1969, the Assistant Attorney General, Internal Security Division, provided a copy of a letter from the Director, Office of Munitions Control, which revealed that the Government of Mexico would not accede to the request of the State Department to make available expert witnesses to testify. It was the opinion of the Department of Justice that testimony of Mexican police officials would be essential to successful prosecution; therefore, no further investigation was requested.
