Reurlet 11/2/62 entitled "CIA Operations."

This matter has been discussed with CIA by Liaison and on 11/8/62 its attention was directed to statements attributed to Shackley as set forth in relet. CIA was advised that Bureau was not obligated under any directive or agreement to keep CIA advised on a current and continuing basis of all developments in the Odio case; that we did not have the responsibility of keeping CIA informed regarding any requests for a particular type of information which the subject might receive from his superiors; and that the Bureau was not obligated to clear anything submitted by Odio for transmittal to his superiors since an interagency mechanism (U. S. Evaluation Board) had been set up for handling such clearances. CIA was further advised that Shackley's intention to run Cuban agents in the U. S. would be considered a serious infringement of FBI jurisdiction. It was pointed out to CIA that Shackley's intention was at variance with long-established policy and understanding between FBI and CIA since CIA is obliged to immediately advise us when information is received concerning agents operating in this country.

We told CIA we recognized its interest in Cuba and that we would make available to it all pertinent information developed which might have a bearing on its interests.

On 11/9/62 CIA advised by Liaison that it had been in contact with its Miami office and that the FBI position was clearly acceptable and definitely in line with established understandings between FBI and CIA. CIA representative advised that a communication was being sent to Shackley in order to make certain that he was correctly oriented and aware of FBI position in this whole matter.

INTERNAL SECURITY

As set forth in referenced teletype, on 11/2/62, Mr. THEODORE SHACKLEY, in charge of CIA covert operations, Miami, Florida, contacted the Miami Office with reference to the transfer of subject [ODIO] to the Miami Office for possible handling as a double agent. In this connection SHACKLEY stated that he had received the following instructions from his headquarters regarding this operation:

- (1) CIA should turn the case [of ODIO] over to the
- (2) CIA should furnish full background of this operation as it now stands to the FBI and furnish copies of all information in possession of CIA.
- (3) CIA should answer any questions propounded to it by the FBI concerning instant case.
- (4) In return for the foregoing, the FBI will keep CIA locally advised on a current and continuing basis of all developments which take place.
- (5) The FBI will furnish CIA information regarding any requests for a particular type of information which the subject receives from his superiors.
