## Re: Vito Giacalone

The Source advised that Dominic Peter Corrado, approximately a week previous, had ordered Dominic "Sparky" Corrado, Jimmy Corrado, and Peter Corrado to sell their homes, however, this had not been done, and Dominic Peter Corrado was very upset over it. Source advised that it was Anthony Tocco's opinion that Ann Paul had assisted "Sparky" Corrado in the embezzlement of the money. One of the reasons he thought that she had assisted was because she handled the money and knew where the money was supposed to be. He said it was also true that Dominic "Sparky" Corrado had been having sexual relations with Ann Paul for a number of years, even prior to the death of Peter Corrado.

A Confidential Source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that Vito Giacalone recently. had been with George George. Vito Giacalone had questioned George George as to who his partners were and he replied that he was a partner of Dominic "Sparky" Corrado. Source stated that when Vito Giacalone had asked him, George George wanted to know what was wrong, because he had understood that "Sparky" had cleared the partnership with Dominic Peter Corrado. The Source stated that George George and "Sparky" Corrado were going into some type of pool table business, however, George George was ready to back out since he had heard, after calling "Sparky" Corrado's residence on one occasion, that Anthony Giacalone and, Dominic Peter Corrado had been by there and picked up "Sparky" at 7:30 AM. Source stated that according to Vito Giacalone, George George did not want to know what the trouble was, but he was going to back out because he knew that something was wrong if Tony and Dominic had picked "Sparky" up that early in the morning.

Another Confidential Source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on February 6, 1964, that on February 2, 1964, Edward Holly was asked to come over to the home of Michael Polizzi, an old friend. When Holly arrived at Polizzi's house, he was questioned by Anthony Giacalone and Dominic Peter Corrado. He was questioned as to his activities and business dealings with Dominic "Sparky" Corrado. Allegedly Holly denied any business dealings with "Sparky". He stated that he had never had any investments with "Sparky" Corrado.
