**Synopsis:** For administrative purposes, Legat Mexico City considers this matter covered; it will reopen upon receiving further instructions from FBIHQ.

**Administrative:** Reference 3/4/96 telcon between Carlos H. Fernandez, Legat Mexico City, and Carol L. Keeley, JFK Task Force, FBIHQ.

**Details:** In referenced conversation, Mexico City advised that Mexico City was considering sending official correspondence to Mexican authorities requesting their input on the release of certain documents related to the JFK assassination. As Mexican authorities have not responded to Legat Mexico City's first request, this correspondence would be a second request to the Mexican authorities.

In referenced conversation, Mexico City was advised that the Assassination Records Review Board (ARRB) was considering a procedure for handling notification/requests overseas. Mexico City was advised that in view of this, Legat Mexico City should withhold sending correspondence to Mexican authorities until such time that FBIHQ obtains guidance from the ARRB on the handling of such matters.

In view of the above, Mexico City is considering this matter covered. Legat Mexico City acknowledges this is still a pending matter at FBIHQ, but for file administration purposes, considers it covered in Mexico City. Mexico City will reopen
