Wannall Wannall Liaison CIA, OPERATIONS IN MIAMI - Papich SUBJECT: - Dunn Reference is made to Miami letter dated 11/2/62 setting forth the results of a meeting which our Miami Office held with Mr. Theodore Shackley, CIA official in charge of that Agency's operations in Miami. This meeting dealt with the case entitled operations in Miami. This meeting dealt with the case entitled "Alwin Odio Tamayo, Internal Security - Cuba." (Odio is the Cuban Codouble agent who was turned over to us by CIA. During this meeting Shackley presented his Agency's position with regard to future coordination between FBI and CIA and particularly made a point that his Agency intended to run certain types of double agent operations in this country. On 11/8/62 Agent Papich contacted Victor John Wallen, CIA, and directed his attention to the statements attributed to Shackley. Wallen was told that the Bureau was not obligated under any directive or agreement to keep CIA advised on a current and continuing basis of all developments in the Odio case; that we did not have the S responsibility of keeping CIA informed regarding any requests for a particular type of information which the subject might receive from his superiors; and that the Bureau was not obligated to clear anything submitted by Odio for transmittal to his superiors, Since there was [5] a well-established interagency mechanism (U. S. Evaluation Board) for handling such clearances. Wallen was further advised that Shackley's intention to run Cuban agents in the United States would be considered a serious infringement of clear-cut FBI jurisdiction. It was pointed out that Shackley's intention was at variance with long-established policy and understanding between the FBI and CIA since CIA is obliged to immediately advise us when information is received concerning Magents operating in this country. Concerning Bureau's responsibilities to keep CIA advised. the Liaison Agent informed Wallen that we recognized CIA interests in Cuba and we would make available to that Agency all pertinent information developed which might have a bearing on CIA interests. This could include leads for CIA and could be information which might be of assistance to that Agency in directing its programs against the Castro Government.
