On 3-31-66 he was rated EXCELLENT and it was stated he continued in assignment on the S-1 Squad handling foreign intelligence, sabotage and related matters of a security nature. He was among the high producers in the office, his reports and other correspondence were accurate, he was enthusiastic, his cases were administered in a practically flawless manner and during the rating period he made a number of highly delicate interviews in an outstanding manner, showing considerable forcefulness tempered with discretion and good judgment. He could handle the most complicated investigative matters and required minimum of supervision. He had not proposed names of any applicants, but made a number of interviews and his efforts were considered satisfactory. On dangerous assignments he was alert; showed tremendous initiative and was an asset. He developed 1 Security Informant and had 2 Potentials under development. He was interested in, available for and considered completely qualified at this time for administrative advancement. His qualifications were considered Outstanding.

His daily average overtime for March, 1966 was 2 hours 33 minutes; April, 2 hours 6 minutes.

On 4-1-66 his SAC recommended he be designated a Relief Supervisor; however, by letter 5-6-66 he was advised SA Gheesling was not approved as such in view of the severe administrative action taken against him in the past.

His daily average overtime for May, 1966, 2 hours 17 minutes; June, 2 hours 4 minutes; July, 2 hours 36 minutes.

On 7-3-66 he received a Basic Salary Increase to \$17,198 per annum in GS-14.

His daily average overtime for August, 1966, 2 hours 24 minutes; September, 2 hours 5 minutes; October, 2 hours 10 minutes.

By letter dated 10-12-66 he received an INCENTIVE AWARD in the amount of \$150.00 in recognition of his outstanding performance in developing and handling a confidential source of information of importance to the Bureau in the security field. (Re: AQUILA Internal Security - Czech).

His daily average overtime for November, 1966, 3 hours 1 minute; December, 2 hours 26 minutes; January, 1967, 2 hours 1 minute; February, 2 hours 25 minutes; March, 2 hours 5 minutes.

On 3-31-67 he was rated EXCELLENT and comments indicated he was assigned to the S-1 squad handling foreign intelligence investigations and related matters. He would handle the most sensitive and delicate
