Synopsis: Search negative for any additional information related to President John F. Kennedy's assassination.

Details: On 06/03/1998, a search of the Columbia Division's indices for any additional assassination-related information, based on the names cited in HQ EC dated 05/29/1998, was negative.

The only references located were for previously requested searches as set out in HQ airtel to All FBI Field Offices dated 01/23/1998 (COfile 190-0-239) and one previously reported reference -- a four-page "FBI FOIPA Preprocessed List compiled as of 11/22/1983," COfile 190-0-161).

No old "archived" SAC material was located for assassination-related material. (It should be noted the Columbia Division was not opened until December 1965, and it is, therefore, unlikely any such material would be found in this Division.)
