On 5-5-64 MEX-19 advised that he had postponed his planned trip to Hollywood to secure employment as a writer in motion picture or television productions until approximately May 15, 1964. The informant's decision to postpone his trip was entirely voluntary and was made in order to furnish coverage on an anticipated meeting with ELIZABETH MORA (Bufile 100-395934).

During the latter part of April, 1964, <u>KLIZ</u>ABETH MORA advised the informants that she was expecting some very important Negroes and that in order to accommodate those visitors her husband, FRANCISCO MORA (Bufile 105-47124), had been exploring the possibility of temporarily renting a secluded but a very commodious hacienda near Pachuca, Mexico. MORA invited the informants to accompany them to that hacienda to meet these distinguished visitors. informants, however, were unable to determine from her at that time the identities of the visitors although, in accordance with Bureau instructions, the informants have been alerted to the reported possibility that ELIJAH MUHANNAD of the Nation of Islam was planning to visit Mexico. The informants were unable, however, to determine whether the distinguished visitors were connected with the Nation of Islam. In view of the importance MORA placed on this visit, however, MEX-18 and MEX-19 felt that it was urgently important to identify MORA's anticipated guests and furnish as much coverage of the meeting as possible.

As the Bureau is evere, the informants have been endeavoring for several weeks to arrange a private week end away from Nexico City with the NORAs in order to clarify certain aspects of the LEE HARVEY OSWALD case and MORA's original interest in that case. It has not been possible, however, for the informants to make effective arrangements with ELIZABETH MORA for such a two or three-day period as each time arrangements have been made MORA has found it necessary to postpone the trip and remain in Mexico City. The importance of clarifying these aspects of the OSWALD case has been impressed upon the informants and MEX-19 has postponed his trip to Hollywood in order to follow the trip to Pachuca on the week end of May 9. The informants may be able to work out two or three additional days alone with MORA in order to handle pending leads in the OSWALD case.

MEX-19 has voluntarily postponed his trip to Hollywood and has advised that he does not believe that a temporary postponement will adversely affect his chances of securing employment as a writer there.

It is felt that the action of MEX-19 in postponing his trip to Hollywood in order to handle important matters of interest to this office shows a very healthy and cooperative attitude on his part.

The Bureau will be advised when MEX-19 actually leaves Mexico.
