MICHAEL J. P. MALONE, Vice President, Czarnikow-Rionda Company, 106 Wall St., NYC, advised on 5/7/62, that he had been to Washington, D.C., on 5/3/62, with ALBERTO FERNANDEZ of Key Biscayne, Florida, who is one of the leaders of Unidad Revolucionaria (UR), whose identity is known to the Bureau and Miami. (S) (u)

MALONE advised that he and ALBERTO FERNANDEZ had luncheon on 5/3/62, with ROBERT HURWITCH of the US Department of State, and they spoke to him relative to the Cuban question and the Cuban Revolutionary Council. MALONE advised that during the conversation with HURWITCH, he, MALONE, brought up the subject of "peaceful coexistence" with Cuba as this rumor has been rampant among the Cuban exiles in the US. MALONE said that HURWITCH emphatically stated that the US policy toward Cuba would never be one of coexistence. (S) (u)

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privately with HERBERT and they discussed the internal and political situation as it exists in Argentina and Brazil. In addition, MALONE stated that they discussed at length the Alliance for Progress Program and HERBERT admitted that the Alliance for Progress was in great trouble because of the flight of capital from Latin America and the reluctance on the part of American business to invest in Latin countries without some guarantee for their investment.

MALONE stated that they then discussed Cuba and HERBERT said that a program relative to Cuba was shaping up and he personally believed that if President KENNEDY were given the proper plan, he would take definite action against the Cuban Government. MALONE stated that he did not have any further information from HERBERT as to what type of plan was being formulated or any details.

MALONE also advised on 5/7/62, that he later saw CHARLES MAECHIN (ph) who is assigned to Cuban matters in CIA and he found MAECHIN on this contact to be more optimistic about the future of Cuba. MALONE said that MAECHIN spoke about the creation of a proper atmosphere within Cuba to do something concrete to overthrow the Cuban Government. MALONE further stated that MAECHIN had further informed him that there definitely was a plan being formulated relative to action in Cuba.

MALONE also advised on 5/7/62, that he and ALBERTO FERNANDEZ returned from Washington, D.C., on the evening of 5/3/62, and on the afternoon of 5/4/62, ALBERTO FERNANDEZ met with Dr. JOSE MIRO CARDONA at the Park Sheraton Hotel.

MALONE stated that ALBERTO FERNANDEZ felt better after his conversation with MIRO CARDONA and thought that MIRO CARDONA was very encouraged and displayed a great deal of optimism. In conversation with MIRO CARDONA, ALBERTO FERNANDEZ had been informed that there would be a call up of military personnel for or by the CRC in accordance with President JOHN F. KENNEDY's wishes.

MALONE advised on 5/11/62, that he had conferred telephonically with ALBERTO FERNANDEZ on that date and FERNANDEZ

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
