**Title:** JFK RECORDS COLLECTION ACT OF 1992 (The Act)

**Synopsis:** To provide original serials from various Kansas City files in response to the Assassination Records Review Board's (ARRB) 9/10/96 letter, and **to request that source identifying information be redacted prior to the serials being released outside of the Bureau.**

**Reference:** 9/24/96 Electronic Communication (EC) to Kansas City from IRD, JFK Task Force, captioned as above, and 10/8/96 telcalls between CDC Steck and Ms. LuAnn Wilkins.

**Enclosures:** Enclosed is a copy of the referenced EC and following original serials: 1) 92-KC-116, serials 1395-1671; 2) 92-KC-116 Sub A, serials 72-281B; and 3) 94-KC-150A, serials 223-310.

**Details:** Referenced 9/24/96 EC advised that the ARRB has identified certain files for review. To respond to the ARRB request, Kansas City was directed to forward the following original serials, which are enclosed:

1. 92-KC-116, serials 1395-1671;
2. 92-KC-116 Sub A, serials 72-281B;
3. 94-KC-150A, serials 223-310.

Within Kansas City' files, the original serials have been replaced with copies.

Kansas City was further directed to review the enclosed serials and, if the records concerned electronic surveillance, to identify the name and jurisdiction of the judge approving the electronic surveillance, any docket number or case name associated with the information, the location and duration of the electronic surveillance, and the subject of the electronic surveillance.

Pursuant to instructions provided by Ms. Wilkins, Kansas City need not be concerned with the requested descriptive information concerning electronic surveillances as all the enclosed serials were prepared prior to enactment of Title III of the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968.

Additionally, Ms. Wilkins advised that prior to the enclosed records being provided to the ARRB, the records will be reviewed and all information which could potentially identify human confidential sources will be redacted in accordance with the legislation establishing the ARRB. This is of particular importance to Kansas City, as the descendants of the subjects identified in the enclosed documents continue to participate in organized crime activities and the descendants of the sources identified continue to provide information to this Division. Consequently, the release of information concerning sources in the enclosed documents, whether the identified source is alive or deceased, could negatively impact pending investigations within the Kansas City Division and jeopardize the safety of the source's relatives.

In the event Headquarters is unable to process the enclosed records to delete human confidential source identifying information, it is requested that Kansas City be provided specific instructions to comply with the applicable legislation and the records be returned for processing by this Division.
