JFKARCA of 1992

I am writing on behalf of Director Louis J. Freeh to inform you of the status of the FBI's response to the "President John F. Kennedy Assassination Records Collection Act of 1992" (the Act), and to provide projections regarding completion of the work that remains to be done pursuant to the Act. This letter reiterates much of the information conveyed to Ms. Diane Merritt of the staff of the Regulation and Government Information Subcommittee (RGIS) by FBI JFK Task Force Director Terry T. O'Connor in a meeting on June 16, 1994, and a telephone conversation on June 20, 1994.

The FBI has been committed to a speedy and full response to the Act and, to date, has transferred 463,395 pages of JFK documents to the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA). This represents almost half of the nearly one million pages of assassination-related documents that the Task Force can now estimate have been in FBI files. The files that have been transferred include all Lee Harvey Oswald, Jack Ruby, "related subjects" (e.g. Marina Oswald), and Warren Commission files, as well as files on the investigation of President Kennedy's Assassination that were maintained at FBI Headquarters and in the FBI's Dallas and New Orleans Field Offices.
